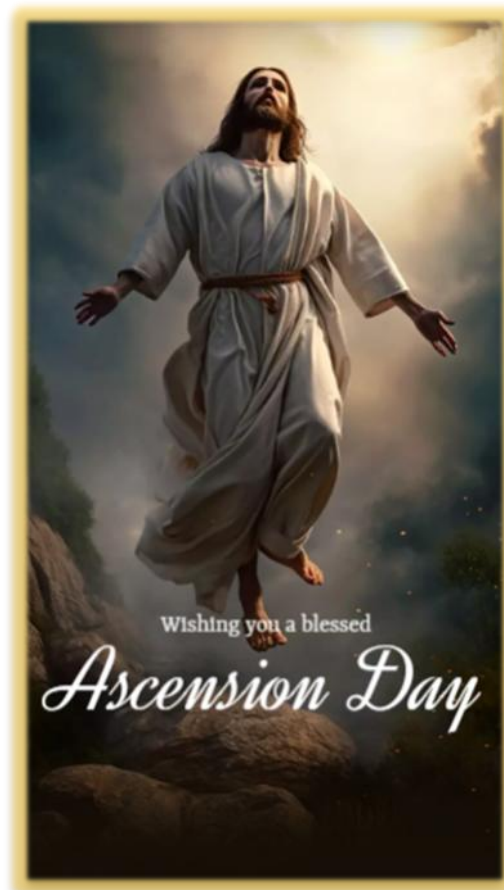

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. We read in our scriptures today that for forty days after Jesus's resurrection, he appeared to the disciples alive and spoke with them about the kingdom of God then Jesus ascended into heaven. Traditionally the Ascension is celebrated forty days after Easter Sunday, which would have been this past Thursday but our local church in her wisdom has pushed this celebration to today on Sunday.

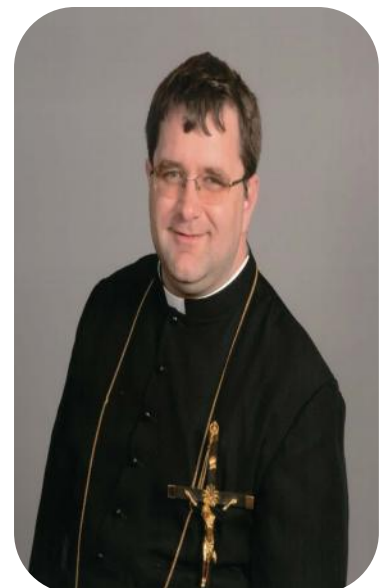


The Ascension reminds me of a relay race and not the whole race but a particular moment in a relay race. And that moment of the race is when one runner has completed their phase of the race passes the baton in the next runner's hand to run their phase of the race. For a split second in this passing of the baton from one runner to the next, the baton appears to be in both runners' hands and in this split second it would appear that both runners are running together. In the actual race the naked eye might not see it but if you have a camera and you take a picture at this moment in the race you might see it. As one runner has just completed their part of the race, and the next runner is taking off to run their part of the race. It is this split second of the passing of baton that I think is the Ascension.

As Jesus completes his phase of the race and ascends to heaven, Jesus puts the baton into his disciples' hands, Jesus puts the baton into our hands to run the next phase of the race. Now typically it is in the passing of the baton that the next runner eagerly and enthusiastically grabs the baton and takes off running as fast as they can in their phase of the race. As Jesus ascends and places the mission in the disciples' hands and our hands, the response the disciples and our response is supposed to be taking off running as fast as we can. The disciples did not exactly take off running but they "returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God" (Luke 24:53). In the Acts of the Apostles, we read the apostles returned to upper room and they prayed. The disciples were not quite ready to take off running their phase of the race just, yet they needed to "be baptized in the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:5) Pentecost before they took off running. In a certain sense you could say this passing of the baton did not happen in a split second. But they needed some time between Ascension and Pentecost to be strengthened before they took off running on their own in the race.

Just as Jesus put the baton in the disciples' hands to continue doing his work, as we celebrate the Ascension today Jesus places the baton in your hands for you to run the race. Are you ready to take off running.

Or perhaps like the disciples you need that time between Ascension and Pentecost to be strengthened before you take off running on your own continuing to do the Lord's work. May you run your phase of the race well.

