# 2 FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

I remember earlier this spring after the girls' State Semi-final game in Dayton, I remember driving home after the game on Interstate 75 and getting around the Miller Lane Restaurant Exit and Interstate 70, I was listening to the radio and the storm warning noise came on alerting that a severe thunderstorm was about to pass through Miami County. Once you get north of Interstate 70, Miami County is not too far away, I was driving right into the storm I remember thinking to myself "hold on". Some of you also probably remember driving home that night, the rain came down hard, not to mention the hail that pounded on the roof of the car, and the wind, the wind that blew against the car, at times it was difficult to drive. At times I wondered am I going to make it, or do I need to pull off to let the rain pass through and then make my way home? In middle of all of it I believed that if I stayed in my lane and followed the vehicle in front of me at a safe distance, it would be ok. In this storm I did not feel the need to cry out "Lord, do you not care that I am perishing?"

But there are other storms that I can get into or that I am currently traveling through that I do say "Lord, do you not care that I am perishing?" Some of these are weather storms. I think of the example of driving through a snowstorm when the wind is blowing, and the snow is drifting. And at other times the storm that I encounter is not weather related like when politicians make policies decisions contrary to our faith or when I think of the state that our world is in, it is quite the storm. Or I think of the shortage of vocations to the priesthood and religious life. This week I was at our annual assembly there were not too many young members in the room. Sometimes in these storms it seems as though Jesus is asleep on a cushion, we are trying to wake saying "Teach, do you not care that we are perishing?" and Jesus seems to not be budging or responding in any way. And like the disciples in these moments, it can be easy for us to lose faith. It is easy for us to lose our patience with Jesus.

Just like for the disciples in their desperation Jesus stood up and rebuked the wind and calmed the sea. In our desperation, Jesus stands up rebukes the wind and calms the storms in our lives, helping us to make it through. I think of those times when I am working on what seems a massive work load of a storm, I say 'Jesus help me' and things seem to work out.

Regardless of what storm we are going through, may we have the trust that Jesus will not allow us to perish but will get us through and amaze us.

## CATECHISM CORNER

The Work of Mercy we will look at this week is:

### Spiritual Work of Mercy: Pray for the Living and the Dead from *“The Works of Mercy Explained”* by Silvia Vecchini

*Spiritual Work of Mercy: Pray for the Living and the Dead from “The Works of Mercy Explained” by Silvia Vecchini*

The last spiritual work of mercy is praying for the living and the dead, that is, for all men and women. With prayer Christians can “intercede” and bring the sufferings, joys, needs, and hopes of our brothers and sisters to God.

Pope Saint John Paul II wrote that God has entrusted all of us to one another.

Isn't this bond amazing? Praying for our neighbor makes us closer to God **and** closer to the brother or sister we are caring for. When we understand this, then prayer reveals itself to us as a network of love that unites us. Prayer is an **alliance**, a tie between us and God through Jesus; it is a true communion and living relationship between God and his children.

“But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. In the eyes of the foolish they seem to have died, and their departure was thought to be a disaster, and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace... and the faithful will abide with him in love, because grace and mercy are upon his holy ones; and he watches over his elect.” (Wisdom 3: 1-3, 9)

Loved ones who have died do not disappear into thin air but “live in God” and remain bound to us through prayer, above all when we participate in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. When we pray for the deceased, we affirm the faith that reminds us that physical death is not the end of life.

When we pray for those who have died, we commend them to God's mercy. With the priest's words in the First Eucharistic Prayer we ask, **“Grant them, O Lord, we pray, and all who sleep in Christ, a place of refreshment, light, and peace.”**

**Saint Spotlight:** St. Padre Pio was an Italian priest in the Capuchin Order to whom God gave many extraordinary abilities for building His Kingdom. Padre Pio received the stigmata (the wounds of Christ), could read souls, and worked many miracles through God's grace. False accusations and rumors caused Padre Pio's superiors to forbid him to offer public Mass or hear confessions, some of the most important actions of a priest. Padre Pio obeyed without complaint and did all that was asked of him. Eventually, it was proven that he had been acting in the Lord's service all along. He offered Masses, prayers, and sufferings for the Holy Souls.

**Virtue Focus:** PRAYERFULNESS deepens our friendship with God. As we intercede for the needs of others, He transforms our hearts with His mercy, making us ready to pour it out on the world. We cultivate LOYALTY when we pray for the needs of our pope, bishops, and priests, for our parents, coworkers, and schools, for our country and officials.

**Action Ideas:** Have Masses said for the living: friends and family members, even strangers you read/hear about, who are having a hard time • Take a few minutes during the week to stop in the chapel and sit before the tabernacle, simply to be with Christ, the Merciful. • Be an intercessor for someone else in his or her trials. • Sign up for a Holy Hour • Pray for the good of someone you dislike. • Visit a local cemetery and walk around praying a rosary for all the souls buried there. • Offer to pray with someone in the moment they are in need. • Pray everyday for the souls in purgatory. Pray for your dead. • Actively and audibly participate in the prayers during Mass.

### Depolarizing Ourselves

*A Braver Angels Workshop for faith communities: a first step*

**Workshop Overview**  
For people of faith, civil discourse begins in recognizing the image of God in our conversation partner. Since we are all children of God, our approach should involve mutual respect. Respect, not agreement, is an essential key for a healthy discussion. This workshop addresses how we may inadvertently be complicit in, or possibly even encourage, polarization.

**What is the Depolarizing Ourselves Introductory Workshop?**  
The Depolarizing Ourselves Introductory Workshop is designed to help you lessen the effects of polarization when you encounter them in your political conversations. Note that by "polarization," we are not referring to healthy disagreements over issues or philosophy. We are talking about how we regard and talk about large groups of ordinary people on the other side of our own politics as if they were enemies.

This is a group session is led by a volunteer Braver Angels Facilitator. Braver Angels is a secular organization that develops educational tools to build bridges between people divided over politics.

**Goals**  
To teach participants **How To:**

- be more aware of their own "inner polarizer".
- interact without demonizing, dismissing or stereotyping large swaths of the population.

In our current political climate, much of our conflict stems not from healthy disagreement over policies, issues, or philosophy. Instead, it's created by the often emotional, rancor-escalating, and highly polarizing conversations that we typically have with others. Braver Angels has created our Depolarizing Ourselves Workshop to help you reframe how you view the other side in the face of disagreements around politics. **Successfully 'taming' our inner polarizer starts with recognizing our tendencies around harmful generalizations about the other side.** This requires acknowledging how we often attribute negative intent and motivations to the other side without first trying to understand them.
