

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DON

The readings this weekend give us much hope as to our spiritual lives and to our relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The first reading from Zachariah was probably written shortly after the Babylonian exile in which the Jewish people were coming back together in the city of Jerusalem. It was a perilous time but the writing offers hope in that a King will come to you riding on an ass and will be proclaiming peace to all in the land. Of course, this is a foretelling several centuries later where Jesus will ride in to Jerusalem on the beast of burden to bring spiritual peace to all who follow him. And Jesus speaks that peace in the Gospel reading where He says, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest." Jesus is not talking so much as about someone who goes to work everyday and puts in many, many hours of labor and is physically tired. Jesus is talking to us about our carnal lives and how we battle each and everyday against the temptations to live out our lives in the flesh verses lives in the spirit. St. Paul talks about this in the 2nd reading when he says, "Brothers and sisters, we are not debtors to the flesh or to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh, you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live." These are tough words to live by as we are all drawn each and every day to have better things, more toys, larger and newer houses, all the material things that we think will make us happy. But Jesus offers us hope from these worldly desires in that we only need Him to be happy. Jesus says in the Gospel, "For my yoke is easy and my burden light." Jesus is promising us that if we dump

the burdens of keeping up with our friends and neighbors with material things, He will give us rest in the fact that our salvation is all that matters in this life. And the rest that He promises us will be the peace that is only found in Him. I pray this weekend that you will find peace in knowing Jesus Christ and that He went to the cross for your sins and mine. And as we battle with the forces of evil, He will be there for us until the end.

Blessed Carlo Acutis' "Holiness Kit"

By Antonia Acutis, from her bookMy Son Carlo: Carlo Acutis Through the Eyes of His Mother

My son taught catechism to children for a few years, and to help them progress spiritually, he created a kit for becoming a saint. He wrote: "I want to tell you a few of my very special secrets which will help you quickly reach sainthood. Always remember that you, too, can become a saint!"



- 1. First, you have to want it [sainthood] with your whole heart, and if you do not have the desire yet, you must ask the Lord for it with insistence.
- 2. Try to go to Mass every day and receive holy Communion.
- 3. If you can, try to spend a few minutes in Eucharistic adoration before the tabernacle where Jesus is truly present. In this way, you'll see how your level of holiness increases!
- 4. Remember to recite the holy Rosary every day.
- 5. Read a passage from holy Scripture every day.
- 6. If you can, confess every week, even for venial sins.
- 7. Make promises often to God and the Virgin Mary to help others.
- 8. Ask your guardian angel, who must become your best friend, for help.




