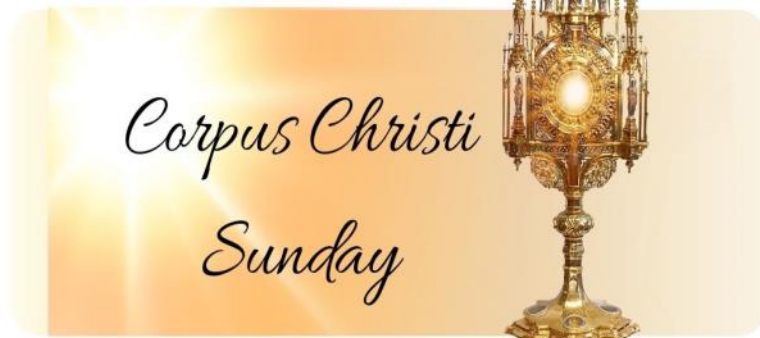

2 FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Last week when we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we celebrated our God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, three distinct persons and one God. A great mystery of our faith, and in celebrating, we celebrated that our God has a unique relationship with us. Today in celebrating the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), another great mystery of our faith, we celebrate and enter that unique relationship with our God. Through the gift of the Eucharist, we enter a covenanted relationship with our God.

What does it mean to be in a covenanted relationship? What is a covenant? The word covenant gets used several times in our scriptures today. We hear word covenant throughout the Old Testament, we hear of Abraham and Moses entering into covenants with God, and today when we hear Jesus offer the chalice he says “This is my blood of the covenant” (Mark 14:24).

A covenant is a relationship agreement, similar to a contract relationship. In our scriptures today we hear Moses relating all words and ordinances to the people. What makes a contract different from a covenant is that in a contract relationship both parties of the relationship agree to do their part and if one party in the relationship does not hold up their end, the relationship goes void. A covenant relationship on the other hand is a forever binding relationship, that once one enters into the relationship agreement, the relationship cannot ever be broken.

In a contract relationship when the relationship agreement has been met, the sign of the consent to this relationship comes through a signature and/or handshake. When we enter a covenanted relationship with God blood is normally involved. We hear in the scriptures today that the Israelites entered a covenant relationship with having the blood of the covenant sprinkled on them. Blood that would have nonetheless stained their clothes and there was no bleach to simply wash out the blood. We entered a new covenant relationship with God with blood, with Jesus’s blood, Jesus’s blood is “the blood of the new and eternal covenant” and this blood does not get sprinkled on us. We give our consent to this relationship as we say “Amen.” To the Body and Blood of Christ and we consume, we eat and drink the Body, Blood, and Soul Divinity of Jesus Christ.

Israelites entered a covenant relationship with God, and they carried the arch of the covenant with them wherever they went. As give our Amen, to the Body and Blood of Christ, we carry the arch of the covenant, we carry Christ with us as we go. We are called to share Christ with others. We do that today with our Corpus Christi procession, as we process out to our Marian Shrine. There is a desire of some to take this procession farther around the block or perhaps up and down Main Street. Not today but perhaps one day this will happen.

But in a certain sense we do carry Jesus farther just out to our Marian Shrine. Each time we receive Jesus in the Eucharist, our hearts and lives become a tabernacle of the Arch of the Covenant, and we take him with him were ever we go. Just as we show Christ to the world as we process with him out to the Shrine. May we also show Christ with the world as we venture out into our world.



I will be away June 17-19 2024 in St. Louis for our annual Missionary Precious Blood Assembly. I will celebrate Mass on Monday morning June 17 before I leave and then there will be Communion Services on June 18 and 19 while I am away. CATECHISM CORNER

The Work of Mercy we will look at this week is:

Spiritual Work of Mercy: Bear Wrongs Patiently from “The Works of Mercy Explained” by Silvia Vecchini

“Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other.” Colossians 3:13

To “bear wrongs patiently” means to receive slights, insults and inconveniences cheerfully and without judging or expressing irritation. This work of mercy invites us all to recognize that sometimes we lack patience. It asks us to learn how to bear with our neighbors and with their imperfections.

Saint Bernard said that if a Christian did not have a person to annoy him, he should go out and find one and then pay them their weight in gold! Why? Because that person teaches us how to exercise patience and meekness. These are two important virtues for anyone who wants to follow Christ. It is Jesus, after all, who gives us the example. If we think about his years of ministry, we see that Jesus welcomed everyone and answered their questions – even questions from people who were trying to get him into trouble. Jesus listened to the sick, welcomed children who made noise, cared for strangers, and ate with sinners. He did not reject anyone.

