## FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

"I am hungry."

From time to time, we get hungry and from time to time we can echo this phrase "I am hungry". There is nothing wrong for us to be hungry, there is nothing wrong with us saying "I am hungry". As a matter of fact, from time to time it is biologically necessary for us to be hungry and not only is important for us to be hungry. It is biologically necessary for us to satisfy our hunger for our survival. As a matter of fact, if we do not satisfy this need and desire, if we do not eat, we cannot live, we will not survive. Not only is it necessary for us to satisfy our hunger, I think it is also necessary that we satisfy our hunger properly.

In our scriptures today the Israelite community has been freed from slavery, they are wandering in the desert, and they were hungry. As a matter of fact, in their hunger, they grumble against Moses and Aaron. To satisfy their hunger they feel as though they would be better off being back in Egypt in slavery "'Would that we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread!" (Exodus 16:3). In Egypt they were slaves it was less than an ideal situation but at least they had their fill of food, but I would argue that they were not truly fed. In our hunger sometimes I think we can be like Israelites and grumble and sometimes we can be willing to settle for something that is less than ideal and think that we will be fed. I think of the example when we are hungry, and we choose to eat those unhealthy food cakes, pies, cookies, and candies. This feeds our stomachs but really does not nourish our bodies.

In our scriptures today the crowd goes in search of Jesus, why? Because of the signs he performed on the sick curing them of their illnesses. I mean last week before Jesus made five loaves of bread and two fish more than enough to feed a crowd of over 5,000 people, Jesus was performing signs on sick people. Jesus performed signs on the sick, that would seem like a reason to draw people to him. But no, this is not the reason Jesus says they go in search of him. Jesus says that the crowd goes in search of him because they "ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures to eternal life" (John 6:26-27). We go search of Jesus perhaps because we know of his gift to heal, but most importantly we run to Jesus because we know that he really feeds us. Five years ago, when I was in Dayton, on this weekend, Saturday night

into Sunday morning was the mass shooting on the Oregon District. I lived about a mile away from where the shooting happened and Holy Trinity one of parishes, I was assigned was the closest church to were shooting took place. Sunday morning church doors were open for Mass, but the church doors were opened that morning so that people could seek healing and so that people could truly be fed by Jesus. May we always seek to be fed by Jesus.





"The special grace of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has as its effects: the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for their own good and that of the whole Church the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age, the

courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age, the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the Sacrament of Penance, the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of their soul, the preparation for passing over to eternal life" (CCC 1532).

How can we decide if we should ask to be anointed?

A good or reasonably sure judgment, without an uneasy feeling about the rightness of what one is doing or going to do, is sufficient for deciding on the seriousness of an illness. For example: A sick person may be anointed before surgery, whether or not a serious

illness is the reason for the surgery.
Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this Sacrament. And if you are still unsure, when in doubt, ask Father!

#### Why is this Workshop necessary?

In this polarized time, we lack basic understanding of why people on the other political side hold their beliefs. We don't see them as they see themselvestheir core values and central concernsbut instead as we choose to see them. We are tempted to regard our own side as principled and the other side as self-interested.

And when we try to communicate across this gap, we often lack the skills for listening carefully, looking for common ground, and sharing our perspectives in ways that connect rather than create more misunderstanding.

We can learn to disagree better in polarized times, which means accurately seeing where we differ and where we share common ground








