

Today is the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent and the 4th Sunday of Lent is also called Laetare Sunday. Laetare is Latin word that calls for us to rejoice. We rejoice today because we have reached the middle of Lent three weeks in and three weeks before Easter. Like the Third Sunday of Advent today I get the privilege of wearing Rose Vestments and just like rose vestments call for us to rejoice then rose vestments call for us to rejoice then rose vestments call for us to rejoice today.

In our scriptures today we hear a story that would seem to give the people a reason to rejoice and celebrate Jesus cures a man of his blindness, he was blind all his life and now he can see. But rather than rejoicing and celebrating there is controversary. At surface level I think the controversary is that Jesus cured this blind man on a Sabbath and Jesus was not supposed to do this on a Sabbath. But below the surface I do not think the controversary is that Jesus did this on the Sabbath. The controversary is that this blind man was a sinner but now he can see, and sin gone but the people do not want to accept the fact that he has changed.

Three weeks ago, when we began Season of Lent, we chose to discipline ourselves by fasting from candy, pop, snacks, etc. We are disciplining ourselves by praying, perhaps by making time for Adoration, participating in our parish Mary Consecration, or perhaps you might be praying as a family. We have also been discipling ourselves by giving alms our CCD program collecting coins for Good Grief Fun Camp. And it is through following this discipline that our hearts and lives are changing, perhaps you might even see the change happening. Our elect and candidates as they are in this final preparation before entering the church at Easter their hearts and lives are changing. As we are going through this change like with the blind man there is

controversary and resistance to this change. Like with the blind man it might be the people around us that do not want us to change or try to keep us where we were. Other times I can stand in the way of allowing my heart and life to change. Yet it is when we get out of our God's way and ignore the voices around us. That Jesus removes our blindness, we are able to see, and hearts and lives are changed.

# CATECHISM CORNER

### Lent: Prayer, cont.

Last week in the Catechism Corner, the Lenten pillar of prayer was discussed, as likened to developing a human friendship. This discussion on prayer continues this week, as much can be said about this topic.

In the beginning of Creation, man communed easily with God. However, after the Fall of Adam and Eve, prayer, along with everything else, became challenging. Scripture tells us, Adam used to "walk in the Garden with God" and so we can presume prayer came naturally. Once sin entered our human state, prayer no longer comes naturally. It now takes work that requires the grace of God and a humble heart to pray, and then the virtue of perseverance to grow in it.

To learn how to pray, we must begin by praying. Pope Benedict said, "If you do not know how to pray, ask Jesus to teach you, and ask your heavenly Mother to pray with you and for you." The Apostles didn't know how to pray and asked Jesus to teach them how. He taught them the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father, which is the path that leads directly to the Father's heart. Mary brought the rosary with her each time she came to earth in an apparition. Praying the rosary will bring you directly to the heart of her Son.

Not only do we lean on Mary, Jesus and the Father to guide us in prayer, but also the Holy Spirit. Romans 8:26 tells us, "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words." When Jesus ascended into heaven, He promised One would come to be with us. The Holy Spirit searches our hearts and guides us to relay to Christ what is hidden there. Romans 8:27 goes on to say, "And he who searches the hearts of men know it is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God."

There are many ways to pray that can be categorized into 5 main types.

1 – <u>Blessing and Adoration</u>: A blessing is a prayer that calls down God's grace upon us or others, or even objects. The root word of Adoration is 'adore' – a deep love or respect. Usually in the Catholic Church, believers sit before the Blessed Sacrament in adoration. It's an exchange of love between the believer and Creator. It is common to see believers down on both knees, or laying prostrate, in adoration as a reminder of the greatness of God and how little we are.

2 – <u>Prayer of Petition</u>: Prayer purifies your heart, makes it possible to resist temptations, strengthens us in our weakness, removes fear, increases energy and gives a second wind. (*from YouCat 470*). Therefore, pray from your heart. Turn to God in times of need, cry out to Him, implore His mercy, call on Him. God knows what you need, but wants you to ask. He desires that communication with you. Matthew 7:11, "If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask Him!"

