

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Today we celebrate All Souls a day of praying All the Faithful Departed. Today is about praying for all those who have died. Today as we pray for those who have died, I think the first people that we think of praying for are those who were closest to us family members, close friends, and significant role models in our lives. We particularly pray and remember today those who have recently died over the last year. But today as we pray and remember those who died, I think it also important for us to pray for those who died whose names we do not remember or may have forgotten. Hence today we pray for all the faithful departed.

My community the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, has a calendar or a book called a Necrology which list each of our members death dates. Br. Jerry Schule, C.PP.S. was my first formation director when I entered seminary, and he taught me a lot of valuable lessons. One lesson that he taught me was to pray for our members on their death anniversary. I must admit at first I struggled with this idea I mean priests and brothers with Italian, Polish, Tanzanian, and cultures names can be hard to pronounce and remembering the death anniversaries of priests and brothers who died 25, 50, 75, or 100 years ago, priests and brothers, people do not remember any more or would seem to be important is a little strange. Despite the challenge, I think Br. Jerry is right, these names deserved to be remembered by name and prayed for. As we pray today for those who have died, I think today it also important for us to pray and walk with those who are mourning the death of someone close to them. Because when we experience the death of someone that was close to us it leaves us feeling wounded. And anytime we have a wound, that wound requires care. If I get a cut on my hand, I care for that wound by washing it, bandaging it, and sometimes I might put ointment on it or even get it stitched back together. And it is from this care and time that the wound heals. The wound may heal but sometimes a scare can remain.

When we get wounded by the death of someone close to us how do we care for this wound? Sharing stories and memories and ways the person that died touched our lives or even telling the story of the death begins to help us to heal. We might participate and/or organize rituals like at the 10:30 Mass this weekend we will read the names of whose funerals we celebrated here over

the past year. We come together with other family members and friends that share our grief. We read scripture and it can give us comfort and hope today we hear the words "The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them" (Wisdom 3:1). We do this and many other things when we experience the wound of the death of someone close to us and the wound heals. Note that the wound heals because a scare remains, the reality that the person has died remains. Our faith does not change reality of death, but faith gives us hope. Faith gives us the gift of the Mass, for it is at Mass that heaven and earth unite as we sing in the Holy, Holy "heaven and earth are full of your glory". At Mass with our loved ones who have passed until we unite around the heavenly table.



Catechism Corner

COMMUNION OF SAINTS, A COMMUNION OF LOVE

November is a month to pray for the faithful departed and contemplate the body of Christ and the life of the world to come. This is the month when the Catholic faithful especially pray at cemeteries and in general for the faithful departed. November also includes the celebration of All Saints Day and the Solemnity of Christ the King, which make it also a month for contemplating the body of Christ in its members, the saints, whether they are part of the earthly kingdom of God or its heavenly fulfillment.

The body of Christ is composed of the "Church militant" on earth, the "Church suffering (or penitent)" in Purgatory and the "Church triumphant" in heaven. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches that the Church comprises three states: "When the Lord comes in glory, and all His angels with Him, death will be no more and all things will be subject to Him. But at the present time some of His disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory, contemplating 'in full light, God Himself triune and one, exactly as He is." (CCC 954) All three "churches" are one in their activity of prayer and virtue and, above all, in their Head. Christ has only one mystical body, and its unity is more real than we sometimes realize.

So it is that we pray for one another. Those in the Church suffering (purgatory), however are unable to pray for themselves. Since we all belong to one body of Christ, those in the Church triumphant and Church militant take up the task to pray for those who cannot. In turn, when victory is won, those who rise from suffering into eternal glory then join the triumphant to pray for the suffering and militant. This is the communion of saints; it is a communion of love.

How do we pray for the deceased? A common way is by having a Mass offered for them, which is a practice that has been observed since the time of the early Church. To do this, contact the parish rectory. Another way is in personal prayer to ask God to have mercy on them and grant them the grace of purification. The Church recommends offering almsgiving, indulgences, and acts of penance on behalf of the dead.

A common prayer is: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen".

We are not alone. As CCC 954 assures us: "We all sing the one hymn of glory to our God. All, indeed, who are of Christ and who have His Spirit form one Church and in Christ cleave together." Alleluia!

AROUND THE AREA

Why do Catholics celebrate All Soul's Day?

The Church is composed of the faithful living upon the earth and those who have gone before us. The latter includes the saints in Heaven and the faithful souls being purified in Purgatory. Just as on November 1 we honor those who are with God, on November 2 Catholics celebrate a Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. Also known as All Souls' Day, on this day we honor them for their fidelity in life, as well as pray for them since they are being purified before entering the All Holy Presence of God. As Revelation 21:27 says of the Heavenly Jerusalem, "... nothing unclean shall enter in."

What is the origin of All Souls' Day?

The Church had an early practice of remembering the souls of the departed in the Mass. This included inscribing their names on tablets. A version of this is in every Mass today, in the prayer for the faithful departed in Christ known as the Memento of the Dead, as well as in the practice of offering Mass for individuals. The celebration of a special day began in some monasteries in the sixth century and by the tenth century spread to dioceses, becoming fixed in some places to November 2, the day after All Saints' Day. This date was itself adopted in Rome in the 13th century.

What does one do on All Souls' Day?

Even though this is not a Holy Day of Obligation, it is a good idea to attend Mass on All Souls' Day. Also, the day should be spent, at least in part, in prayer for the souls of our loved ones, as well as those who have no one who will pray for them.

