

SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

"Can a blind person guide a blind person" (Luke 6:39). This is the question that Jesus posses to the disciples and us. And the answer to this question would seem to be rather obvious, no a blind person cannot guide another blind person. Jesus answers his own question and says that a blind person cannot guide a blind, he says that both would end falling into a pit.

We normally understand being blind to be someone that is not able to physically see, normally they cannot see people around them, books to read, etc. While they may not be able to see, I have always been fascinated by how they seem to navigate their lives and try to live normal



lives just like the rest of us. Growing up in Maria Stein there was a blind man named Gilbert, he would walk all around Maria Stein by himself and when I was in high school CCD my teacher was his niece, and she brought him into speak to our class. I remember he could count money by just simply feeling the bills. There are things that blind people can learn to do for themselves, but they also require some help, as Jesus indicates in our scriptures today. This our understanding of being blind and I will not deny this understanding of blindness.

But I would argue that this is not the only way to be blind, there are other ways to be blind, other ways of not being able to see. In a certain sense I think all of us possess some blindness in a certain sense, we navigate through our lives well and we can do some pretty amazing things. At the same time there are things that happen in our lives that we do not see and just like a blind person needs help, so they do not fall into a pit. Each one of us needs help in our lives so we do not follow into a pit as well.

For example, each one of us has gifts, strengths, and talents that we are good at, at the same time we also have challenges, weaknesses, and bad habits. Some of these talents and weaknesses we are aware of are the things we are good at we share so that we can help to make the world better. If we know something to be our weakness, we work at it to improve this aspect of our lives. Or we might know someone who is good at what we are not good at to help us. We might also have some talents and weaknesses that we do not know that we have but others see them in us. So, they might help us to become aware of what we are good at or might not be so good at something and secretly help us with our weaknesses.

Another example of when we are blind is in the aftermath of storms. Sometimes they are figurative and other times they are literal like here over the past several months with the storms that came through the Carolinas or the fires in California. These storms come through and destroy homes, businesses and lives. In the aftermath of this destruction this can leave people feeling blind not able to see clearly and unsure of where to turn. Our whole hog sausage breakfast this weekend put on by Outreach and the bake sale put on by our 8th Grade Students will be used help victims of these storms to journey through this blindness.

CATECHISM CORNER

Journey with our Catechumen and Candidates

This year in the OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) process, we have three individuals, one Catechumen and two candidates. The difference between a Catechumen and a Candidate is that a Catechumen will be baptized at the Easter Vigil, and a Candidate has already been baptized in some other Christian Church that uses the Trinitarian form of Baptism (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit), and now they are wishing to transfer their membership from the Christian Church they were baptized in, to the Catholic Church. Both a Catechumen and a Candidate go through similar but also different formation processes in becoming members of the Catholic Church.

On the first Sunday of Lent, March 9th, we will be celebrating the Rite of Sending for our Catechumen and Candidates. They will be going to Our Lady, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Cathedral to be presented to Bishop Thomas for the Rite of Election for our Catechumen and the Continuing Call to Conversion for our Candidates. In our country, when we have an election, after everyone has voted and the votes have been counted, and a winner has been determined, the winner does not automatically assume office right after the election. Rather, there is a time transition between the election and the time the winner officially takes office. During that time, that individual is referred to as being elect - chosen for the position. (Example: president-elect, senator-elect, governor-elect). Similarly, our Catechumen will go to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election and at the end of this rite, she will be officially elected, chosen to receive the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation. The Candidates will also be presented to the Bishop to be recognized for the progress they have made in growing in faith and to also encourage them to continue to grow as they journey through Lent and prepare to enter the Church at the Easter Vigil.

During the Season of Lent, the Elect (Catechumen) and Candidates are invited into a time of Purification and Enlightenment. As already baptized Catholics, we also are invited to join them in this journey during this time of purification and enlightenment because at Easter, we will renew our Baptismal Promises. The Elect (Catechumen) is called to participate in three Scrutinies on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent. Candidates can also participate in the three scrutinies. As a part of the scrutinies, the Church wants the Elect to hear the Year A Cycle readings (Woman at the Well, Recovery of the Sight of the Blind Man and the Raising of Lazarus) even during a non-Year A Cycle year. This year is actually the Year C cycle.

As part of our journey with our Elect (Catechumen) and Candidates this Lent, we are going to use the Year A Cycle Readings for the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent. During these weeks, the readings, particularly the gospels, tend to be relatively long but rich stories. In exchange for the relatively long readings, I plan to prepare relatively shorter homilies during these weeks, to make up for the longer gospels.



Week 1

INFO ON CONSECRATION TO MARY

What is consecration?

Consecration means "to make holy." God alone is holy, and only he can "make holy." When one makes an act of consecration, it is always made ultimately to God with the understanding that our consecration is a serious commitment on our part to respond faithfully to God's grace at work in our lives.

If God alone is holy, how can we consecrate ourselves to Mary?

An act of consecration to Mary is essentially an act of consecration to Jesus through Mary. As Pope John Paul II explained, "Consecrating ourselves to Mary means accepting her help to offer ourselves and the whole of mankind to him who is holy, infinitely holy; it means accepting her help—by having recourse to her motherly heart, which beneath the cross was opened to love for every human being, for the whole world—in order to offer the world, the individual human being, mankind as a whole, and all the nations to him who is infinitely holy" (May 13, 1982).

"Consecration to the Mother of God," says Pope Pius XII, "is a total gift of self, for the whole of life and for all eternity; and a gift which is not a mere formality or sentimentality, but effectual, comprising the full intensity of the Christian life – Marian life." This consecration, the Pope explained, "tends essentially to union with Jesus, under the guidance of Mary."