“Jesus said, ‘Come to me, all of you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart... For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.’ (Matthew 11:28-30) Jesus, gentle and humble of heart, tells us that if we patiently accept each other’s limitations, and we learn to be humble like he is, we will find the “yoke” of following him “light” and “sweet.”

Jesus himself carries this yoke – one that seems to be heavy – with us. He is at our side and will not leave us alone when we choose to do good and to love our neighbor. Jesus loved each one of us to the end and carried the heaviest yoke, the cross. Still, it didn’t crush him. Jesus’ love, his total gift, conquered death with the resurrection.

In the New Testament we can read this blessing: “May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ.” (2

Thessalonians 3:5)

Virtue / Character Development: Few people realize that sadness is frequently a result of a lack of patience. PATIENCE allows us to bear calmly life’s difficulties and irritations. Without it we become bitter and restless.

Cultivating patience in minor inconveniences is the best way to prepare ourselves for bearing great injustices calmly, as did the saints. Patience is one of the twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit. It is beautiful to think that when

we are patient with a neighbor, we are allowing the work of the Holy Spirit to grow in us.

Action Ideas: Learn to say this prayer: “Dear Lord, bless [annoying person’s name] and have mercy on me!” • Wait patiently in a long line; use time stuck in traffic as extra prayer time. • Excuse and overlook a slight from someone else. • Answer harsh words gently. • Remain calm and cheerful while you allow others to make demands on your time. • Calmly discuss irritating behavior with the person who is bothering you, seeking to understand rather than change him or her. • Do something kind and helpful for someone who you don’t get along with, or who has wronged you. • Take time in prayer to contemplate the good qualities of someone who is difficult for you. • Hold your tongue when a quick comeback is right on its tip. • Show mercy to yourself – give yourself permission to be imperfect.

The Body and Blood of Our Lord

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.



At the Last Supper, Jesus changed bread and wine into His own Body and Blood. He has the power to do this because He is God. He did this because He wanted to stay with us even after He died and went into Heaven.

Jesus comes to us in every Mass. The priest takes the place of Jesus, saying the words that Jesus said at the Last Supper, and the bread and wine become the real Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus even though they still look like bread and wine.

How do I receive Communion well?

1. Be ready! Think about what is going to happen. Make sure that you don't have any big sins on your soul. If you do, then go to confession first.
2. Don't eat or drink anything other than water or medicine for an hour before going to Holy Communion. This is a sign of respect for Our Lord.
3. After receiving Holy Communion, take some time to thank Jesus for coming to you and talk to Him. He is your best friend and loves spending time with you!

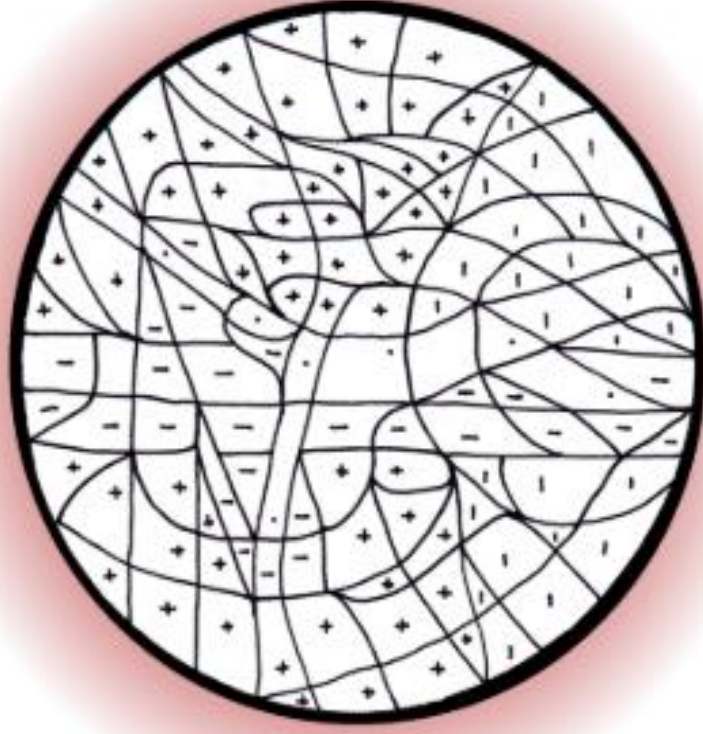
