FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent and the Third Sunday of Advent is also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word meaning rejoice, on this Third Sunday of Advent, on Gaudete Sunday we are called to rejoice. In a certain sense we do this symbolically by lighting the Third Candle on our Advent wreathe and note this candle on the wreathe is a different color than the other three. Today I get the privilege of wearing what many call pink vestments, the church officially calls them rose vestments. Now we could get into a debate about what color it is but if we do, we miss the point. The point is not about what color it is, but it is more so about what the color means, what this color calls for us to do, we are called to rejoice.

Paul in our scriptures today calls for us to rejoice. A matter of a fact Paul tells us that it is so important that we rejoice. That he tells us to rejoice twice "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4). We hear the call to rejoice but what does it mean for us to rejoice? Normally when we think of rejoicing, we think of being happy, we think of being happy and rejoicing as the same thing. But the word rejoice implies more than the mere feeling of happiness. Interestingly, unlike happiness, which is an emotion over which we have little or no control. Rejoicing is something we can choose to do. We can choose to express glory or triumph, no matter what we're feeling at the moment. We can rejoice at all times and in all circumstances, not because we feel giddy but because lift itself is a celebration.

Paul, when he instructs us to rejoice, he is not telling us to be happy. Rather as Paul calls on us to rejoice, he is calling on us to make our prayer of request known to God and then place our trust in God. Paul tells us that when we rejoice and trust in God, we will have an unsurpassable peace. In our scriptures today as tax-collectors are being baptized, they ask John what should they do? John tells them to "'Stop collecting more than what is prescribed'" (Luke 3:12). At the time of Jesus and John, tax-collectors did not have the best of reputation. Not just because they collected taxes but also because of how they collected taxes. Tax-collectors got their job not by choice, but by force of the Roman Government. And as part of their job the Roman Government would tell them how much they would need to collect. For tax-collectors this was their only job so they would often take from their subjects more than the Roman Government needed to help provide for their own needs. This is how tax-collectors would get their bad reputation; John tells them to stop doing this and place their trust in God collect what is needed and trust that God will

provide for the rest. Can we rejoice and trust in God in the same way?

Mary, I think provides us with a wonderful example of this of rejoicing and trusting in God. After Gabriel declared to Mary that she was going to give birth to Jesus. Gabriel expected Mary to rejoice, yet he must have known that she was undoubtedly going to feel anxiety. He didn't expect her to be happy on command, but he did expect her to rejoice. Mary was called on to trust that God would take care of her. Like Mary on this Gaudete Sunday may we like Mary rejoice with trust that our God will take care of us.

"He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom

will have no end."

After the Resurrection, Jesus sent his Apostles to continue his work through the power of the Holy Spirit before He ascended into heaven.

When Jesus first met with His Apostles after His Resurrection, He showed them His wounds in His hands and side. Then, He instituted the Sacrament of Penance.

John 20: 19-23

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked

for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" After

he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." And with that he

breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven;

if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Jesus first showed His wounds to His Apostles before instituting the Sacrament of Penance because He wanted them to realize through His wounds we can be healed through the Sacrament of Penance. Then He breathed the Holy Spirit onto them and gave them the power to make this truly happen. This power has been handed down from one priest to the next, generation to generation, in what is called 'Apostolic Succession' through the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

Jesus prepared His Apostles for His Ascension by teaching them He would be with them until the end of the age. That message is for us today, also. Jesus remains with us through the Sacraments. He is present in the Word of God and to His people that are present and gathered in His Name. Most perfectly, He is present Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist.

For forty days Jesus remained on earth after His Resurrection. Before He left, He told the Apostles they would be baptized with the Holy Spirit at the coming of Pentecost. As the Apostles looked on, Jesus ascended into heaven. Unlike Elijah, who had been carried up to heaven, Jesus rose to heaven by His own power.

As the Apostles looked on to witness Jesus ascend, angels appeared telling them that Jesus would return in the same way he had left. This is why we say in the Creed that Jesus "will come again in glory". We believe that, as promised in Scriptures, He will return in the same manner in which He departed.

Let us await His coming and be prepared.
