FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

As we journey in faith, as we journey as disciples of the Lord, a misconception that we can have is that this means for a problem free, a storm free life for us. As followers of the Lord, if we do a reality check of our lives, we know that our lives have their fair share of problems and storms. Perhaps some of you are reading this are in middle of a storm right now. But we are not alone in our storms. In our scriptures today we encounter an example of close followers of Jesus encountering at a storm. At the instruction of Jesus, the disciples "get into a boat and precede him to the other side" (Matthew 14:22). And as they make their journey, they encounter a storm, a storm that seemed to threaten their lives. It is in the middle of the storm that they encounter Jesus walking on the water. Not only did they encounter Jesus walking on the water but Jesus invites Peter, to come join him in walking on the water. Peter walks on the water so long as he keeps his eyes fixed on Jesus. It is only when he became aware of his surroundings and took his eyes off Jesus does he become in danger of drowning. It is only when they have their eyes fixed on Jesus that they are able to weather the storm.

Like the disciples in our scriptures today we encounter storms and like the disciples sometimes it might feel like the Jesus leads us into the storms like when he had the disciples got into the boat. Storms come into our lives sometimes they are literal storms like a windstorm in the middle of a windstorm it can seem like the house is going to blow down, our lives can seem to be threatened. Other times these storms are more figurative, like being diagnosed with a serious illness or when the dignity of life is ignored and threatened. This November, Ohioans will vote on a change to the constitution that puts women at risk, allow late-term abortions through all nine months, and could take away parental right all in the name of freedom. What are we called to do to weather this storm or any storm? Like Peter and the rest of the disciples we called to have our eyes fixed on Jesus. For it only when we have our eyes fixed on Jesus that we can weather the storm. Peter walked fine on the water until he took his eyes off Jesus and became aware of his surroundings. Similarly,

we can weather any storm that comes our way so long as we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus. Like Peter it is only when we take our eyes off Jesus and pay attention the noise of our world, what the news and media is saying, and what other people are saying that is when we become in danger of drowning. It is with our eyes fixed on Jesus that we can weather the storm of this amendment in November and any other storm that we face.

Regardless, of the storm we are weathering may we have our fixed Jesus in trust that we will be ok.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

St. John the Baptist Church after all the Masses August 19, 2023 and August 20, 2023

"The special grace of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has as its effects: the <u>uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ</u>, for their own good and that of the whole Church the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age, the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the Sacrament of Penance, the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of their soul, the preparation for passing over to eternal life" (CCC 1532).

How can we decide if we should ask to be anointed? A good or reasonably sure judgment, without an uneasy feeling about the rightness of what one is doing or going to do, is sufficient for deciding on the seriousness of an illness. For example: A sick person may be anointed before surgery, whether or not a serious illness is the reason for the surgery.

Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this Sacrament. And if you are still unsure, when in doubt, ask Father!

CHILD ABUSE OR NEGLECT

All suspected or actual acts of physical or sexual child abuse, or neglect, must be reported to the Putnam County Job and Family Services by calling 567-376-3777. Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday- Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident--leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call.

Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.

ST. TARCISIUS

Feast Day: August 15

The primary source for the story of St. Tarsicius is found in the inscription that Pope Damasus (366-384) had placed on the tomb of the boy martyr. Set at a time of persecution of the Church, It tells the story of Tarsicius. After Mass, he took consecrated Hosts to

imprisoned Christians awaiting martyrdom. As a boy he would be less suspicious. As he traveled to the prison along the Roman road, he ran into a group of pagan boys and men who began to harass him. They demanded he show them what he had in his hands, which were hiding in his clothes. Tarsicius refused, knowing they would likely take and desecrate the Blessed Sacrament if they got it from him. His continued refusal angered the crowd who began to assault him. As the angry mob beat him Tarcisius fell shielding the Host beneath his body. The mob eventually killed him. When they rolled his body over to discover what he had been hiding. They found nothing. The Host had vanished. Christians recovered his body and buried him in the catacomb of St. Callixtus, not far from where he was killed. His relics are now located in Rome at the Church of San Silvestro in Capite. St. Tarsicius of Rome, martyr of the Blessed Sacrament, became the first Patron Saint of First Communion. He is also the patron saint of altar servers.






