FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

This weekend because you have a pastor that is Missionary of the Precious Blood, you get the joy of, of joining me in celebrating the Feast of the Most Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Some may ask the question how do we as a community celebrate this feast? The Feast of the Precious Blood is when we as Missionaries of the Precious Blood honor our Jubilarians we celebrate our members celebrating milestone anniversaries of 70, 65, 60, 50, 40, and 25. On Monday we will gather at St. Charles Carthagena to celebrate with 11 of our members, celebrating 630 years of combined service to the church.

Some may ask the question why do we celebrate blood? I mean the idea of celebrating blood is kind a goory, it is kind a gross, to celebrate blood can leave us feeling uncomfortable. How many of you get skittish at the sight of blood? I must admit I get a little nervous when a doctor or nurse wants stick me with a needle. While this may be true, to celebrate blood is to celebrate life. In the time of Moses and Jesus it was believed that the life of a living being was in its blood. We live in 2024 we might be a bit critical of this thought, but you know when a medical professional takes a sample of our blood. That sample of blood can tell a lot about the life that is going on inside of our blodies.


When we celebrate Jesus's blood, we celebrate life, and with Jesus's blood we celebrate that we have relationship with our God. We celebrate that we have covenanted relationship with our God. We often hear the word covenant when we read the scriptures in our scriptures today, we hear Moses "Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people" (Exodus 24:7) and Jesus said that "This cup is the new covenant in my blood" (Luke 22:20). We hear the word covenant, but it is not a common word in our vocabulary. Many know that the word covenant is important but really do not understand what a covenant is. Simply put, a covenant is a relationship agreement that is forever binding, that once one enters that relationship agreement can never be undone. It is through Jesus's Blood that we are invited to a covenanted relationship with our God. In celebrating Jesus's blood we called to draw near the cross of Jesus Christ. It is here at Jesus cross Christ's dies. It here at the cross we encounter Christ wounded and we come to the cross with our own wounds. And we place our wounds in the wounds and blood of Jeus and receive healing. Finally in

celebrating the blood of Jesus we celebrate the cup, the chalice it here that the commitment to the covenant gets sealed. In a contract relationship, when the terms of relationship have been agreed

to, the sign of this consent usually comes by a signature and/or a handshake. In our scriptures today we hear the consent given to the covenant with Moses and Israelites, when Moses sprinkles the blood of the covenant on them. Jesus's blood is the blood of the new covenant, and we give our consent every time

> that we say Amen to the Body and Blood of Christ and consume it. While it may seem gory or gross to celebrate blood, but it is through celebrating the Blood of Jesus Christ that we have life and have life most abundantly.



CATECHISM CORNER

The Most Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ

> *Titular Solemnity of the Congregations* Solemnity for CPPS and ASC

In the church of St. Nicholas in Chains at Rome, traditionally known for the devotion to the Blood of Christ, Fr. Francesco Albertini instituted a religious association in 1808. It was inaugurated with the preaching of his friend, Fr. Gaspar del Bufalo, "the greatest apostle of the blood of Christ' (St. Pope John XXIII), who founded the Congregation of the Missionaries of the Most Precious Blood in 1815. During a mission that Fr. Gaspar conducted at Vallecorsa in 1822, young Maria De Mattias was profoundly struck by his preaching. It contributed to her discernment regarding the beginning of a Congregation of sisters, which she later founded in Acuto, under the title of Adorers of the Most Precious Blood. After Bl. Pope Pius IX returned to Rome from his exile in Gaeta, he published the decree Redempti sumus on August 10, 1849, extending the feast of the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ to the universal Church. In 1914, Pope St Pius X fixed the date of the feast as July 1. And Pope Pius XI, in memory of the Jubilee of our Redemption in 1934, raised it to the level of solemnity. With the reform of the liturgical calendar under Pope Paul VI, it was joined to the solemnity of Corpus Christi, that is, "The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ". Congregations inspired by the spirituality of the Blood of Christ, continue to celebrate the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ on July 1.





Recently, a group of forty-five people from Glandorf, St. John's, returned from visiting Glandorf, Germany, as they celebrated their 950th anniversary. The trip to Germany was fantastic! Many wonderful memories were made. Visiting Glandorf, Germany, is way more than just taking a vacation; it is an experience. It is an experience that begins with a shared faith in Jesus Christ, and on that foundation, the experience establishes lifelong friendships.

Over the few days in Glandorf, many gifts were exchanged between different groups: from the villages, the fire departments, history groups, and parishes. From St. John's here in Ohio, a proclamation letter of congratulations, written by Bishop Daniel Thomas, was presented to St. Johannis Parish in Glandorf, Germany. In return, they gifted us a Bible from the time of the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965).

The next official group visit between the two Glandorfs will be in June 2026. All are invited to travel with the group from the U.S.A. to Glandorf, Germany. This visit will celebrate fifty years since the first official Glandorf Exchange, which took place in 1976. This next visit will also overlap with their Schutzenfest. More details on the 2026 exchange visit will come sometime in the autumn of 2025.

Hopefully, many will decide to come along and experience the uniqueness of this special friendship between these two communities that share many names and traits, a common history, and, most importantly, a faith in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Those who might be interested include non-baptized adults who desire to be fully initiated into the Roman Catholic Church and/or baptized adults who need to complete their Sacraments of Initiation, including Confirmation and Holy Eucharist, and for some the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

OCIA will be starting back up in the September and runs through May. If you would like to join us in September, please call the rectory to register and we will be in touch to get you the necessary paperwork to begin the process.

What about when you are sick? When you are sick or hurt, think about Jesus suffering on the cross. Offer your pain to Him and tell Him that you want to suffer with Him so




that people will be saved from their sins. Be thankful for people who help you when you are sick. Remember, they take Jesus' place!
