What is our mission? We read about Moses' mission of bringing God's covenant down the mountain to the Israelites. St Paul reminds us of Jesus' mission to reconcile us and all sinners with God. In the Gospel we hear Jesus calling the 12 apostles to mission to build His Church.

The liturgical season of Ordinary Time offers all of us time to think about our mission. We create mission statements for our companies, businesses, groups and organizations, and even our parish has a mission statement. But what good is a mission statement that doesn't drive us on a mission? We should take time to reflect on our mission. If we believe God has a mission for us, we should take time to understand the mission and put some practical steps in place to drive us to that mission.

Maybe your mission is to strengthen the faith in your family. What are some practical steps to support this? You could have conversations about your faith. You could pray the rosary out loud in the living room. You could start a weekly or daily family rosary. You could invite someone to Mass and help them understand what is going on. Or maybe it's as simple as handing a prayer card to someone.

I would bet this is how many of our ministries got there start. Someone in our parish realized there was a need. They established a mission (at least in their mind). Then they put practical steps in place to make the ministry a reality.

Did you know here at St John's we have at least 45 different ministries that we can get involved with? Liturgical ministries, children's, women's, and men's ministries, family ministries, outreach and assistance ministries, faith growing ministries, and many more. How can you get involved? Make a call to the rectory and ask about a ministry that God is calling you to be a part of.

God has given each of us time, talent, and treasures. How can you apply your time, talents and treasures to our parish community? Some of you have time to offer to support CCD, OCIA, or just help out around the parish. Some of you have special talents that can be applied to our many different roles, needs, or ministries to help them blossom. Some of you may have treasures to offer, that may be funding for the parish, a particular project, or special effort, or a material item that may be useful in some way. Whatever gifts God has

given you, do you believe you are fulfilling the mission he has given you?

Take time this summer, during Ordinary Time, to think about your mission. Use this Ordinary Time to challenge yourself to make the next step. Set monthly or weekly goals for yourself to fulfil God's mission for you. Encourage others to do the same. Have some conversations with others about your mission. Put your time, talents, and treasures into action for God!

CHANGES IN DEACON FORMATION

The newly revised Permanent Deacon formation process requires five years of study. In light of the changes, Bishop Thomas has approved a new model that overlaps two groups of men in formation so that an ordination will occur every three years.. Currently, there is a class in formation with a scheduled ordination date in September of 2030. The next class will begin their Inquiry Sessions and the application process in September of 2030. The next class will begin their Inquiry Sessions and the application process in September of 2027 (fall of next year) and will begin their five years of formation in the Fall of 2028, with ordination planned for 2033. Any men who are currently between the ages of 27 and 57 and feel that the Holy Spirit may be calling them to the Permanent Diaconate are urged to speak with their pastors and to contact Deacon Daniel Brahier, Delegate for Permanent Deacons, through email at dbrahier@toledodiocese.org.

Catechism Corner

*The Source and Summit of our Faith:
Eucharistic Worship, Part 1*

Last weekend was Corpus Christi weekend in which the Catholic Church celebrates the Body and Blood of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our Faith "for in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself." (CCC no. 1324) "The Eucharist...is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit." (CCC no. 1325)

The Mass is of utmost importance in the life of a Catholic for in our worship God is truly present. We are put into contact with salvation history, with the God of that history who is God of the present and of the future. God does not need our worship; however, we need to worship God. God placed within us a longing to worship Him as it is "right and just". God is completely deserving of all our praise.

These next few Catechism Corners the focus will be on the Mass and how and why we worship God as we do. The rituals we have at mass have real meaning and actualize all we believe in our Faith. We are symbolic people. We use our bodies to be and express who we are. Liturgy uses rituals to bring the life, mission and actions of Jesus into our midst to make his mission present to us by the ways we gather, remember, give thanks, ask God's blessings, and celebrate. The rituals are a powerful way for people to express the deepest meanings and values which make us who we are and makes possible to continually encounter Christ.

It is in the celebration of the Mass in which God fills our emptiness, responds to our loneliness and expands our human heart. Stay tuned to discover the treasure of the gift God has given us: the celebration of the Holy Mass.
