FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Four years ago, after my grandmother passed away, I asked if I could have her bread machine. And not only was I given her bread machine, but I use the bread machine to make bread. About once a week I mix water, salt, oil, flour, sugar, and yeast in the bread machine, press start and about three hours later I have a loaf of bread. A fresh loaf of bread sliced up, and toasted makes for a good breakfast in the morning. Occasionally, I will make a loaf of bread to share or give away. Over the last four years there are a couple of lessons that I learned about making bread. One lesson that I have learned is that after you mix all ingredients together and press start on the machine and the ingredients start mixing you need to make sure that the dough is forming a ball. Usually during the time, I wash my measuring cups and spoons I can see a ball is forming, if not I need to add a little water otherwise rather than having soft fluffy loaf bread, I have gotten a hard brick that does not taste very good. A second lesson is if you do not eat the loaf of bread quick enough, about five or six days later little green spots begin to grow on the bread otherwise known

Jesus in our scriptures today says that "I am the living bread that came down from heaven" (John 6:51). The Jews when they heard Jesus say this murmured about him, they had a hard time understanding him. How could Jesus be the living bread that came down from heaven? Even today there are people that have a hard time understanding Jesus when he says he is the living bread. Having trouble understanding is ok, Jesus the living bread is a mystery of our faith and something to understand about a mystery is that overtime we grow in our understanding that Jesus is the living bread come down from heaven.

Another reason why I think we have trouble with understanding that is Jesus the living bread. Is we typically do not see a loaf of bread as being alive. But there is life in a loaf of bread, if there were not life in a loaf of bread then after a couple of days after making a loaf of bread green spots, mold would not appear on the loaf of bread, there is something living here. If you are a scientist or a biologist, you could perhaps explain this more to me. Christ is living bread not because of some natural science and Jesus living bread because of its power.

Part of the reason we come to Mass is so that we can receive Christ the

living bread because we know the power and the strength that it provides to our lives. Christ the living bread is desired and brought to those stuck at home, in the nursing home, and hospital because we know of its power to heal lives. We come into church for adoration because we know of the power of Christ living the bread by just being in his presence. We know the power of Christ the living bread as we process with him through CCD classrooms and in the streets. It is with Christ the living bread that changes lives and

strengthens us to live forever.

"The special grace of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has as its effects: the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for their own good and that of the whole Church the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age, the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the Sacrament of Penance, the restoration of health, if it is

forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the Sacrament of Penance, the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of their soul, the preparation for passing over to eternal life" (CCC 1532).

How can we decide if we should ask to be anointed?

A good or reasonably sure judgment, without an uneasy feeling about the rightness of what one is doing or going to do, is sufficient for deciding on the seriousness of an illness. For example: A sick person may be anointed before surgery, whether or not a serious illness is the reason for the surgery.

before surgery, whether or not a serious illness is the reason for the surgery. Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this Sacrament. And if you are still unsure, when in doubt, ask Father!







to stay alive, our souls need God


