

# FROM THE DESK OF Fr. Matt

"Peace I leave with you, my peace I give you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you" (14:27). These are the words that we hear Jesus echo in our scriptures and these same words we hear echoed at Mass in between the Our Father and the Sign of Peace. We hear Jesus speak about giving us his peace in our scriptures and how appropriate for Jesus to talk about giving us his peace on Memorial Day Weekend when we remember those men and women who died in service to our country. This weekend, amid



everything that is going on an ordination, a First Mass, graduation exercises and parties, cookouts, and the unofficial start of summer we are called to pray for peace. We are called to seek for the peace that Jesus wants to give us.

Jesus speaks to us about giving us his peace but what is Jesus's peace that he speaks about wanting to give us? We often understand peace as being the absence of violence, or we might say peace is the opposite of violence, and we say if you do not have violence, you have peace. While there would seem to be a parallel between no violence and peace, this logic is circular and not entirely true. You can have no violence and not have peace. A person with 'superior power' can impose their power and control their subjects to keep violence from happening, while the violence might be suppressed there really is not true peace. Or we might have no form of violence going on around us, and we sense that the Lord is calling us to action, and we will not have peace until we respond. Or perhaps we had a big disagreement with someone and perhaps at the end of the disagreement things did not end well and our hearts do not have peace until we apologize, or we hear an apology. Jesus speaks of giving us his peace and Jesus's peace means the absence of violence. But more importantly the peace that Jesus wants to give us means that we are in right relationship with God, others, and ourselves. For it is only in these right relationships that we have true peace and disturbance in any of the relationships we do not have peace. In our scriptures today we hear of the disturbance of peace as the church was beginning, do

they need to follow Mosaic practice? It is from this question we have the first church council, the Council of Jerusalem. It was decided at this council what they needed to do to be right relationship is they needed "to abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood from strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage" (15:29) it is in doing that they will have peace.



Like the early church experiencing its disturbance of peace, we can also experience our disturbance of peace. Like the early church may we too seek ways of settling the disturbance we are experiencing and obtain that peace that we desire.

## INITIATION OF ADULTS INTO THE CATHOLIC FAITH (RCIA/OCIA)

In response to their inquiries, these people are properly instructed so that you can discern (through reflection and prayer) whether you are indeed called to Catholicism. ## CATECHISM CORNER

Holy Orders: "Here I Am, Send Me." (Isaiah 6:8)

A Sacrament is a visible sign of God's presence, God's activity in our lives, in the Church and in our world. But it goes beyond that! Sacraments not only show us what God is like and what God dreams for us; Sacraments also make that happen!

"Holy Orders is the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church until the end of time: thus, it is the sacrament of apostolic ministry. It includes three degrees: episcopate (the Order of Bishops), presbyterate (the Order of Priests), and diaconate (the Order of Deacons). Diaconate Deacons may be either Permanent (ordained to service as a deacon for life) or Transitional (ordained to service as a deacon as a step on the path to priesthood). Catechism of the Catholic Church 1536

Today the word "ordination" is reserved for the sacramental act which integrates a man into the order of bishops, presbyters, or deacons, and goes beyond a simple election, designation, delegation, or institution by the community, for it confers a gift of the Holy Spirit that permits the exercise of a "sacred power" which can come only from Christ himself through his Church. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1538)

Ordination involves the laying on of hands by the bishop, along with a prayer of consecration. These constitute the visible signs of ordination.

The whole Church is a priestly people. Through Baptism all the faithful share in the priesthood of Christ. This participation is called the "common priesthood of the faithful." Based on this common priesthood and ordered

to its service, there exists another participation in the mission of Christ: the ministry conferred by the sacrament of Holy Orders, where the task is to serve in the name and in the person of Christ the Head in the midst of the community. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1591)

The ministerial priesthood differs in essence from the common priesthood of the faithful because it confers a sacred power for the service of the faithful. The ordained ministers exercise their service for the People of God by teaching, divine worship and pastoral governance. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1592)

From the moment of Jesus' conception in the womb of Mary until his Resurrection, he was filled with the Holy Spirit. In biblical language, he was anointed by the Holy Spirit and thus established by God the Father as our high priest. As Risen Lord, he remains our high priest. . . While all the baptized share in Christ's priesthood, the ministerial priesthood shares this through the Sacrament of Holy Orders in a special way.

Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Those who seek priesthood respond generously to God's call using the words of the prophet, "Here I am, send me" (Is 6:8).



## PRIESTHOOD ORDINATION



Father Travis Kahle, Father Eric Kaufman, and Father Kevin McGraw were ordained to the priesthood on Saturday, May 24, 2025. Meet the newest priests of the Diocese of Toledo!



## Father Travis Kahle

My name is Father Travis Kahle and my home parish is St. Mary's in Bluffton. I grew up in a Catholic household and am the oldest of three siblings. I graduated from Pandora-Gilboa High School in 2005 and studied Philosophy at St. Joseph's College (IN). After college I spent a few years in Columbus, OH working a few different jobs including as a musician.

In 2014, I returned home to help care for my father in his last year battling with ALS. During this time, I experienced a reinvigoration of my faith life and began seriously discerning the priesthood. I completed an MA in Healthcare Mission Leadership from Loyola University Chicago and got some experience with hospital chaplaincy at Mercy Health in Lima while also leading the high school youth ministry at my home parish. I began my seminary studies in Cincinnati in 2018 and God has blessed me immensely since then. I am so grateful to our Lord for the great gift of calling me to this vocation and to our diocese for supporting me in my formation. The many prayers of the faithful in our diocese who love and support the priesthood have won for me much grace and help along my journey. Blessed Mother, intercede for us and draw us closer to the heart of our savior Jesus Christ!



## Father Eric Kaufman

My name is Father Eric Kaufman, and my home parish is St. John the Baptist in Glandorf. From an early age a strong work ethic, caring for others, and a spirit of volunteerism in giving back for the greater good was instilled in me. It was these values, along with the love from family and the community, and the physical and spiritual beauty of the Catholic faith, that helped my Catholic faith and love for Christ grow.

After graduating high school and then receiving a degree in Computer Aided Design (CAD), I started working for PRO-TEC Coating Company in Leipsic. It was then, in my twenties that I gave back even more to the parish and community. From serving on Parish Council, heading our parish capital campaign committee, the parish history committee, and the liturgical decorating group, to being a member of the Ottawa-Glandorf Jaycees, Glandorf Lions Club, and serving on the Glandorf Village Council for four and a half years, until I entered the seminary at the age of thirty.

Now, after almost seven years, my time of initial priestly formation is almost over. Throughout my time in discernment and formation, Mary, especially under her title of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, has had an amazing impact on my spiritual life in leading me closer to her son, and it is Jesus then who has led me to the vocation and mission that he has for me. For I always keep in mind the last words of Mary, recorded in the scriptures to the servants at the Wedding at Cana. "Do whatever he tells you." (John 2:5) Reminding all of us to always listen to the Lord and do whatever he tells us.



## Father Kevin McGraw

Hello! I am from Elida, Ohio and my home parish is St. Charles Borromeo in Lima. My parents are Tom and Kathy McGraw. My brother Ryan, his wife Jill, my niece Rori, and another child in the womb live in Delaware, Ohio. My brother and I's oldest sibling died prior to birth and, please God, is in heaven.

I went to Elida Local Schools through high school, graduating in 2006. I attended BGSU (Class of 2011) and while there, having fallen out of even a minimal practice of the Faith, I had an encounter with Jesus Christ through the campus ministry of St. Thomas More University Parish and Newman Center, and the Lord transformed my life. I grew in love and in zeal for Christ and His Church.






