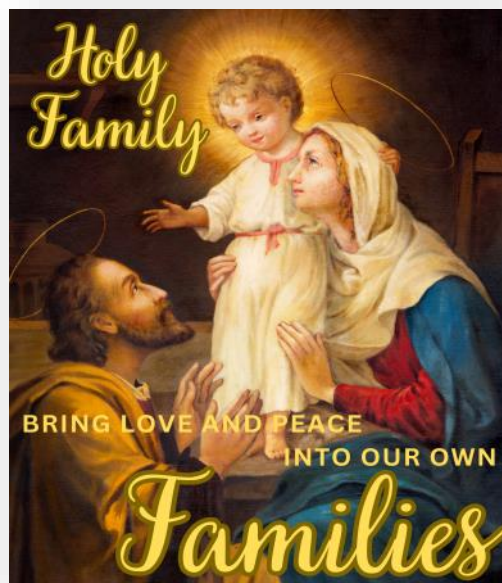

SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy:
"Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our Youtube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

2 FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DON

Merry Christmas! You know one of the things that I liked about being Catholic is that Christmas does not get confined to one day but is a season that last nearly two weeks. One of the gifts of Christmas is that it brings family together and I hope over the past week you were given the opportunity to spend some good quality time with your family. Speaking of family today the church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Just as they are the Holy Family, our families are also holy. And this idea of calling our family holy, I think, can make some families feel a little uncomfortable.

After I baptize a child, I like to present the parents of that child with a Parents' Vocations Prayer card from the Missionaries of the Precious Blood Vocations Office. I like to present this card to parents as reminder/help to be praying for their child's future vocation no matter wherever it may happen to be that God will call their child. On the other side of the card there is a modern picture of a family praying in their homes. It is a picture of family that were my parishioners in Dayton, Fr. Steve Dos Santos, C.P.P.S. our former Vocations Director was friends with this family and asked if he could take their picture of their family praying for the card. I was invited to the family home for dinner just as the holy cards came off the printers and Fr. Steve gave a card to take to the family. When I showed them the card the dad embarrassingly smiled and said, "we are really not holy".

I think many of you would us saw a picture of our family on holy card would probably say the same thing 'our family is really not holy'. But perhaps this is because we have a misunderstanding of what it means to be holy. I think we often associate being holy with being perfect, a family the does not have any problems, and everyone gets along. But I do not think this necessarily makes for a holy family. And if we look at the example of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph this is not a description of them. They certainly had their fair share of problems Mary conceived Jesus before Mary and Joseph were living together, Mary and Joseph had Jesus lost for three days when they found him the temple, Mary had to give birth to Jesus in a stable, and Joseph had to flee with Mary and Jesus when Herod came to destroy Jesus. Did they always get along? There is nothing to say they did and there is nothing to say they did not. But who is to say in the midst of these problems they always got along?

A sign of the Holy Family's holiness that we see in our scriptures today is Mary and Joesph presenting Jesus in the temple. As a priest I get the privilege seeing signs of family holiness when they present a child for Baptism, First Reconciliation or First Communion, and Confirmation. The excitement in families on these holy occasions, it is sign to me that faith is a live in families and holiness is present. I get the privilege of watching our students come over from Glandorf Elementary to the Parish Center each day another sign of holiness in family.

But the question is how our family be holy in the everyday life? I think it comes in following Paul's instruction in our scriptures today: "Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also must do. And over all these put on the love, that is, the bond of perfection" (Colossians 3:12-14). It is when our family puts this instruction into practice that our families are holy like the Holy Family.

