Have you ever received a warm fuzzy?

I would imagine that when many of you think of a warm fuzzy, you might think of that little piece of lint or loose piece of thread that might stick to your clothing and other times you might find these fuzzy things get stuck to your body, particularly places where there might be a lot of static for example in your hair. When we find these fuzzies on our person, they are an annoyance, and we get rid of them typically by just brushing them off.

This is not exactly the kind of warm fuzzies I am talking about. Thinking of warm fuzzies, I am thinking of are those compliments that you receive for doing something that would seem to be small not important. When someone says something good about you that makes you feel good on the inside. I think all of us have been on the receiving end of a warm fuzzy of this type at least once in our lives, if truth be told you have probably gotten warm fuzzies of this type many of time, and sometimes we can treat them like we would that piece of lint or thread just brush it off as not being important. It is unfortunate that we treat these warm fuzzies as not being important, because these warm fuzzies make us feel good, make us feel important, they make a difference in our lives, and they are important because we tend to like them, they can be just that thing we need at the time we receive them.

Our scriptures today remind me of a warm fuzzy. Our scriptures today speak of love and at surface level the way our scriptures speak of love, they give us that warm fuzzy feeling on the inside. We hear the words "let us love one another, because love is of God" (1 John 4:7) and Jesus says to "As the Father loves me so I also love you. Remain in my love" (John 15:9). But our scriptures today are meant to do more than just give us that warm fuzzy feeling on the inside. Below the surface of this talk about love, it is meant to do more than just make us feel good, we are instructed to love one another, the way that Jesus loves us. How does Jesus love us? When we talk about a measurement of love we might say "my love for you is as deep as the ocean or as high as the highest mountains". This measurement of love sounds good and at the same time fake. Jesus gives us a different measurement of love, he says in our scriptures today "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's live for one's friend" (John 15:13). This

also sounds good and can seem to be fake as well. But when Jesus speaks of laying his life down for a friend, Jesus did just that, at the cross Jesus gave up his life for his friends, Jesus gave up his life for us, it is more than just a warm fuzzy feeling. Jesus's love for us is what it says it is.

Just as Jesus's love for us is more than a warm fuzzy feeling but is a true love he gave his life for us. The love we are called to have is more than just a warm fuzzy feeling. Our love is meant to be like Jesus's, willing to lay down our life for friend. Do you have this kind of love?

CATECHTSM CORNER

The Work of Mercy we will look at this week is:

Spiritual Work of Mercy: Admonish the Sinner from "The Works of Mercy Explained" by Silvia Vecchini

"Hear, O people, while I admonish you; O Israel, if you would but listen to me!" Psalm 81:8

"Admonish" means "to advise, to encourage, a person, or to warn against danger." Admonishing sinners is about taking care of one another and not turning a blind eye if we see someone close to us take the wrong road. It's not easy because we must be careful not to express condemnation or judgement. A warning must be given with love and for the good of the person. And, we must always keep in mind that we are sinners, too. Still it is an important work of mercy; true friends help each other to be good. Furthermore, warning others about danger is an act of true affection.

To admonish the sinner is an act of calling others to conversion and encouraging them in pursuit of holiness.

Virtue / Character Development: For admonishing a sinner to be truly a work of mercy, we must be humble. The virtue of HUMILITY prevents us from judging others, knowing that without grace, we would fall into serious sin, and that, in the eyes of God, our own sins and resistance to grace may be far worse.

Saintly Inspiration: St. John the Baptist, when the tax collectors and sinners came to him, spoke to them with gentleness but also directness. They asked him what they should do, and he admonished them with kindness to turn from their lives of sin. His harshest words were directed toward those whose repentance was just for outward show: the Scribes and Pharisees.

Action Ideas: Examine your conscience. Are you too comfortable, and tempted to justify a particular behavior? - Live your convictions. Actions speak louder than words. - Be mindful of your behavior online. Is that post designed to improve your image...and leave others feeling bad? - Show kindness to those who do things you know are wrong. -Commit to not gossiping about others. Stop an uncharitable conversation or walk away. -

After prayer, privately confront a friend about harmful or sinful behaviors, choosing the time, place, and words carefully. - Bear witness to the joy of living as a disciple of Christ by your cheerfulness and compassion. – When angry: pray, think, then speak. – Be receptive to a person who admonishes you.
