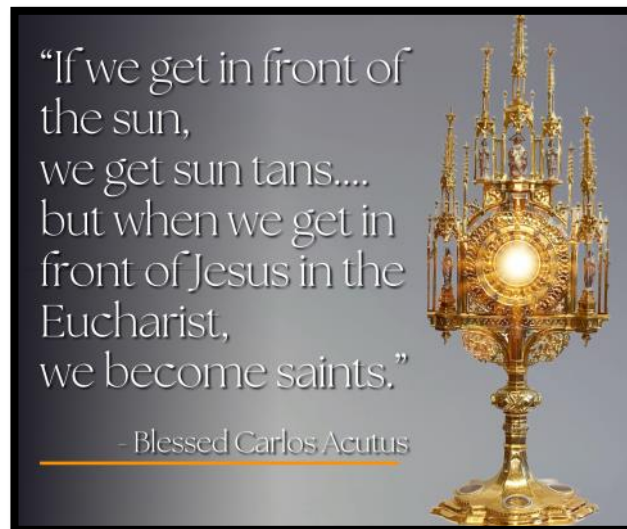

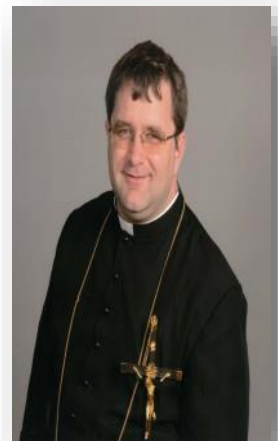

2 FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

The crowd was making it impossible for them even to eat. Today is my Anniversary of Priesthood Ordination and one of the memories that I have from ordination was that after the Ordination Mass pictures were taken. And while the pictures were being taken not all my invited guests needed to stay for the pictures. And there was a luncheon that followed the Ordination Mass, and some my guests could not stick around long so I instructed them to go to the luncheon and they could start eating before I got there and leave as they needed to. After all the pictures were taken, I got unvested and went to the luncheon and sat down to eat. As I was sitting down to eat many of my guests were finished eating and were ready to leave. As they were leaving, they wanted to greet/congratulate me before they left, and this made it a little impossible for me to eat lunch. This memory from my ordination not being able to eat, reminds me of what was happening with Jesus in our scriptures today. In our scriptures today we hear that Jesus has returned home. Where has Jesus returned home from? Our scriptures today pick up in middle of chapter 3 of Mark. In the first, 2 ½ chapters of Mark, Jesus has just begun his public ministry of preaching the kingdom of God, driving out demons, healing the sick and the crippled, and has called his disciples. And now Jesus returns home, his popularity is becoming known, and he is doing a lot of good. Crowds are gathering “making it impossible for them to eat” (Mark 3:20). In a certain sense in our scriptures today we get a glimpse into Jesus’s humanity. Jesus’s relatives hear about this and think that he is out of his mind, and they want to take him away so that he can eat and perhaps also get rest. It kind of reminds me of the Snicker’s commercial that suggests you are not yourself when you are hungry.

If it was recognized by Jesus’s relatives, in his humanity that he needed time to get away to eat and rest. In our humanity, in our limitations, and in all the good that we do, we have people in our lives that can recognize that when we are not ourselves and we need to get away so that we can also eat and rest and return to being our real selves. It is easy for us to be stubborn and not to want to listen to these voices. I must admit I can be good at this, I love the work that I do. But for the good that we do, I think it is important for us to listen to these voices that inviting us to get away and do what these voices are asking of us. For we are called to give our best in the work that we do, and we can only give of our best when we are at our best. God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. As we journey in these summer months may we find time to rest and recharge ourselves.

CATECHISM CORNER

What is a Catholic Devotion?

June is the month of the Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. So what is a devotion in the Catholic Church?

Devotions are manifestations of our profound love of God, rooted in worship and service to his Holy Name. As Catholics, it is our readiness to give honor and glory to God, whether in public or private prayer, or by performing some act of God's will, that exercises our own spirituality. Through prayer, our devotions reaffirm our total commitment to our Lord, Jesus Christ. And in return, we hope to obtain favors that only He can provide through his infinite mercy and blessings. – EWTN.com

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated throughout the world on the Friday following the Feast of Corpus Christi. Devotion to the wounded heart of Jesus has its origins in the 11th century, when pious Christians meditated on the Five Wounds of Christ. There grew up among the faithful prayers to the Sacred Heart, prayers of the Shoulder Wound of Christ – private devotions which helped Christians to focus on the passion and death of Christ, and thus grow in love for our Savior who had suffered and died for us.

