SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to nonemergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our Youtube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Last week in our scriptures we heard Jesus tell us to "Be watchful! Be alert! You don't know when the time will come" (Mark 13:33). In our scriptures today we hear from Isaiah and John to "Prepare the way of the Lord" (Isaiah 40:3). The message is clear, this is what we are called to do in this Season of Advent we are called to be ready for Jesus to come. But how are we to prepare?

What do when we anticipate having a guest come to our homes? We roll out the rug. We prepare for the guest to come sometimes we can spend hours and days getting ready for the guest to come. One of the things that we do when we prepare for a guest to come is that we clean our homes inside and out, those places that we clean every day, also in those places that rarely get cleaned, and we even clean in those places where our guest will not even see. Depending on the magnitude of the guest we might go so far as to renovate our home, rearrange furniture, or get new, and we might even make time for that project we have been putting off forever. We also prepare for a guest by preparing special food and drink, we get out the special China and linens. Preparations are made on how we will entertain the guest are we going to play a game or show them something special?

In this Season of Advent, we are preparing for a guest to come and the guest that is coming is Christ. And Christ when he comes is not only going to visit the building of our home but Christ is going to enter the home of your heart and your life and Christ is going to see everything. Is your heart and life ready for Christ to come? The only heart and life that we can control to ready for Christ to come is our own. But we can always help another heart or life to be ready. As I look at my heart and life there are parts that would seem to be ready for Christ to come and I cannot wait. But as I look more importantly there are parts of my heart, and life that I am a little embarrassed about, were works needs to be done to get ready for Christ to come. I recognize at some point during this season I need make time to get to confession. I also recognize I have things in abundance that others do not that I can share.

Probably most importantly as look at my heart and life I recognize that there are a

few relationships that I could work at fixing or trying to make better. These days as I flip through channels on the T.V. I find many Christmas movies on. Have you ever noticed that many of these movies share a similar plot? The magic of Christmas comes through the fixing of a relationship.

As you prepare the way for Christ to come into the home of your heart and life, what is that relationship that you are being called to fix? What is that you need to do to be ready?

CATECHISM CORNER SECOND WEEK OF ADVENT

The Season of Advent prepares us to welcome the mystery of the Word Incarnate, who will give 'Light' to the womb of the Virgin Mary. This time prepares us not only to welcome this great event, but to incarnate it in our lives. We could say that the true light enters the world through the immaculate womb of Mary, but it does not stay there. On the contrary, this light flows out into our dark, obscure, sinful lives to illuminate them, so that we can become the lift that illuminates the world. For this reason, let us live this time of waiting not only to celebrate a historical memory but to repeat this memory in our lives and in the service of others. To wait for the Lord who comes, means to wait and to watch so that the Word of Love enters inside us and focuses us everyday of our lives.

This week we light the second candle of the Advent candle. This candle represents PEACE and it is sometimes called the "Bethlehem Candle" as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. As we journey through this Advent, may we be an instrument of PEACE into this world so as to spread His Light and Love.

Dear Jesus, you entered our world on Christmas as the Prince of Peace. This Advent, as we strive to become thebest-version-of-ourselves, fill us with a deep and abiding peace. Help us share that peace with everyone we encounter, especially those who need it most. Amen.

What does the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception Celebrate?

There 's a popular idea that it refers to Jesus' conception by the Virgin Mary.

It doesn't.

Instead, it refers to the special way in which the Virgin Mary herself was conceived. This conception was not virginal. (That is, she had a human father as well as a human mother.) But it was special and unique in another way. . .

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains it this way:

490 To become the mother of the Saviour, Mary "was enriched by God with gifts appropriate to such a role." The angel Gabriel at the moment of the annunciation salutes her as "full of grace". In fact, in order for Mary to be able to give the free assent of her faith to the annuurcement of her vocation it was processary that she he wholly.

the announcement of her vocation, it was necessary that she be wholly borne by God's grace.

491 Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Pope Pius IX proclaimed in 1854:

The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin.

Because of the way redemption was applied to Mary at the moment of her conception, she not only was protected from contracting original sin but also personal sin.



THE GRACE I SEEK: to trust that the Lord longs to forgive my sins

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze. Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to repent of my sins and to trust in your loving forgiveness.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated." (Isaiah 40:1–2A)

FOR REFLECTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

We often forget that, in repenting of our sins and turning back to Jesus, we are turning back to one who infinitely loves us and longs to comfort us. Pray through the events of this past week and ask Jesus to show you how he has comforted you and encouraged you to repent of any sin that may be present in your life. Give concrete examples.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you in a personal way through this passage.

"John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins." (Mark 1:4–5)

FOR REFLECTION — John the Baptist shows us that repentance moves us towards someone as we acknowledge our sinfulness. Looking over this past week, ask Jesus to help you identify two or three concrete choices you made that moved you closer to his merciful love. Thank him for this grace.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — Almighty and merciful God, may no earthly undertaking hinder those who set out in haste to meet your Son, but may our learning of heavenly wisdom gain us admittance to his company. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Second Sunday of Advent)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, pay attention to the words of Jesus, through the priest, begging the Father's mercy on you; unite your desire for this mercy with Jesus.

LOVE IN ACTION — In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we come before Jesus and confess our sins, asking for the love and mercy of Jesus as we repent and resolve to change our lives. His Precious Blood cleanses us of all sin and gives us strength to avoid sin in the future.
