In our scriptures today Jesus tells us that "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted" (Luke 14:11). Jesus encourages us to practice humility, to practice humility is a virtue, and I would venture to guess that most people will not disagree with Jesus and agree on importance of practicing humility. A matter of a fact I would venture to guess many people try to practice this virtue.



But sometimes I think when we are trying to humble ourselves, we might be exalting ourselves. We can misunderstand what it means to practice humility. Take for example when someone wants to pay you a compliment or express gratitude to you for something you have done. In these moments we can brush these comments off as it not being anything important or necessary and not want the recognition we might say "it was nothing anyone could do it" or say, "a thank you is not necessary" or we might say "what I did really was not that good". We give such responses thinking we are being humble. But could you imagine when that person tried to give you a compliment or thank you for what you did they agreed with you and said "you are right it really was not that good, I should not be thanking you, you are right what you did was nothing, I mean others can do what you just did, a matter fact many people can do what you did even better than what you just did." Such a comment might catch us off guard and would humble us in an unexpected way. Perhaps a better way to respond to being given a compliment or thanked would be to say, 'you're welcome', if someone helped you in the act and you did not act alone acknowledge those that helped you, or simply accepting accountability for what you just did, yes what I did was a good thing'. To be acknowledged for doing something good is necessary, to get a pat on the back feels good, in these moments we are being exalted because in doing the deed we humbled ourselves.

Jesus in teaching about humility uses image of being invited to a wedding banquet, he instructs "when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when host comes to you, he may say, 'My friend, move up to a high position.'" (Luke 14:10). Jesus tells us to take the lower place at the table so that later we can be invited up to the higher place of honor. This instruction to practice humility assumes that we are going be invited to move up, but what happens if the invitation to move up is

delayed do we have patience and humility to wait? Or what happens if we take that place, we think it is the lower place and we never get invited to move up to the higher place, do we have the humility to accept that lower place? If we take the lower place at table and we are invited up to the higher place, do we accept the invitation to move up?

If your answer is yes to these three questions, then you have mastered the virtue of humility. But if your answer is no or maybe some work needs to be done to master the virtue of humility. Regardless of where we happen

to be in practicing humility, Christ continues to walk with us. As Christ models humility for us may we follow Christ example.

# Catechism Corner

# "Come back to the Eucharist, Come back to Adoration" -St. Teresa

September 5<sup>th</sup> is the feast day of St. Teresa of Calcutta. She was a small Albanian nun who lived from 1910-1917 and devoted her life to caring for the poor and dying. She saw Jesus in each person, regardless of their differences. She started the Missionaries of Charity order and was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979. She was known world-wide for her work and spoke at many engagements of world leaders. In September of 1946 God placed a special calling of "I thirst" on her heart to do this work. This calling was in recognition of God's desire for reciprocal love from humanity. St. Mother Teresa accredited her strength was found from spending an hour each day in front of Jesus in the consecrated host (the "Blessed Sacrament").

The first Friday and Saturday each month here at St. John's Eucharistic Adoration is offered. All are invited to come spend time before the Blessed Sacrament to find your own strength with life's daily challenges! The following is a reflection on Adoration in St. Mother Teresa's own words.

Mother Teresa's Reflection on Adoration of Jesus in the most Blessed Sacrament "Every holy hour we make so pleases the Heart of Jesus that it would be recorded in Heaven and retold for all eternity. It opens up the floodgates of God's merciful Love upon the world. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is the best time you will spend on earth. It will make your soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in Heaven. A Holy Hour of adoration helps bring everlasting peace to your soul and in your family. It brings us personal peace and strength. It brings us a greater love for Jesus, for each other, and for the poor. Every holy hour deepens our union with Him and bears much fruit. † Nowhere on earth are we more welcomed or loved than by Jesus in Eucharist. When you look at the crucifix, you understand how much Jesus loved you. When you look at the Sacred Host you understand how much Jesus loves you now. This is why we need Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in every parish throughout the entire world. What will convert America and save the world? My answer is prayer. What we need is for every parish to come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in Holy Hours of prayer. † On the Cross Jesus said, "I thirst". From the Blessed Sacrament Jesus continues to say to each of us "I thirst". He thirsts for our personal love, our intimacy, our union with Him in the Blessed Sacrament.

† If you really want to grow in love, come back to the Eucharist, come back to that Adoration. Our hours of adoration will be special hours of reparation for sins, and intercession for the needs of the whole world, exposing the sin-sick and suffering humanity to the healing, sustaining and transforming rays of Jesus, radiating where He has not yet been known and loved...But, unless we have Jesus, we cannot give Him; that is why we need the Eucharist. Spend as much time as possible in front of the Blessed Sacrament and He will fill you with His strength and His power. † Perpetual adoration is the most beautiful thing you could ever think of doing. People are hungry for God. Imagine for a moment that we are living in Jesus' time and He has invited us to visit with Him and spend some quiet time getting to know Him better. Being aware who He was, we would be humbled and honored by such and invitation. The good news is that Jesus is here with us TODAY – body, blood, soul and divinity – in the Holy Eucharist. Although Jesus comes to us under the appearance of bread and wine, His presence is as real to us NOW as He was flesh-an-blood-real to His disciples when he walked this earth. He can perform miracles, heal us, teach us, and love us. We can talk to Him and He can speak to us through His Word and through the Holy Spirit who lives in us through our baptism and confirmation. † Jesus has made Himself the Bread of Life to give us life. Night and day, He is there. If you really want to grow in love, come back to the Eucharist, come back to that Adoration." -Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta (Feast Day, Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>) You are invited to come to the Blessed Sacrament during St. John's Eucharistic Adoration!