The first priest to celebrate the Feast of the Sacred Heart was Fr. Jean Eudes in 1670 in France. Around the same time, a pious sister named Margaret Mary Alacoque began to report visions of Jesus. He appeared to her frequently and in 1673 he permitted Margaret Mary to rest her head upon his heart. He told her of his great love and explained that he had chosen her to make his love and goodness known to all.

The following year, Margaret Mary reported that Jesus wanted to be honored under the figure of His Heart of flesh. He asked the faithful to receive Him in the Eucharist frequently, especially on the First Friday of the month, and to observe a Holy Hour of devotion to Him. In 1675, she received a vision in which Jesus asked that the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated each year on the Friday following Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice which Christ had made for them.

While the devotion became popular after St. Margaret Mary's death, it was not an approved apparition until 1765, as the Church takes great care in approving such devotions. (*ncregister.com, Kathy Schiffer, June 19, 2020*)

The prayer of the Church venerates and honors the *Heart of Jesus* just as it invokes his most Holy Name. It adores the incarnate Word and his Heart which, out of love for men, he allowed to be pierced by our sins. Christian prayer loves to follow the way of the cross in the Savior's steps. – (Catechism #2669)

Jesus gave Margaret Mary 12 promises for those who consecrated themselves to the Sacred Heart of Jesus:

He will give them all the graces necessary in their state in life.

He will establish peace in their homes.

He will comfort them in all their afflictions.

He will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.

He will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.

Sinners will find in His Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.

Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.

Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.

He will bless every place in which an image of His Heart is exposed and honored.

He will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.

Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in His Heart.

In the excessive mercy of His Heart, His all-powerful love will grant to all those

who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in His disgrace, nor without receiving the Sacraments. His divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in the last moment.

CONTINUATION OF CATECHISM CORNER

The faithful shall live out the devotion following this formula:

- Receive Communion frequently.
- First Fridays: going to Confession and receiving the Eucharist on the first Friday of each month for nine consecutive months. Many parishes will offer public First Friday devotions; if they do, you must perform First Fridays publicly. If it isn't so offered in your parish, you can do this privately, going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist, and offering your prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father.
- Holy Hour: Eucharistic Adoration for one hour on Thursdays. Holy Hour can be made alone or as part of a group with formal prayers.
- Celebrating the Feast of the Sacred Heart

Blessed be the Most Loving Heart and Sweet Name of Our Lord Jesus Christ and the most glorious Virgin Mary, His Mother, in eternity and forever. Amen.

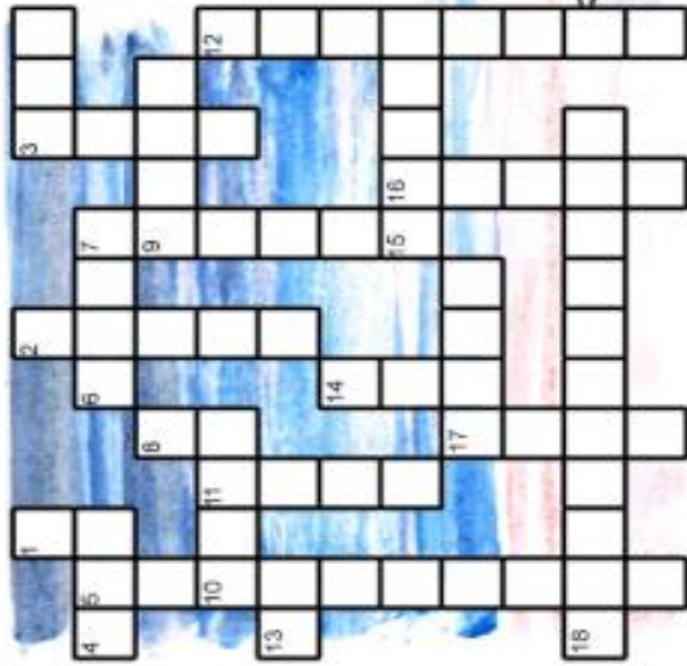
