FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

This weekend's Gospel readings wrap up 4 weeks of the "Bread of Life" discourse taken from the book of John chapter 6. In the first reading from the book of Proverbs, it describes, in imagery, an invitation to attend a banquet she is holding at her house. This meal prefigures the true bread of life which we will hear in the Gospel. God gives this nourishment to mankind; the Body of the Incarnate Word; that of Jesus Christ. The Catholic Church uses many examples of imagery which points back to God's word; or Scripture. And you can look around in our own church here in Glandorf and see many examples of imagery pertaining to the Body and Blood of Christ. When you walk in the main doors in the back, you will see on one side a painting of a Pelican mother that is allowing her young to drink her blood for lack of food. This symbolizes Christ who shed His blood on the cross for us all as children of God. On the other side of the doorway is the Lamb of God painting who is shown sitting on a book with seven seals. In the book of Revelation chapter 5 we see Jesus as the Lamb of God and He only is worthy to break the seven seals and read from the book. You will see the same Lamb of God in front of the main altar and it is also on the tabernacle door. Anther place with the Lamb of God is the stain glass window directly south of the main altar. In the northwest stain glass window, we see a monstrance containing the precious body of Jesus and two windows east of that is a host on top of a chalice. When we repainted the church several years ago, the church was full of scaffolding and Deacon Eric Kaufman and I climbed up the scaffolding to get a better look at the windows. On this host above the chalice is painted Jesus dying on the cross and Mary, His mother and the apostle John are standing at Jesus' feet. And in the stain glass window directly above the tabernacle is a priest holding up a host as if at mass and on the host is painted Jesus dying on the cross. These depictions of Jesus on the cross are not able to be seen from the floor. So, we have a lot of imagery right here in our church to remind us of what Jesus did for us and how He wants to share with us His Body and Blood. Jesus says in the Gospel that He is the living bread that came down from heaven, and whoever eats this bread will live forever. Life eternal calls for consuming God. His "true" food does not simply fill our mouths and stomachs for meaningful social interaction. Nor is the Lord's Body and blood solely

"true" food does not simply fill our mouths and stomachs for meaningful social interaction. Nor is the Lord's Body and blood solely spiritual food. The banquet of Jesus' body and blood draws us through death into resurrection and the fullness of eternal life. I hope and pray that the real presence of Jesus be with you and in you on a constant basis. God bless all.

"God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth" "For thus says the Lord, who created the heavens [he is God!], who formed the earth and made it: 'I am the Lord, and there is no other." (Isaiah 45:18)

Everything that we know in the world is caused by something else that came before it. For example, you exist because your parents existed before you. Can everything have a cause that existed before it? We can use our minds alone to know there must be a single God who existed before all else.

Scripture reveals who God is.

"All holy" - Isaiah 6:3 – God can do everything perfectly and without labor.

"All knowing" – Psalm 139 – God knows everything completely,
"Eternal" – Revelation 4:8 – God has always existed; he has no
beginning or end; he is not bound
by time,

"Unchanging" – Psalm 102: 25-27 - God is perfect and does not become or need to become, other than he already is

"All present" – Psalm 139: 7-10 – God is everywhere at all times; as pure spirit, he is not bound by space; all things are contained in God.

It is God who came before all things. God created everything out of nothing, to show forth his love and goodness. Have you ever thought about how complex creation is? Tiny atoms hold together to make substances; plants grow in an order; the organs of a human body work in harmony together. While they are complex, everything works together perfectly.

All of creation exists because *God holds it in existence*. God is perfect and perfectly sufficient on his own. He does not need creation or anything in it. Everything that exists, exists because of his generosity and love for us. Through His creation, we are able to come to know who He is and reflect on His glory.



Why is this Workshop necessary?

In this polarized time, we lack basic understanding of why people on the other political side hold their beliefs. We don't see them as they see themselvestheir core values and central concernsbut instead as we choose to see them. We are tempted to regard our own side as principled and the other side as self-interested.

And when we try to communicate across this gap, we often lack the skills for listening carefully, looking for common ground, and sharing our perspectives in ways that connect rather than create more misunderstanding.




