2 FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DON

In the fourth chapter of Mark's Gospel, it talks about three different parables of God's Kingdom. By moving from one to another, you can get 3 different views of the kingdom. The first parable talks about the farmer who sowed seed in good soil and others in bad soil. Only the seed in the good soil bore fruit. The 2nd parable which we heard today talks about the seed which is growing under the soil but the farmer doesn't know how. It is a mystery to him. The 3rd parable which we also heard today, contrasts the tiny seed to the large plant that grows from it. Each of the parables gives us insight into God's Kingdom. The first parable reveals that the kingdom can grow only in good hearts; hearts that are open to it. The 2nd parable shows us that the kingdom can grow in our hearts without us knowing how. The 3rd parable reveals that the tiny seed of the kingdom in our heart will eventually grow into something beautiful. Elaine and I recently took a trip to Florida and while we were there, we visited a botanical garden which had several bamboo trees there. Some of the trunks were 4-5 inches in diameter and were around 40 feet tall. It reminded me of an article I read about the Chinese Bamboo tree seeds which spends 5 years under the soil. It develops an elaborate root system then pushes through the ground and will grow to 90 feet high in just 6 weeks. The seed of God's Kingdom is like the see of the bamboo tree. It takes a long time to emerge. Sometimes it takes so long that we wonder about the seed of the kingdom that was planted in us at Baptism, is ever going to take root. Maybe it falls on the rocks of our hardened hearts or is choked out by the thorns of our sins. But we need to trust God. He planted the seed of His Kingdom in our hearts and He understands what's happening, even if we don't. We need to be patient even if God's Kingdom doesn't seem to be growing in us. And most of all, we need to cultivate the seeds of His Kingdom by praying, receiving the sacraments, and going to Eucharistic

by praying, receiving the sacraments, and going to Eucharistic Adoration as much as possible. If we trust God and be patient, things will work out in God's time and in His way. God bless all of you for letting the seeds of God's Kingdom to take root and grow in love.

CATECHISM CORNER



On May 23, 2024, Pope Francis officially recognized a miracle attributed to Giovanni Merlini, advancing Merlini's cause for beatification. Giovanni Merlini, a revered 19thcentury Italian priest and member of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, has been venerated for his deep spirituality and dedication to the Church's mission. The recognized miracle, which involves the unexplained healing of a gravely ill child, has undergone rigorous investigation and validation by the Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of Saints.

Pope Francis' decree is a significant milestone in Merlini's path to sainthood, reflecting the Church's acknowledgment of his intercessory power and the impact of his life and works. Beatification, the penultimate step before canonization, allows for Merlini to be publicly venerated and recognized as "Blessed."

The announcement has been met with joy and celebration among the faithful, particularly within the Missionaries of the Precious Blood community, who regard Merlini as an

inspirational figure. The beatification ceremony is expected to draw pilgrims from around the world, eager to honor Blessed Giovanni Merlini and seek his intercession. Pope Francis' decree not only honors Merlini's legacy, but also reinforces the enduring power of faith and prayer in the lives of believers.





Depolarizing Ourselves

A Braver Angels Workshop for faith communities: a first step

Workshop Overview

For people of faith, civil discourse begins in recognizing the image of God in our conversation partner. Since we are all children of God, our approach should involve mutual respect. Respect, not agreement, is an essential key for a healthy discussion. This workshop addresses how we may inadvertently be complicit in, or possibly even encourage, polarization.

What is the Depolarizing Ourselves Introductory Workshop?

The Depolarizing Ourselves Introductory Workshop is designed to help you lessen the effects of polarization when you encounter them in your political conversations. Note that by "polarization," we are not referring to healthy disagreements over issues or philosophy. We are talking about how we regard and talk about large groups of ordinary people on the other side of our own politics as if they were enemies.

This is a group session is led by a volunteer Braver Angels Facilitator. Braver Angels is a secular organization that develops educational tools to build bridges between people divided over politics.

interact without demonizing, dismissing or stereotyping large swaths of the population. In our current political climate, much of our conflict stems not from healthy disagreement over policies, issues, or philosophy. Instead, it's created by the often emotional, rancor-escalating, and highly polarizing conversations that we typically have with others. Braver Angels has created our Depolarizing Ourselves Workshop to help you reframe how you view the other side in the face of disagreements around politics. Successfully 'taming' our inner polarizer starts with recognizing our tendencies around harmful generalizations about the other side. This requires acknowledging how we often attribute negative intent and motivations to the other side without first trying to understand them




