

## FROM THE DESK OF FR. MATT

Today is the last Sunday of the liturgical year and today we celebrate the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Today we celebrate Jesus Christ our king. When we think of a person of royalty there is a certain image that comes to mind. We think of this person dressed in the finest of garments, made of the finest of materials, perhaps even precious metal or diamonds embedded into the material to help the material to shine sown by the best seamstresses. We think of this person wearing a crown made of precious metals and rubies and diamonds embedded in it. We think of this person sitting on a throne, the finest piece of furniture you ever laid your eyes on, carved by hand by the best carpenters and craftsmen. We think of this person having a scepter in hand. As we celebrate Jesus Christ, King of the Universe and as you think of Jesus as king perhaps this is how you would expect him to appear. While this might be what you think of as Jesus as king, our scriptures today give us a different image to consider Jesus as king. Jesus does not have a scepter in his hand, but he has nails driven through his hands and feet. The thrown that Jesus sits upon is not finest piece of furniture but is just two pieces of wood crossing one another, Jesus's thrown is the cross. Jesus is not wearing crown made out the finest metal with diamonds and rubies embedded in it, but Jesus wears the crown of thorns. Jesus is not dressed in the finest robe but is fully exposed for us to see him. We encounter Jesus Christ, King of the Universe in scriptures today dying and not only is he dying but has been executed by the Roman Government in one of cruelest and most humiliating punishment crucifixion. I present to you Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This is not the typical image you think of when you think of a king, matter of fact it is probably the exact opposite of when you think of a king. But then again Jesus is not your typical king. When I think of your typical kings and people of royalty, I picture them as being rather selfish people. They seem to be about themselves and maintaining their power by force. They think that they are God. Ironically, throughout history many kings have been overthrown and lost their position of power. For most kings you need to live up to their standard, if not you do not matter. Jesus our king is "the image of the invisible God" (Colossians 1:15) and he maintains his power not by force, but by being willingly chosen. We do not have to live up to his standard, but he meets where we are at lifts us up to him. Our scriptures today focus on the crucifixion scene; two other criminals were crucified with Jesus. We hear both spoke to Jesus, one reviles Jesus and the other rebukes. Our scriptures today do not tell us what crime they committed but the second criminal admits that for whatever they did wrong they are receiving an appropriate punishment. And it is through his repentance that Jesus promises him paradise. As we draw the liturgical year to a close, we are also drawing the Year of Hope to a close. I must admit that I am guilty of not talking about hope during this year, but I will say I did not know what to say. What I can say about hope is that even when we are guilty in my sin Jesus Christ, King of the Universe promises us paradise.

# Catechism Corner LAYING OUR LOVED ONES TO REST

"In line with the Corporal Work of Mercy to bury the dead and care for the grieving, the Catholic Church shows a deep respect for the dignity of the body. As a temple of the Holy Spirit and because of our belief in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting, the final disposition of a person is a sacred matter. The burial or entombment of the deceased person's body or cremated remains is a testimony that those who have gone before us are treated with reverence as members of the Communion of Saints. Just as Christ was laid to rest in a tomb, our Catholic cemeteries are sacred places for laying to rest our loved ones." Bishop Thomas Olmstead, Phoenix, AZ.

**Buring the Dead In A Cemetery** Burying the dead is considered to be one of the corporal works of mercy and, mirroring the burial of Christ, it clearly expresses hope in the resurrection when the person's body and soul will be reunited. By burying someone, the final resting place is to be marked with the person's name, the same name given when the person was baptized and which the person is called by God. The name, the person, the concrete identity of the person is important because God has created each individual and calls each individual to him.

