# FROM THE DESK OF DEACON ERIC

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. We celebrate our God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, three separate distinct persons, yet one God. This is one of the great mysteries of our faith. Throughout the course of our church's history, we have theologians that have tried to explain how this great mystery of our faith works. At times their explanations can seem to be quite profound, amazing, complicated, confusing, and hard to understand all at the same time. I think it is important for us to try to understand and study this teaching. At the same time, I think it is important that we do not get all bogged down on understanding the Most Holy Trinity but focus more on the importance of believing in the Most Holy Trinity, being in relationship with the Most Holy Trinity and giving praise to the Most Holy Trinity. As we focus on our belief, the relationship, and giving our praise to the Most Holy Trinity we gain understanding we seek.

Our scriptures today invite us to focus on this relationship aspect. Our scriptures today invite us to focus particularly that we have a unique relationship with our God. Moses in speaking to the Israelites and Paul in writing to the Romans are both addressing people that live in a polytheistic (multiple god) culture/world and in their address, they say that our God is unique in our relationship with us. Moses asks the Israelites did anyone ever hear the voice of God speak from fire and live? "Or did any god venture to go and take a nation for himself from the midst of another nation, by testings, by signs and wonders by war, with his strong hand outstretched arm, and by great terrors, all of which the LORD, your God, did for you in Egypt before your very eyes?" (Deuteronomy 4:34). Moses points out to the Israelites the great things God has done for them in freeing the from slavery in Egypt and no other god has done similar for a nation. Paul in writing to the Romans tells them that they are children of God. Paul uses the phrase "Abba Father" to speak of our relationship with God. Jesus in the gospel often uses this same phrase "Abba Father" when he speaks to God. Us living in 2024 can easily overlook the significance of endearment of this phrase "Abba Father" quite literally it means to be saying "God is Jesus daddy, God is our daddy," God's relationship to us is like that of a parent. To refer to God's relationship to us a parent relationship for some might be difficult for some who have less than and ideal relationship parents. But God's relationship to us is that ideal parent relationship.

Moses and Paul in scriptures today speak of a unique relationship with God. We have a unique relationship with God and Jesus in our scriptures today speaks of the unique relationship. After Jesus commissions us to baptize, Jesus tells us "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). Our God is always there with us, our God never leaves or abandons us from time to time I think we need to be reminded of this. Particularly those moments in life when life becomes a challenge, God is there with us. Just as we feel that soft gentle pulse below our necks, that is how close our God is to us.

### CATECHISM CORNER

The Work of Mercy we will look at this week is:

#### *Spiritual Work of Mercy: Forgive Offenses Willingly from "The Works of Mercy Explained" by Silvia Vecchini*

"But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have?" Matthew 5: 44-46

Jesus' teaching urges us to be like God. In fact Jesus says, "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven..." (Luke 6: 36-37)

As God's children we are called to forgive and to be like God who is full of mercy.

The fifth spiritual work of mercy highlights one of the most important of Jesus' teachings: loving one's enemies by forgiving those who have offended us.

Every time we pray the Our Father, we ask God to "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." With this phrase we ask God to forgive us for what we have done and what we have failed to do. We also tell God, however, that we will do the same by forgiving our neighbors when they harm us. The forgiveness we receive from God is a gift that we ought to be quick to pass on to our neighbor. We cannot keep forgiveness to ourselves.

<u>Virtue / Character Development:</u> GENEROSITY overflows to others most deeply in mercy. God fills us with His love despite our sins, and this should move us to pour out His gifts on all those around us without counting the cost. We are more able to forgive others when we live in GRATITUDE for God's many gifts. The grateful person who can see all that God has done for him is too joyful to hold onto any injury. He trusts that God will restore whatever he has lost.

Action Ideas: Write a letter of forgiveness to someone who has hurt you. If you cannot send it, as Christ Jesus to have mercy on you both and then throw it out. • If you were mean to someone, admit that you were and ask the person to forgive you. • Get into the habit of saying the words "I forgive you" when someone apologizes. • Make a list of your "enemies." Then, everyday, say a prayer for them. • Learn to review your day before going to bed: recall the ways God showed you his love that day as well as the ways you failed to love like God. Remembering God's mercy each night helps us to be merciful. • Say "I am sorry." Be the first to apologize. • Go to confession.

#### Joint Parish and Finance Council Meeting Minutes

Opening Prayer was offered by Fr. Matt Keller.

Joint Parish and Finance Council Meeting Minutes from March 12, 2024, were reviewed. Curtis Miller made a motion to approve the minutes, Kelly Morman seconded the motion. Motion passed. Grounds Committee Updates:

1. Waiting on pricing for painting the ceiling, seats, and rails. Will update once pricing is received.

2. BoDeck roofing provide quotes for repairs and replacement of sections of the parish council roof. Planning to go ahead with the repair to the divider wall from the 87 addition to the main section ~\$4,500. Joe is reviewing the main section of the roof and creating division points to replace a portion each year to spread out cost. Estimate came in at \$10/sq. ft. Will be reviewed at the next Grounds Committee meeting.

3. Will be adding the basement room (scout room/tornado shelter) to the Parish Center carpet project. Target is late May or July to work on carpet replacement.

**Parish Rental House Update:** Making good progress on the interior. Discussed pricing for rental agreement. Councils voted on charging \$1075/month minus \$75/month to cover the cost of the steeple light that is part of the electrical. Vote passed. Carl to look at relocating the outdoor A/C unit or possible replacement. Target is to allow tenants to move in in June.

**Blanchard Ave. Access Discussion:** Mike shared that Elton and Jeanette are discerning how to start small as requested by the councils. A Letter of Intent to provide driveway access is being drafted and expected to be sent to council members for review soon.

New Business:

Parish Council Elections: Intend to have ballots ready to vote on new Parish Council members this weekend at all Masses. Ashley has a list of potential clients for the ballot.

Jenny Warnecke was hired as the new high school CCD coordinator The survey has been completed for the parish property related to an easement for Giesken Holdings. The easement document has been drafted and reviewed. It is submitted to the Bishops office. Ottoville Hardware will visit soon to look at the church carpet and get measurements. Want to get a budget price and discuss timing for the work to begin the planning discussion. The thought is to schedule in 2025 or 2026.

Fr. Matt shared that there will be chalk art and other activities coming up related to Corpse Christi on June 1/2. Also shared that first communion is scheduled for afternoon mass on May 5. Bryan asked if we can find volunteers for ushers at that mass.

Discussed collection from special envelopes that are provided to parishioners. The collection amount for these special envelopes is rather low.

#### **Next Meeting** will be <u>May 14, 2024 at 6:30 p.m. in the Parish</u> <u>Center Cafeteria.</u> The new Parish Council members will be invited to attend. We will also be holding elections for positions for both councils. We intend to follow the schedule for the meeting the second Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m.
