#### **SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS**

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to nonemergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If **Putnam County** is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our Youtube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

## FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Volunteers Wanted to Preach the Gospel-if interested there is a sheet to sign up in the back of church, please sign up.

I put this signup sheet in the back of Church, I would imagine that I will get very few volunteers to sign up. And I would venture to guess the reason why I think I would get very few volunteers sign-up is not because there are a few people that qualify or interested in preaching the preach gospel. Because I think we have many people in our parish that qualify to preach the gospel and many that do preach the gospel. And I do not think the answer is lack of interest of wanting to preach the gospel because I think there is interest. The issue for so few of sign-ups is because I think there is a misunderstanding of what it means to preach the gospel. Typically, when we think of preaching the gospel we think of when I do on Sunday after reading the gospel you sit down listening to Deacon Don or myself, some daydream during this part during the Mass, some might accidently fall asleep, and some of you I imagine are reading this article in the bulletin right now while I am stand in front of you sharing this same message with you.

Or when I think of preaching the gospel I am reminded of when I lived in Chicago when I would go to down to the Magnificent Magic Mile on the street corner the was a gentleman with a megaphone sharing a fire and brim stone message preaching the gospel. This is what we typically think of when we think of preaching the gospel and this is certainly an example of a way to preach the gospel. And most people when they think of this example of preaching the gospel say "they could never do that, the thought of speaking in front of people scares me. Plus, I would not know what to say". This is why many people will not sign up to preach the gospel. But this is only one way to preach the gospel. There are other ways to preach the gospel that does not involve speaking in front of people. There are other ways to preach that it is not about words spoken but about actions.

St. Francis of Assi is attributed with saying "Preach the gospel always, when necessary, use words". Jesus models this for in our scriptures today, Jesus is quoted as saying very little, but his actions make a huge impact. Jesus cures Simon's mother-in-law of her illness and the rest who were ill that came to the door, and those that he drove out demons from. Most might say we do not have the ability to physically heal someone of their illness or drive out demons. But each of us can care for someone who is sick, and this is curing the sick and preaching the gospel. Each one of us can help someone overcome a sinful habit this is driving out a demon, and this is preaching the

gospel.

Each one of us can preach the gospel and many of you preach the gospel and are not aware it, not so much with the words that you speak but by the actions of your life. May our preaching of the gospel draw others to have an encounter with the Lord.

Today is World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life, today we pray for religious sisters, brothers, and priests. We pray in thanksgiving for their answer to their call and that God will continue to call young men and women to consecrated life. But let us also give praise to God for their preaching of the gospel.





#### Eucharistic Meditation for Peace: Trusting in Love

THE GRACE I SEEK: to recognize the love Jesus has for me so I can learn to love others

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze. Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to recognize your love for me and to remain in that love..

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

In days to come, the mount of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain; it shall be raised above the hills, and peoples shall stream to it... He shall judge between many peoples and set terms for strong and distant nations; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. (Micah 4:1, 3)

FOR REFLECTION — Our God is a God who keeps his promises. We are told in Micah that, in the future, the mount of the Lord's house will be established as the highest mountain; nations will turn instruments of war into the peaceful tools of daily life. However, it can be hard to see and trust this in a world torn by war and conflict. Do you trust in the depths of your heart that our loving God will keep this promise? Talk to Jesus about any struggles or doubts, and ask him how he wants to increase your trust in his love.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you in a personal way through this passage.

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you."

(John 15:9–12)

FOR REFLECTION — In the Gospels we are given the key to true peace: love. Jesus Christ assures us that he loves us as the Father loves him—totally, completely, eternally. This love becomes the basis of our love for each other. Often our lack of love for others stems from our own belief that we are not truly loved, or even that we are not loveable. What areas of your heart feel as if they are not loved? With patience and compassion for your own wounds, gradually show these to Jesus. Ask him to reveal to you how he wants to love you precisely there. Consider journaling this dialogue.

CLOSING PRAYER — O God, merciful and strong, who crush wars and cast down the proud, be pleased to banish violence swiftly from our midst and to wipe away all tears, so that we may all truly deserve to be called your children. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Mass in Time of War or Civil Disturbance)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire to love others as Jesus loves you, confident that individual acts of love lead to lasting and universal peace.

LOVE IN ACTION— Knowing that we are loved by Jesus and living from that place of love can truly change our lives. This love overflows into our homes, workplaces, churches, and countries—and it is contagious. Consider making one concrete, deliberate act of love each day this week. Think of those in your life whom you may struggle to love or who may need a little more love right now. Writing a note of gratitude, giving a compliment, making a surprise phone call, etc., are all great options—be creative! Ask Jesus to guide you in your discernment.