CATECHISM CORNER

The Story of Mary, Mother of God

Mary's divine motherhood broadens the Christmas spotlight. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel (Luke 1:26-38). Elizabeth proclaims: "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the *fruit of your womb*. And how does this happen to me, that *the mother of my Lord* should come to me?" (Luke 1:42-43, emphasis added). Mary's role as mother of God places her in a unique position in God's redemptive plan. Without naming Mary, Paul asserts that "God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law" (Galatians 4:4). Paul's further statement that "God sent the spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out 'Abba, Father!'" helps us realize that Mary is mother to all the brothers and sisters of Jesus. Some theologians also insist that Mary's motherhood of Jesus is an important element in God's creative plan. God's "first" thought in creating was Jesus. Jesus, the incarnate Word, is the one who could give God perfect love and worship on behalf of all creation. As Jesus was "first" in God's mind, Mary was "second" insofar as she was chosen from all eternity to be his mother. The precise title "Mother of God" goes back at least to the third or fourth century. In the Greek form *Theotokos* (God-bearer), it became the touchstone of the Church's teaching about the Incarnation. The Council of Ephesus in 431 insisted that the holy Fathers were right in calling the holy virgin *Theotokos*. At the end of this particular session, crowds of people marched through the street shouting: "Praised be the *Theotokos*!" The tradition reaches to our own day. In its chapter on Mary's role in the Church, Vatican II's *Dogmatic Constitution on the Church* calls Mary "Mother of God" 12 times. COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God?

The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, falls on New Year's Day; it celebrates Mary as the Mother of Jesus and the Mother of the Church. Though there are many other solemnities in the Church (read the next question), this holy day is often shortened to "the Solemnity," even though there are five other solemnities in the Church. As Pope Francis said in his 2022 homily on this day, "The New Year begins under the sign of the Holy Mother of God, under the sign of the Mother. A mother's gaze is the path to rebirth and growth."

Is a solemnity the same as a feast?

Yes, and no. Solemnities are special feasts – those greatly important to the Church and theology. All Sundays and holy days of obligation are solemnities, though not all solemnities are holy days of obligation. Other holy days of obligation include the Nativity of Jesus (December 25), the Immaculate Conception of Mary (December 8), the Solemnity of the Ascension of Christ (Thursday of the sixth week of Easter), the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary (August 15), and All Saints' Day (November 1).

When is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God?

The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, is celebrated on January 1 (New Year's Day) every year. In 2024, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, falls on a Monday.

Is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, a holy day of obligation?

Yes, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, is a holy day of obligation. The Church encourages all Catholics, who are able, to attend Mass on the Solemnity. The USCCB allows two exceptions, however: when the Solemnity falls on a Saturday or Monday, "the precept to attend Mass is abrogated." Most likely, in years when the Solemnity falls on one of these days, your parish will celebrate the Solemnity the Sunday before; that day is New Year's Eve this year. 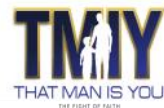

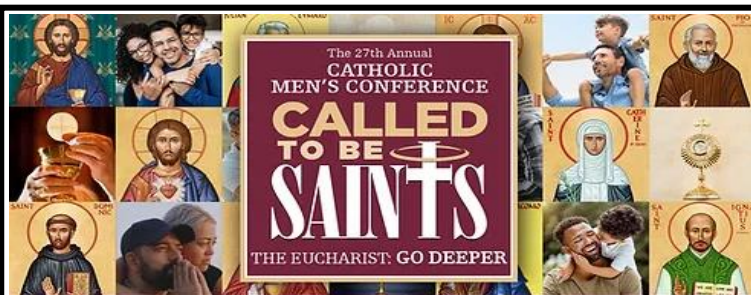

Feast of the Holy Family: Loving Forgiveness

HE GRACE I SEEK: to love and forgive all those closest to me

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze. Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to forgive those closest to me.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"Brothers and sisters: put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do." (Colossians 3:12–13)

FOR REFLECTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

What person in your life are you most struggling to be patient with? Ask the Lord to reveal to you any areas in your relationship that may need forgiveness and humility.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you in a personal way through this passage.

"The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted (and you yourself a sword will pierce), so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.'" (Luke 2:33–35)

FOR REFLECTION — Gazing upon the Eucharist, ask Jesus to help you identify any thoughts of your heart that may be a stumbling block to loving those closest to you. Write these thoughts down, asking the Lord to replace them with his thoughts.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — O God, who were pleased to give us the shining example of the Holy Family, graciously grant that we may imitate them in practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity, and so, in the joy of your house, delight one day in eternal rewards. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Feast of the Holy Family)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire to forgive those closest to you with the forgiveness Jesus offers us in the Sacrifice of the Mass.

LOVE IN ACTION — After the Lord has revealed to you whom you are being called to forgive and love in a deeper way, make a resolution to show them concretely this week how much you love and appreciate them. Some examples could include a phone call, a quick note in the mail, or an invitation to share a meal together. Choose something you know will mean the most to the other person!