CATECHISM CORNER**FEAST OF THE ASCENSION****What is the Feast of the Ascension?**

The feast of the Ascension occurs when Jesus rose back into heaven, forty days after His Resurrection. The focus of the feast is the exaltation of the risen Christ. Jesus is enthroned in heaven. It celebrates Christ's entrance into glory. Consider what we know from the Gospels, Jesus rose from the dead on the third day and returned to the Father. He appeared to his disciples after the resurrection, yet his appearances reflected his heavenly, altered state. Jesus takes his place on the heavenly throne.

It is an incredibly important feast and is an integral element of the Easter event, as salvation is only accomplished and access to the gates of heaven is only possible after Jesus' return to the heavenly throne from which he came.

The ascension is a reminder that Jesus entered a new mode of existence and was victorious once and for all over death, thus fulfilling his divinely appointed destiny. Jesus is now the exalted Lord of the universe who reigns triumphant as the Christ and as Lord.

The ascension is the prelude to the sending of the Holy Spirit. The Acts of the Apostles reminds us that Jesus went to the mountain where he breathed his Spirit upon the world. He "poured forth" the Spirit for his work of ongoing redemption and continuation of the covenant he forged when he established his reign on earth.

The Ascension marks a new beginning

The ascension signaled a new beginning. The focus is now on the Church which is to go forth and witness to the salvation God accomplished through his Son, Jesus Christ. The Church is called to be a visible sign of God's presence in the world. All are welcome and no one is excluded.

The work of the Church can now begin. Faith must be proclaimed and nurtured if doubt is to be overcome. It is our responsibility to help keep the flame alive in the hearts of believers – empowered by the Holy Spirit to go forth and "do" the work of making Church – no matter the cost.

When is the Feast of the Ascension Celebrated?

The *General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar (#7)* stresses the connection in this feast between the passion, resurrection, ascension and sending of the Spirit. The Feast of the Ascension is a solemnity. In locations where it is not designated a holy day of obligation, it is moved to the next Sunday. The feast is still celebrated forty days after Easter in order to allow proper time and space for prayer and meditation.

A Vehicle of Hope

The ascension is a sure sign of the hope of the resurrection we all share. Because Jesus ascended to sit at his Father's right hand we will one day share the beatific vision with him in heaven.

An Act of Consecration to The Sacred Heart of Jesus

I give myself and consecrate to the Sacred Heart of our Lord Jesus Christ, my person and my life, my actions, pains and sufferings, so that I may be unwilling to make use of any part of my being other than to honor, love and glorify the Sacred Heart. This is my unchanging purpose, namely, to be all His, and to do all things for the love of Him, at the same time renouncing with all my heart whatever is displeasing to Him. I therefore take You, O Sacred heart, to be the only object of my love, the guardian of my life, my assurance of salvation, the remedy of my weakness and inconstancy, the atonement for all the faults of my life and my sure refuge at the hour of death.

Be then, O Heart of goodness, my justification before God the Father, and turn away from me the strokes of his righteous anger. O Heart of love, I put all my confidence in You, for I fear everything from my own wickedness and frailty, but I hope for all things from Your goodness and bounty.

Remove from me all that can displease You or resist Your holy will; let your pure love imprint Your image so deeply upon my heart, that I shall never be able to forget You or to be separated from You.

May I obtain from all Your loving kindness the grace of having my name written in Your Heart, for in You I desire to place all my happiness and glory, living and dying in bondage to You.

Amen.

Promises to Those Who Consecrate Themselves to the Sacred Heart:

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque promoted the devotion to the Sacred Heart just as Jesus commanded her to do. In 1670, a special feast to honor the Sacred Heart was established in France and later expanded to the entire Church as the solemnity we celebrate. (June 27 is the feast day).

First Fridays Devotion and Promises to Those Who Keep This Practice:

In addition, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary for the now-famous devotion of attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion, on nine consecutive first Fridays of the month, in reparation for those who do not receive Our Lord, those who do not love Him and those who wound Him by their sinful lives. To those devotions, Jesus gave these twelve promises:

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
2. I will give peace in their families.
3. I will console them in all their troubles.
4. They shall find in my heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of death.
5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
6. Sinners shall find in my heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Tepid [lukewarm] souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
9. I will bless the homes in which the image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their name written in my heart, and it shall never be effaced [erased].
12. The all-powerful love of my heart will grant to all those who shall receive communion on the first Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; my heart shall be their assured refuge at the last hour.
