FROM THE DESK OF Fr. Matt

A young boy was having a conversation with his grandmother. The young boy enthusiastically said to his grandmother, "Grandma, Grandma, Grandma, I know what happened at Pentecost." The grandmother attentively responded, "What happened at Pentecost?" "It is when Jesus came set them on fire and they were no longer afraid" answered the young boy to his grandmother.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost. Fifty days have passed since we celebrated Easter Sunday and today, we draw the Easter Season to close by celebrating Pentecost. After Mass today the Easter Candle will exit the sanctuary and go into the baptistry. Tomorrow we will resume Ordinary time.

Today as we celebrate Pentecost, today as we remember the strong driving wind, the tongues of fire that came upon them, and their speaking of different languages. In a certain sense this young boy's explanation to his grandmother of what happened at Pentecost of setting them on fire and they were no longer afraid is relatively cute and, in a way, he is right. Before the strong driving wind, the tongues, the speaking in different tongues, or before Jesus coming 'to set them on fire' in the young boy's words. Our scriptures say the disciples were hiding in fear behind locked doors. Why? Because Jesus their close friend and leader was arrested, condemned, and crucified by the religious leaders. Now because of their close association with Jesus could the religious authorities be coming for them next? Could next knock be the religious leaders coming to arrest them to put them on trial and put them to death? It is in this hiding behind locked and closed doors that Jesus appears to the disciples he offers them his peace and breathes the Holy Spirit on them, tongues of fire come upon them, and they speak in various languages. It is from what happened behind those closed and locked doors that they are able go out and tell the world about Jesus.

Last week when we celebrated the Ascension, I said that the Ascension was like the moment in the relay race where the baton is being passed on from one runner to the next runner. Pentecost is that moment in the relay race where the baton is in the next runner's hands and takes off running their phase of the race. It is after Pentecost that the disciples now have the baton in their hands, the disciples are no longer afraid, they take off running, and they go out into the world doing Jesus's work.

At times we can be like the disciples, we can be fearful and hide away from doing the Lord's work. Not necessarily because someone might come to arrest us, but perhaps because of the risk of embarrassment or not feeling capable of doing what the Lord is asking of us. It is in these moments that we need the descent of the Holy Spirit upon our lives; we need that experience of Pentecost that sends out to doing the Lord's work. Willing to risk the embarrassment and knowing that we are capable.



Today as a parish we are having our whole hog sausage breakfast with proceeds going to help offset the cost with a home build with a house on North Oak Street in Ottawa. As we celebrate Pentecost today, may the Holy Spirit set us fire with helping with this need.

CATECHISM CORNER

PENTECOST —SENDING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The word "**Pentecost**" comes from the Greek word *pentekoste*, meaning "fiftieth", and is accordingly celebrated 50 days after Easter. It is the feast that marks the end of the Easter season — and the official beginning of the Church.

In Acts 2:2, while the believers were gathered together, "a sound like the rush of a violent wind ... filled the entire house where they were sitting". Tongues of fire appeared and rested on the believers. They "were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability" (Acts 2:4). St. Peter — the rock on which the Church was built — gave a clear and public presentation of the Gospel. He spoke to the crowd of Christ's miracles, crucifixion and resurrection, and he encouraged everyone to repent, be baptized and "receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38).

In response, 3,000 people were converted that day, and they received the hope of Christ into their hearts. It is for this reason that Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the Church, even though in truth the Church was born on Calvary when blood and water flowed from the side of Christ – water for baptism that generates the Church and Eucharist that sustains it.

When the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles at Pentecost, and upon us at Confirmation, He conferred upon them the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit, which enables the apostles to go out on mission to build the Church.

