FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

In our scriptures today we given an ultimatum are we going to serve God or are we going to go elsewhere?

Our instinct as people of faith is to respond by saying yes, we are going to serve God, and it is easy for us to say yes that we will serve God when things are going well, when things are going right, when we are not being challenged. But what about when things are the opposite when things are not going as well as we would hope, when it feels as though God has abandoned us, when we feel as though our God is challenging us? In these moments it is quite temping to look away from God and choose to go elsewhere. In face of challenge do we have the faith to say yes to God?

For the last several weeks in our scriptures we have been hearing Jesus say that he is the Bread of Life and "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life" (John 6:54). And as Jesus says this the Jews quarrel and have a hard time understanding him. Today's scriptures continue with John Chapter 6 as we reach the breaking point, Jesus saying this is too much for some of disciples they say "'This saying is hard; who can accept it?"' (John 6:60) and they leave him. Jesus asks, "the Twelve, 'Do you also want to leave?"' (John 6:67).

As we hear our scriptures today, they can also be hard for us to hear, and leave us with a feeling wanting to leave. Perhaps with what Jesus says but also and perhaps even more so with Paul's words. Paul instructs us to be subordinate, he says that "Wives should be subordinate to their husbands" (Ephesians 5:22). We struggle with the word subordinate. And misunderstand the word subordinate to be kind of a slavery. Unfortunately, this word has led to wives being abused by their husbands. If this is you, I am sorry and if you are in an abusive situation, I pray that you can get out into a safer situation. Paul uses the word subordinate not because he wants us to be slaves to each other or taken advantage of. But Paul wants us to love one another the same way that Christ loves us. "Live in love, as Christ loved us. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over to sanctify her," (Ephesians 5:25) "So also husbands

should love their wives as their own bodies" (Ephesian 5:28). Just as Christ gave up his life out of love for us. So, husband and wife are called to give up their lives out of love for each other in witness to Christ's love. We too are called to give up our lives out of love for one another in witness to Christ's love. When we authentically live this love, it is a witness of faith. The question is do you also want to leave this love?

Hopefully, like Peter we can answer "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:69).

CATECHISM CORNER

Each week at Holy Mass we profess our belief in reciting the Nicene Creed. What does it mean when we say we believe in these statements/ truths? We will take a look at each statement/truth of the Creed and examine it's meaning through the use of the Faith and Life Series by Ignatius Press that is utilized in our Parish Religious Education morning program, 5th Grade curriculum. We believe in the... "Realm of Angels" "For he will give his angels charge of you to guard you in all your ways." (Psalm 91:11)

Before God created the physical world, he create pure spirits, the angels. Angels who behold the face of God and serve Him perfectly, surpass all visible creatures (CCC 330). Each angel is unique and has powers of knowing and loving. Each angel will live forever. Angels love God and serve Him as messengers and helpers of His plan of salvation. Angels are not bound by matter, and in fact have immense power over it. They have no physical form but can control the material world, which enables them to carry out God's will on earth in a way no other creatures can.

Like humans, angels were given intelligence and a free will: the ability to know God and to choose whether or not to love and serve Him. Some of the angels chose not to serve God and were thrown out of heaven. God did not punish them out of anger or a lack of mercy; rather, their choice to reject Him was entirely their own and with full knowledge, so the consequences are natural to it; the angels who refused to serve God served their own purposes instead. Each of the angel's choice to turn away from God was final. When each chose to be separate from God, they no longer had access to His goodness, and these choices are thus entirely evil. These fallen angels are now called demons, and they desire only evil. Their entire purpose is to subvert the will of God. They were successful in tempting Adam and Eve to sin, which was the cause of the Fall of humanity. However, God has complete power over them and they can not win against Christ's power.

Humans are not angels. Angels are pure spirits. The nature of humanity is both physical and spiritual. However, like angels, God wants us to choose to love and serve Him. To help us grow in virtue, God has assigned each person their own guardian angel.

Since angels want what God wants, our guardian angel wants us to become holy as well. Our guardian angels have been tasked to protect us from physical and spiritual harm by helping us to resist temptation and avoid sin.

Since the angels know God's wisdom more fully than we do, we can ask the angels to help us understand His will for us more clearly. We can ask the angels to help us do good and to see opportunities to obey God in our daily lives and serve Him by serving others.




NEED YOUR HELP
