

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DON

This weekend's readings will be part of the scrutiny's (Year A) used in lent when a parish has a catechumen being baptized on Easter Vigil. In these readings we see water used as a metaphor and to convey messages to the people of biblical times. In the first reading we see the Israelites journeying through the desert but they were not faithful to God in their worship and offerings, instead praying to false gods and images. In their



near sightedness and lack of faith, they started complaining about being thirsty. They had forgotten how God had led them out of slavery to the Egyptians and parted the Red Sea so they could escape. They had forgotten how God had fed them manna and quail in the desert when they were hungry. God commanded Moses to strike the rock so water would flow forth for the Israelites and their animals. The passing of the Israelites from the slavery of the Egyptians through the Red Sea and to freedom prefigures our modern-day Baptism. As we are baptized, we pass from the slavery of sin through the cleansing waters to make us a new creation; one of water and Spirit. Jesus told Nicodemus that "Unless you are born of the water and Spirit, you cannot enter into the Kingdom of Heaven." And through this baptism we receive the Holy Spirit as St. Paul tells us in the 2nd reading. When Jesus died on the cross and the lance was thrust into His side, water and blood poured forth. This also prefigures the Sacrament of Baptism. Water is also mentioned in the Gospel reading where Jesus tells the Samaritan woman that as long as she drinks from the well, she will always be thirsty. But if she drinks the living water that only Jesus can give, she will never thirst. This spring of water will well up to eternal life. Our hearts are like containers that will hold the eternal life and the sanctifying grace that Jesus gives us. Sometimes the lid of worldly possessions and desires covers this bowl and doesn't allow the living water to enter into it. We are free to choose whether

allow the living water to enter into it. We are free to choose whether we allow Jesus' living water to enter our hearts or allow our hearts to be so hardened that it will not let the sanctifying grace to penetrate it. I pray today that all of you search your lives to see what is interfering with your relationship with Jesus and to remove any lids that may be closing off your heart to the Kingdom of God. May God bless you and give you His living water.

CATECHISM CORNER

Lent: Prayer

Last week in the Catechism Corner, the Lenten pillar of almsgiving was discussed. The Lenten pillar focus this week is on prayer. A lot can be said about prayer, in fact the Catechism of the Catholic Church has an entire section devoted to prayer. (CCC, Part Four, starting at #2558)

Prayer can be likened to how friendships are formed and developed. A friendship may start by initiating small talk that offers opportunities to begin to know the basics about each other such as family, interests, or commonalities. As the friendship grows, the parties start to get to know the real person – their good qualities, along with their weaknesses. As the relationship develops, the more intimate the relationship becomes. Trust is developed where the parties know they can open their fears and hopes to each other. They can rely on the other to be there for them in times of need and in times of celebration. Sometimes, they understand each other so much they can finish each others thoughts. A true, deep relationship of love develops where the other is willing to make sacrifices for the other. True love wants the best for the other.

Keys to developing a friendship like this involve communicating, being attentive and listening to the other. If the communication stops, the relationship is severed.

This is how prayer works with God, and it is how we form a true loving, intimate and personal relationship with Him. God invites you to get to know him, and we respond to the invitation through prayer. Prayer is an opening your heart to God so that you can get to be His best friend, in which you develop an intimate relationship of mutual sacrifice, trust, and authentic love. Just as human relationships grow the more time and effort you invest in them, the same is true with your relationship with God through prayer.

Take the formulation of developing a human friendship correlated to how that relates to God with prayer. A friendship with God is initiated when you pray to get to know Him. He will answer in many unique ways, and then He will wait for you to respond. When we respond, we are letting God know that we need Him in our life and want to get to know Him. The friendship begins to grow each time we engage in prayer. Just as sacrifice is needed to make a human friendship grow, praying is sacrificing your time to God. For example, when you wake in the morning, you have a choice to say "Good morning, Lord" or just to go about your day on your own.