**3** – <u>Prayer of Intercession</u>: Since God is our Father, we are all sons and daughters. That makes all Christians family. When our family is in need, we are to take care of them. It is appropriate to ask God to help others who are in need. Just as we here on earth pray for others in need, we can also ask the saints in heaven to pray to God for our needs here on earth. Saints are fully alive in heaven, next to the throne of God. They are in full communion with Him. They no longer have any sin on them that separates them from Him – as we do on earth. That is why they are great to ask prayers of intercession for us.

4 – <u>Prayers of Thanksgiving:</u> Everything we have is a gift from God, even each breath we take. We are transformed and redeemed by Jesus, and so from the depths of our hearts we should be grateful to God. Just like we show gratitude to our human friends and neighbors, God is also deserving of our gratitude. As our Father, He likes to hear His children thank Him. A challenge to consider – sit for one hour before the Blessed Sacrament and spend each moment thinking of and telling God 'Thank You' for... at the end of that hour you'll find you need more time.

5 – <u>Prayer of Praise:</u> God is all good. He is all love. He is all forgiving. He is all mercy. He is omnipotent (everywhere). His is creative. He is generous. He is joy. He is peace. What is he *not*? He is deserving of all praise. We should offer spontaneous prayers of praise to show God how he delights us and we rejoice in our hearts because of Him.

Due to our human weakness, prayer can be a struggle. You can wonder if you are "doing it right". While there is no 'right way' to pray, a self-evaluation can help you see what can be changed to help the relationship grow. If your prayers have become a check list or to do list, perhaps it's time to switch up how you pray. The way you pray should evolve as your relationship evolves. God is pleased with our efforts, even if you don't 'feel' anything. Trust with the time you give to God in prayer, He IS doing something incredible in you. Trust that with each prayer, you are growing to be more in union with Him. Persevere in prayer and the rewards will be great. "Pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people." Ephesians 6:18



# JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE PLENARY INDULGENCES

# WHAT IS A PLENARY INDULGENCE? A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by

the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence applies to sins already forgiven. A plenary indulgence cleanses the soul as if the person had just been baptized. Plenary indulgences obtained during the Jubilee Year can also be applied to souls in purgatory with the possibility of obtaining two plenary indulgences for the deceased in one day, according to the Apostolic Penitentiary.

The Jubilee Indulgence is a special plenary indulgence available to the faithful during the Jubilee Year.

# **HOW TO GAIN A PLENARY INDULGENCE**

This indulgence can be obtained given the completion of the ordinary conditions - through pilgrimages, pious visits to holy sites, or works of mercy and penance. To obtain an indulgence, the usual conditions of detachment from all sin, sacramental confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope must be met.

### Make a pious pilgrimage to one of the designated pilgrimage sites

A pious visit includes spending a "suitable" amount of time during a prayerful visit in Eucharistic adoration, either in exposition or before the tabernacle, meditation, and concluding with praying for the intentions of Pope Francis, the recitation of the Our Father, any legitimate form of the Creed, and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

### Ordinary conditions for plenary indulgence

To obtain any of the plenary indulgences the following conditions must be fulfilled:

Detachment from all sin, even venial.

to the reception of the Jubilee Indulgence.

- Sacramental confession, holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope. These three conditions can be fulfilled a few days before or after performing the works to gain the indulgence, but it is appropriate that Communion and the prayer take place on the same day that the work is completed.
- A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but frequent sacramental confession is encouraged to obtain the grace of deeper conversion and purity of heart.
- For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.
- The prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father is left up to the choice of the individual, but an Our Father and Hail Mary are suggested.

God is waiting to forgive us too, in the sacrament of Confession. He wants us to be sorry for our sins and tell Him we are sorry so He can take them away.


