# **SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS**

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy:
"Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of
Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow
Emergency, during which all roadways are closed
to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic
Churches within that geographic region will cancel
the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day
Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore,
are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass.
If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged
to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or
internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If **Putnam County** is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

# FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Today we remember Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus into the temple to present him to the Lord. Those that have devotion to praying the Rosary are probably familiar with this story because the fourth Mystery of the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary is the Presentation of the Lord. Often when we think of the Presentation, I think we often think of it as baptism when parents have a newborn baby, and they bring the baby to church for the Sacrament of Baptism. We might think this is what Mary and Joseph were doing when they brought Jesus the for the presentation.

In a certain sense there is some similarity with Mary and Joseph presenting Jesus to Lord was something that they were supposed to do, they were following the law as our scriptures tell us today "as it is written in the law of the Lord, every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord" (Luke 2:23). Similarly one of the duties of parents in our faith is to raise their children in the practice of the faith and what better way to begin to raise a child in the faith than to have that child baptized.

The baptism of a child and the presentation of the first born male child in the Jewish culture is similar but also different. When parents present a child for baptism that child does not yet belong to God. But the parents of this child wants their child to belong to God, so they ask the church to baptize their child so that their child can become a child of God and belong to God. When Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the temple, a matter of fact anytime when Jewish parents presenting a firstborn male child, that child already belongs to God. But when present their first-born son Dianne Bergant explains this "was a way of reclaiming the firstborn male child who, the Israelites believed, really belonged to God. Buying back the child was a way of acknowledging God's initial claim. The standard offering for this religious practice was a yearling lamb". For couples that could not afford provisions were made as our scriptures indicate that Mary and Joseph offered either a pair of pigeons or two young turtledoves. The presentation or baptism both bring us into the grace of belonging to God. We belong to God. The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is also called Candlemas Day, a day where we traditionally bless candles, particularly all the liturgical candles that will be used in the year ahead, but we bless other candles as well. When we light a candle we do it for multiple different reasons. You light a candle because it gives off light before electricity after dark you needed light you lit a candle; some people might resort to using candles if the electricity goes out. A lit candle reminds me of the presence of God. Whether that is the lit candle above the tabernacle, the light of Christ that comes from the Paschal Candle, or when

we light of candle because we are asking God for something in prayer (I light a candle sometimes to pray for peace). When we were baptized, we were presented with a lit candle because Christ has enlightened us because we belong to God. As bless and light candles today may they help to remind us of that grace that we belong to God.

# CATECHISM CORNER

Each week at Holy Mass we profess our belief in reciting the Nicene Creed. What does it mean when we say we believe in these statements/truths? We will take a look at each statement/truth of the creed and examine it's meaning through the use of the Faith and Life Series by Ignatius Press that is utilized in our parish religious education morning program, 5<sup>th</sup> Grade curriculum. "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." "Then the King will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, O blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world." (Matthew 25: 34)

Death is inevitable for us all. Death occurs at the end of this earthly life when the body and the soul are separated, but it is not the end.

For Catholics, a funeral is usually celebrated with a Mass. The body is brought to the church to be blessed, prayers are said for the deceased and a Mass of sacrifice is offered to the Lord on their behalf. We recognize that as the deceased was baptized in Christ, we hope in his/her resurrection in Christ. We entrust him/her to God and His mercy. After the funeral, the body is taken to the cemetery and buried because they are temples of the Holy Spirit. For this reason, our bodies are to be treated with great respect and honor, even in death. It is a Corporeal Work of Mercy to bury the dead.

While the body decays, the soul goes on to live forever. It does not stop with death. It is a spiritual creature and is not limited by matter. It continues for all eternity. When we die, our souls will be judged immediately. The way we live on earth determines our eternity. When we die, our souls are ever fixed. We must always live our lives in a way that says yes to God, and puts us in the direction of heaven.

**HELL:** Hell is real. It is a state of eternal suffering and sadness where we are separated from God forever. When we commit mortal sin, we are rejecting God in our lives. If we die in this state, our souls are fixed on rejection on God. Thanks be to God for his loving mercy, offered in the Sacrament of Penance! It is so important to understand that when we commit a mortal sin, we should rush to confession to receive absolution. The sins we confess and from which we are absolved will not be on our soul when we die and will not send us to hell.

**PURGATORY:** When we die, we may not go directly to heaven, as our soul may not be yet completely perfect. (It may have venial sin or is due punishment for sin.) Purgatory is a state of purification. It is a great gift from God as it allows us to be ready and made perfect so that we may go to heaven worthily and prepared. As we can never be sure if a soul is in need of purification, we pray for the souls in purgatory. Praying for the dead is another Work of Mercy.

**HEAVEN:** If we die in a state of grace, we will go to Heaven. Heaven is an eternal state of joy in which we are united with God forever. In heaven we will find the angels and the saints. We will be happy forever and not miss our lives here on earth. St. Therese taught that the souls in heaven are even closer to us than we realize. They want good for us, pray for us, and intercede on our behalf. They are still united to us in the Mystical Body of Christ through the Communion of Saints.

At the end of the world, we will experience the resurrection of the boy. The same bodies we had on earth will be resurrected and made glorious – just like Jesus after his Resurrection. To give us hope in the Resurrection, God has blessed different saints with the gift of incorruption – their bodies did not decay.

We can have hope in the resurrection of our soul and body one day; in complete union with Christ in heaven.





# St. Valentine:



St. Valentine was a 3rd-century Catholic priest or bishop who lived during the Roman Empire. He is remembered for his courage and faith, especially his dedication to Christ and the Church. Tradition holds that he secretly married Christian couples at a time when Emperor Claudius II had outlawed marriages, believing single men made better soldiers. St. Valentine was martyred for his faith, and his feast day on February 14 became a celebration of love and commitment, inspired by his example of selfless devotion. Over time, Valentine's Day evolved to include expressions of love and friendship through cards, gifts, and acts of kindness. Its roots, however, remain deeply tied to the Christian virtues of love, sacrifice, and fidelity. As Catholics, we can honor St. Valentine by showing love to those around us in ways that reflect God's love for us—through kindness, forgiveness, and acts of charity.

# What is a Jubilee Year?

# What are the Holy Doors?