Prayer should encompass every day of our lives all year, but during the liturgical season of Lent, the Church encourages us to strive for a deeper relationship with God by a more intense prayer life. God speaks to each of us in our own unique ways, but here are some ways to possibly explore to deepen that relationship:

-Pre-written prayers. The Apostles asked Jesus to teach them how to pray, so He taught them the 'Our Father' (Luke 11: 1-4, Matthew 6:9-13)

-Scripture. God speaks directly to us through Scripture. Immerse yourself in the life of Christ. His whole life was a prayer! The apostles learned to pray by listening to and imitating Jesus.

-Talk. Just like talking to your friend doesn't require prescribed words, God wants you to talk to Him freely from your heart.

-Podcasts. There are many podcasts with insights to ponder about God with reflection questions to help you meditate on how He is trying to communicate with you.

-Silence. Listening is one of the most important parts of communication. God desires to speak to our hearts, but we can only hear Him in the silence. Intentionally find silence to sit and be in His presence.

There are many more ways to deepen your prayer life, so the topic of prayer will continue into next week's Catechism Corner. Try this week to take the challenge to find a new way to encounter Christ through prayer.



PARISH/FINACNE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Joint Parish and Finance Council Meeting Minutes February 11, 2025

- 1. Opening Prayer was offered by Fr. Matt Keller.
- 2. **Joint Parish and Finance Council Meeting Minutes** from January 14, 2025, were reviewed. Mary Ellen Klear made a motion to approve the minutes, Matt Bockrath seconded the motion. Motion passed.
- 3. Thank you to Parish Council and Finance Committee members, parish staff, and all who helped with our Eucharistic Day events. Your help is greatly appreciated!
- 4. Grounds Committee Updates:
 - a. Getting pricing and options from Glandorf Lumber for replacement doors to the cafeteria.
 - b. Researching new PA system for the parish center. Existing system does not function correctly and is very outdated. Will check into the speaker in the rectory as well.
 - c. Conrad Schmitt Studio repaired the inside plaster of the south window of the church. They were able to secure down the delamination vs removing and reapplying the section. May need additional repairs in a few years. Will monitor.
 - d. Continuing efforts to get quotes for replacing the church rain gutters and downspouts.
 - Question was raised as to if there are any national historical site refurbishment grants available.
 Will research.
 - e. Display cabinet in the parish center for a statue of St Teresa of the little flower has been built and installed with statue and plaques. Looks great! Thank you to all involved in this effort!
 - f. There was a water leak in the church rental house. Repair work is being completed.
 - g. Maintenance team is working on repairs needed for the west steeple light.
 - h. Glandorf FibOptics was asked about the capabilities to provide a catechesis feed to channel 3 to be able to watch things in the parish center such as speakers or presentations.
 - i. There is salt available in the janitor's closest in the back of church anytime the sidewalks are icy. Councils were asked to keep an eye out when weather is a concern during church activities.
- 5. Parish Center Usage A request was made to hold a summer basketball training camp. Will determine a fee schedule for these types of events. Waivers will be required for all participants.
- 6. New Business:
 - a. Parish Council Elections and Finance Committee openings coming up in April/May. Members were asked to recruit volunteers for both. Openings include 2 men, 2 women on Parish Council and 3 open seats on Finance Committee. Parish Council members are elected and Finance Committee members are appointed. Fr. Matt had the Junior class vote for HS representatives: Aubrey Leopold and Sam Warnecke were the top vote getters.
 - b. The Eucharistic Revival Committee/Adult Faith Group requested that the parish consider a Consecration to Mary. This will be provided as a Lenten Journey for the parish. We will follow the Lenten companion book "Walking to Jerusalem with Mary". Timing will be during lent with consecration scheduled on Tuesday or Wednesday of Holy Week.
 - c. The groups also requested to schedule Dr John Wood for a Parish Mission. Will schedule for next fall. Dr Wood has offered to contribute 50% of the free will collection to the cost of the 2nd grade Dragon Slayer Retreat next year.
 - d. Fr. Matt shared that information was provided by the diocese regarding potential visits from I.C.E. (immigration). It includes protocol for an event. This was shared with the parish and CCD staff as well as discussed with the public school.
- Closing prayer was offered by Mike Karhoff. Tara Gerding motioned to close the meeting, Doug Karhoff seconded, motion carried.
- 8. Finance Committee reviewed January financials and approved.