It is an honored custom, as well, to visit the graves of our deceased on this day, both to pray at the place where their bodies, hallowed in life by the Sacraments, await the General Resurrection and to leave some mark of esteem, such as flowers, to adorn their graves.

How do you receive the indulgence on All Souls' Day?

During November, the Church provides opportunities for Catholics to obtain plenary indulgences for the holy souls, in the hope of satisfying all of the temporal guilt for which they are suffering. The work, or act to be done, includes visiting a church on All Souls' Day and praying for the Poor Souls, by at least the Creed and an Our Father, or, during the second to the eighth of November, visiting a cemetery and praying for the Poor Souls.

For either of these indulgences, the normal conditions apply for receiving any indulgence: being a Catholic in the state of grace, going to Confession (within 20 days before or after), receiving the Eucharist, preferably on that day, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father. If the person seeking the Plenary Indulgence is completely detached from all sin, full remission is obtained. A defect in this detachment still obtains a partial remission or indulgence.

The Church allows only one Plenary Indulgence per day. However, there is no limit to the Partial Indulgences that can be obtained each day, and there are many ways to obtain them. In addition to specific acts to which the Church has attached a Plenary or Partial Indulgence, Pope St. Paul VI also established three general grants. Any pious prayer, any penitential act, and any charitable act can be done for the intention to gain a partial indulgence.





CYO student eligibility for St. John the Baptist, Glandorf

The following student eligibility guidelines were established and adopted by St John the Baptist Catholic Church after review and consultation of the Diocese of Toledo eligibility requirements. Refer to Diocese of Toledo, CYO Athletics, Athletic Director

Any high school student whose parent/ guardian is a registered member of St John the Baptist parish and attends St John's high school CCD is eligible to play

If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish, simply attending the CCD program does not make them

If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish but the student attended the St John K-8, 5 day a week, CCD program, and attends St John's high school CCD, they would be eligible to play

Minimum attendance of 2 school years of the K-8 CCD program.

If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish and the student has not attended the St John K-8, 5 day a week, CCD program, but the student does attend St John's high school CCD, they would be eligible to play CYO sports after attending St John's high school CCD for one full year. Attendance tracking would begin at the start of the first year of enrollment.

Any HS student currently participating in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), would register at the parish, and they would be eligible. (The parish does not recommend going through OCIA just to play CYO).

St. John the Baptist Glandorf requirements:

All students must be enrolled in high school CCD before the first class for the beginning of school year to play. Students are expected to attend both the Fall and Winter Semesters of High School Religious Education (CCD) classes. Attendance at these classes will be monitored and reviewed. For each class missed beyond 3 classes the player will sit out one game per absence. Attendance resets at the end of the team's season for each respective sport.

The Eucharist is why our parish exists and it is the reason why you get the privilege to play on the parish team.

Attendance at a Saturday evening or Sunday Mass at a Catholic Mass is required. We also ask you to come for one hour of Adoration during Eucharistic Sunday (generally the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary time).

Each player is asked to give 5 hours of service to St. John's parish during the





The Ottawa Food Partry, located at Trinity United Methodist Church in Ottawa, consists of 6 local churches. It includes the Catholic churches of Xalida, Glandorf, and Ottawa, and Ottawa's Leitheran, Prosbyterian, and Methodist churches. Since there are six churches, each church takes care of 2 different months. St. John's months are April and October. Seeing that it will soon be our turn again, we need your support (volunteer hours). The Food Partry is open to needly families on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month, this coming month being Oct. 14 and Oct 28. There is prey work to be done on the Mondays before these dates, as well, but no clients come until Tuesday morning. Here is a randown of what happens each day and where we need YOU.

MONDAYS Preparation Days (9:30 - 12:30)

Get empty boses from local businesses (to carry each family's groceries)

Pick up food order from Lima Food Bank (Need a pickup track and a trailer)

Unload and put away food from the Lims Food Bank. (Men are needed, for the cases and boses are beary.)

Set up tables in Trinky's assembly half for distributing eggs, butter, produce, broad, pastry items, refrigerated items, slightly copied items, etc., Set up thats for waiting clients.

Sort, check expiration dates, and put away items that have recently been denoted (for example-anything from the bax in the back of our charatt)

TUESDAYS Distribution Days (9:30 - 2:00)

Stand behind the tables set up on Monday in the assembly half (control how much each client can take/ restock as the tables empty).

Walk along with clients, perhaps pushing their carts for them and filling their boxes, as they choose items from our "choice painty". It is called a choice painty because the room is set up like a small grocery store, and clients choose what they want. We control the amount they take, depending upon the size of their family. For example, a large family may take 5 canned vegetables, 3 fruits, 1 ready-to-eat soup and 1 condensed soup, 2 meet packages, 1 baking item, etc. (A clipboard with the amounts each client can take of each category is provided for you, and you check off each food group as it is chosen.)

Stay in the choice partry and restock shelves as certain items get low.

Carry out and load food boxes into customers' cars.

Make lunch for the Glandorf volunteers

Clean up the assembly hall (put leftover food away, stack chairs, put tables back in their original places, stack and store remaining boxes, wash down the tables, clean up the kitchen from lanch, etc.)

NOTE: Glandorf St. John's is also in need of a person/couple willing to:

Attend 3 – 4 meetings per year, along with representatives from each church, to make decisions for the pantry and to keep each parish informed of any changes being made.

Call to remind/line up parish volunteers.

Write thank you notes to generous donors.

Periodically submit church bulletin announcements.