- **Wisdom** is both the knowledge of and judgment about "divine things" and the ability to judge what is important, meaningful, and purposeful. It is seeing everything including the world situations, and problems with God's eyes.
- Understanding helps us comprehend the truths of our faith, enabling us to go beyond the boundaries of human reason and attain a knowledge that we could not attain on our own.
- **Counsel** is a gift of right judgement that helps us differentiate between right and wrong, helps in our decision making and in the timing of such. It is the virtue of prudence that is elevated to a supernatural level.
- Fortitude is the gift of reasoned courage to stand up for the truth, justice, and dignity of the human person and the common good. It is also the gift of endurance that empowers us to speak (when our voice trembles) and to act (even if we act alone.) It gives us a firmness of mind to do good and avoid evil.
- Knowledge helps us to know God and value things correctly, to see all created realities in their essential dependence on and in relation to God. This gift helps us to be detached from the world and to understand the meaning and purpose God has in our lives and in the events that occur in our lives.
- Piety helps us maintain the proper reverence for God and helps us obey God out of love. It allows us to follow the inspirations of the Holy Spirit and makes it easer to trust God (even when we don't understand His will). It opens the way for us to live our lives in intimacy with God and prompts us to pray and to live our lives as a continual conversion with God.

Fear of God helps us adapt a proper disdain for sin and to live in awe of God's goodness and love. It is a "filial" fear whereby we revere God and avoid separating ourselves from him (as opposed to "servile" fear, whereby we fear punishment).

What is Pentecost's meaning in our lives today? It is certainly an important commemoration and anniversary of that glorious historical event. It is also a celebration of our present reality as followers of Christ, signifying that believers today are still led by the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit who anointed the early fathers of the Church nearly 2,000 years ago. As you consider how to observe this special day in Church history, ask the Holy Spirit what would make him feel most honored.

However the Lord leads you, may you close this Easter season with the conviction that God's presence is living and active in your life today, and may his peace and grace be with you.

Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday-Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident--leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call. Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.



An Act of Consecration to The Sacred Heart of Jesus

I give myself and consecrate to the Sacred Heart of our Lord Jesus Christ, my person and my life, my actions, pains and sufferings, so that I may be unwilling to make use of any part of my being other than to honor, love and glorify the Sacred Heart. This is my unchanging purpose, namely, to be all His, and to do all things for the love of Him, at the same time renouncing with all my heart whatever is displeasing to Him. I therefore take You, O Sacred heart, to be the only object of my love, the guardian of my life, my assurance of salvation, the remedy of my weakness and inconstancy, the atonement for all the faults of my life and my sure refuge at the hour of death.

Be then, O Heart of goodness, my justification before God the Father, and turn away from me the strokes of his righteous anger. O Heart of love, I put all my confidence in You, for I fear everything from my own wickedness and frailty, but I hope for all things from Your goodness and bounty.

Remove from me all that can displease You or resist Your holy will; let your pure love imprint Your image so deeply upon my heart, that I shall never be able to forget You or to be separated from You.

May I obtain from all Your loving kindness the grace of having my name written in Your Heart, for in You I desire to place all my happiness and glory, living and dying in bondage to You.

Amen.

Promises to Those Who Consecrate Themselves to the Sacred Heart:

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque promoted the devotion to the Sacred Heart just as Jesus commanded her to do. In 1670, a special feast to honor the Sacred Heart was established in France and later expanded to the entire Church as the solemnity we celebrate. (June 27 is the feast day).

First Fridays Devotion and Promises to Those Who Keep This Practice:

In addition, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary for the now-famous devotion of attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion, on nine consecutive first Fridays of the month, in reparation for those who do not receive Our Lord, those who do not love Him and those who wound Him by their sinful lives. To those devotions, Jesus gave these twelve promises:

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
- 2. I will give peace in their families.
- 3. I will console them in all their troubles.
- 4. They shall find in my heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of death.
- 5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners shall find in my heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Tepid [lukewarm] souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
- 9. I will bless the homes in which the image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and honored.
- 10. I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their name written in my heart, and it shall never be effaced [erased].
- 12. The all-powerful love of my heart will grant to all those who shall receive communion on the first Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; my heart shall be their assured refuge at the last hour.



Pray to the Holy Spirit every day to help you to do everything for God. Then see how your life changes!