INFO ON CONSECRATION TO MARY

What about the Sacred Heart of Jesus?

The quickest way to the heart of Jesus is through the heart of Mary. The Church sees Mary not as the goal, but as the guide, who always leads souls who honor her with true devotion—to her Son, especially to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. When we pray to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for help in time of need, she in turn points to her son, who is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life," and has a way of conveying to us what she said to the steward at Cana: "Do whatever he tells you" (Jn. 2:5).

"Our act of consecration refers ultimately to the Heart of her Son," John Paul II said, "for as the Mother of Christ she is wholly united to his redemptive mission. As at the marriage feast of Cana, when she said 'Do whatever he tells you,' Mary directs all things to her Son, who answers our prayers and forgives our sins. Thus by dedicating ourselves to the Heart of Mary, we discover a sure way to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, symbol of the merciful love of our Savior" (Sept. 22, 1986).


Doesn't Marian devotion distract you from Christ?

Not according to Saint John Paul II, whose papal motto was "Totus Tuus" [Totally Yours], referring to Mary. He explains his motto in this way: "This phrase is not only an expression of piety, or simply an expression of devotion. It is more. During the Second World War, while I was employed as a factory worker, I came to be attracted to Marian devotion. At first, it had seemed to me that I should distance myself a bit from the Marian devotion of my childhood, in order to focus more on Christ. Thanks to Saint Louis de Montfort, I came to understand that true devotion to the Mother of God is actually Christocentric, indeed, it is very profoundly rooted in the Mystery of the Blessed Trinity, and the mysteries of the Incarnation and Redemption" ("Crossing the Threshold of Hope," 1994





JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE

PLENARY INDULGENCES

WHAT IS A PLENARY INDULGENCE? A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by

the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence applies to sins already forgiven. A plenary indulgence cleanses the soul as if the person had just been baptized. Plenary indulgences obtained during the Jubilee Year can also be applied to souls in purgatory with the possibility of obtaining two plenary indulgences for the deceased in one day, according to the Apostolic Penitentiary.

The Jubilee Indulgence is a special plenary indulgence available to the faithful during the Jubilee Year.

HOW TO GAIN A PLENARY INDULGENCE

This indulgence can be obtained given the completion of the ordinary conditions - through pilgrimages, pious visits to holy sites, or works of mercy and penance. To obtain an indulgence, the usual conditions of detachment from all sin, sacramental confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope must be met.

Make a pious pilgrimage to one of the designated pilgrimage sites

A pious visit includes spending a "suitable" amount of time during a prayerful visit in Eucharistic adoration, either in exposition or before the tabernacle, meditation, and concluding with <u>praying for the intentions of Pope Francis</u>, the recitation of the Our Father, any legitimate form of the Creed, and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Ordinary conditions for plenary indulgence

To obtain any of the plenary indulgences the following conditions must be fulfilled:

- Detachment from all sin, even venial.
- Sacramental confession, holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope. These three conditions can be fulfilled a few days before or after performing the works to gain the indulgence, but it is appropriate that Communion and the prayer take place on the same day that the work is completed.
- A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but frequent sacramental
 confession is encouraged to obtain the grace of deeper conversion and purity of heart.
- For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.
- The prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father is left up to the choice of the individual, but an Our Father and Hail Mary are suggested.

Democrats, Republicans, and Independents seemingly live in separate and divided worlds and the pandemic has deepened this divide. But political disagreements are important for a healthy democracy.

The problem is that the political divisions are limiting our ability to function effectively as a country. People tend to trust and associate only with people on their side which has intensified the division between the two parties.

A Pew Research Study in October 2019 found a majority of respondents wanted less divisiveness and more cooperation. 




