

SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

In our scriptures today Jesus invites us to live up to a higher standard. And when we live up to a higher standard this is what sets us apart, it is what makes us different. When we authentically live up to this higher standard, we can draw others to Jesus, we draw others to our faith.

At the same time living up to a higher standard can also be a challenge. The higher standard that Jesus invites/challenges us to live up today is that Jesus tells us to us to love our enemies, to do good to those who hate us, and pray for the one that mistreats us. This invitation, this instruction from Jesus is something we can hear frequently, is something that we can grow accustomed to listening to



and can sound good. But practically speaking when we put this into action, this instruction can be a challenge, it isn't easy. It is easier to hate my enemy than it is to love my enemy. It is much easier to do bad to one who hates me vs. to do good to the one who hates me. And I can pray for the one who mistreats me, but I must admit that prayer typically is not wishing the good of that individual mistreats me. That prayer is more of wishing bad on the one that hurt me. Praying that in some way God will punish the one that mistreated me in a similar way that so that one who hurt me can feel same way I do when that one mistreated me. When Jesus wants us to pray for the who has mistreats us, Jesus wants us to wish them good, to want what is best for them. As I consider this call from Jesus to live to a higher standard, I think I understand it, I think I get it, but I am not sure if can or want to live up to this standard. Because it is not easy.

In our scriptures today we hear this invitation to live to higher standard from Jesus and question how we might be able to live up to this standard? As Jesus gives us the standard to live up to, David in our scriptures today provides us with a model on how we can live up to this standard. Many of us are familiar with the Story of David and Goliath. David, using a sling shot, to kill Goliath. But what we are not so familiar with is what happened after this battle. David becomes quite the accomplished soldier and helps Israel to defeat the Philistines. As they return from war the women played and sang "Saul has slain his thousands, and David his ten thousands" (1 Samuel 18:7). This song giving David credit for slaying more than Saul makes Saul jealous. It makes Saul so jealous that he wants to kill and tries to kill David several times. In Saul purist to kill David is where our scriptures pick up today. Saul and his soldiers are sleeping and

David and his soldiers come upon them. As our scriptures indicate today David could have easily killed Saul with one thrust of a spear. But David does not, he says he cannot harm the Lord's anointed.

Just as David could do harm to Saul a man that tried to do him harm, a man that would seem to be his enemy. May we follow David's example and do the best we can in living up to this standard that Jesus sets for us loving our enemy, doing good to the want who hates us, and praying for one who mistreats us.

CATECHISM CORNER

Love Your Enemies

In this week's Gospel message, Jesus challenges us to "love our enemies, and do good to those who hate you...for those who mistreat you." (Lk 6:27-38)

First, we may question 'Who are my enemies?' A good way to discover this is to check how you feel towards someone who has mistreated you. If you find any pleasure in their downfall or you feel upset at their success, then you may be harboring feelings toward another that could be considered to be an 'enemy' to you.

Aside from seeking forgiveness from the Father, and offering forgiveness from that person, the question could be asked, 'What are some ways I can work on loving my enemies?'

While you are not called to be friends with them, God does call you to love them as He does. Here are some practical tips on how you can put that into concrete practice.

- Show them genuine respect. Be cordial to them in your greeting. Smile and in your heart, remind yourself that person is loved by God and deserves that respect. Another help is to remember that the Holy Spirit dwells within that person, whether it's recognizable or not, and therefore, do your best to treat them with great respect.
- Put yourself in their shoes. This helps you to relate to them with empathy. Try to understand where they are coming from. Perhaps there is an underlying reason for their attitude and actions. They may be stuck in a situation, whether it be temporal or spiritual, that they feel is overwhelming. God has a plan for them...it may be the love He wants YOU to show them!
- Find common ground. If this is difficult, you can start by acknowledging your differences. Be open and courteous to listen to their opinion, even if it's different than yours. Then respond with respect, as you'd want them to do with you. It's okay to disagree. Once you've identified your differences, then your commonalities can emerge. Let that be your focus to build on from there.
- Offer true forgiveness. In the Our Father, or Lord's Prayer, we say, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." We want to be forgiven and we tell God to treat us as we treat others. Ask God for the grace to truly forgive them. This will free you and the one whom you hold a resentment towards.
- Reach out to them first. It's one thing to forgive them and love them from a distance, but putting that into action is transformative!

 There are many ways to express love, even for an enemy. One way to go about this would be to address them directly. Say nice things to them, have an open discussion about what's happened or your feelings give them a hug, do something nice for them like opening the door for them, send them a birthday card, simply wish them a good day, smile, make a joke. These are just a few ways to go about it. Just as "hatred breeds hatred", so does "love breed love".
- Pray for them! We can always pray for our enemies because praying is an act of mercy. Praying is loving, as our Heavenly Father loves. When all else fails, you can always look to God for guidance. Along with prayer is fasting. Jesus said somethings require fasting to heal. Choose a day of the week to offer a fast for forgiveness and reconciliation. Additionally, take your anger/irritation to the confessional to receive God's grace to help you overcome the hurt and help to heal your relationship so that genuine love and flourish.

Ask yourself... Who is my enemy? How can I show love to them today and beyond?