What does the Church teach on Cremation? Cremation was accepted by the Catholic Church in 1963 when the Second Vatican Council permitted it as long as it was not done as a sign of denial of the basic Christian belief in the resurrection of the dead. "Belief in the resurrection of the flesh is fundamental. A human body is [sacred] and an anonymous burial or scattering of ashes is not compatible with the Christian faith", as stated by Cardinal Mueller in October 2016. "Placing an urn in a tomb or buried within a Catholic cemetery is an expression of belief in the "communion of saints", the unending unity in Christ of all baptized, living and dead," states Cardinal Mueller. This is why, even when cremated, the ashes are to be buried and not kept. It is for this reason the Church puts great importance on placing the cremated remains in a sacred place, a Catholic cemetery. (Instruction from Pope Francis, October 2016.) (Further reading: document *Ad Resurgendum cum Christo* (ARC), the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF)

Importance of A Funeral Mass Prior to the celebration of the funeral mass, a Vigil is held (also called a Wake). This is a time to remember the deceased and share stories. Often a rosary is said, and friends and family gather to console each other. Afterwords, the Funeral Mass then proceeds where the Church is joined by all the saints and the community of the faithful to commend the deceased to the mercy of God and, as Christians, we pray for them that through their faith in Jesus Christ they will share in His resurrection. The liturgy of the mass is also important for the consolation of the relatives and friends of the deceased. The community assembling in prayer also awaits the "words of eternal life." (CCC 1687). The liturgy of the word during funerals ... illumines the mystery of Christian death in the light of the risen Christ. (CCC 1688) In the Eucharist, the Church expresses her communion with the departed: offering to the Father in the Holy Spirit the sacrifice of the death and resurrection of Christ, she asks to purify his child of his sins and their consequences, and to admit him to the Paschal fullness of the table of the Kingdom. (CCC 1689) Finally, the mass extends a farewell to the deceased as "the last farewell by which the Christian community greets one of its members before his body is brought to its tomb." By this final greeting "we sing for his departure from this life and separation from us, but also because there is a communion and a reunion. For even dead, we are not at all separated from one another, because we all run the same course and we will find one another again in the same place. We shall never be separated, for we live for Christ, and now we are united with Christ as we go toward him . . . we shall all be together in Christ." (CCC1690)



### Joint Parish/Finance Council Meeting September 9, 2025

Joint Parish & Finance Council Meeting Minutes from August 12, 2025, meeting were reviewed. Fr. Matt Keller recommended to amend the minutes to clarify that the diocese "supported" the plan for the high altar and to removed the word "approved."

Grounds Committee is working on compiling a 5-year plan of projects and prioritization of completion, some of the current updates and recommendations are below:

Bodec completed Phase 1 of the Parish Center roof.

Replacement of the cafeteria doors is recommended due to one being broken. The grounds committee is reviewing what is appropriate.

There is a safety concerns for double doors in the Parish Center for CCD. There are 4 sets in total. Options are being reviewed.

Emergency Lighting in the church is still being explored. Discussion with Sarka Electric is taking place. Consideration of restructuring the control panel to a more user-friendly electronic screen is being reviewed. Currently waiting on a quote.

Southwood Construction came out to review the gutter project for the Church, at this point they have the best quote to move forward with. They use 20ft sheets of copper instead of 10ft, maintenance feels comfortable with their walk-thru. Next step will be to provide a letter to the Bishop requesting the approval to spend the money to replace the gutters next year.

Recommendation to re-pave the Preschool Parking lot.

Recommendation for the purchase of a zero-turn lawn mower. Discussion to revisit this in the spring.

Filling dirt in along sidewalks in numerous areas around the grounds is still needed due to fall concern. Would like to have this complete yet this fall

Brick Street Studio is working on a design concept for the interior layout of the Mustard Seed.

Mustard Seed: There is no current date scheduled to open. Still waiting on the Diocese to file the legal side of the new business owned by the Parish. Cosmetic work continues inside. Flooring will likely need to be replaced due to damage from glue.

A separate company file on current Parish QuickBooks can be set-up to begin to set up the chart of accounts for Mustard Seed.

Sonday Funday- Scheduled September 21, 2025. The slots have been filled for Parish & Finance Council, could use more volunteers elsewhere that day with other activities. The Parish pictorials will be available for pick up at Sonday Funday.

Mike Leach High Alter: Fynders Keepers provided a sketch and quote to complete this project of \$238,000. Scott Nienberg from the Historical Committee is assisting. Currently working on additional quotes, would like 3. New Business

A meeting for St. George Deanery Business Managers has been established to share practices, policies and procedures. Ashley is attending.

High School CYO policy was reviewed. Fr. Matt will be meeting with the CYO coaches and reviewing the diocese policy, Mike Karhoff and representatives from Parish Council may also be present. There have been ongoing challenges with non-Catholics/non-parishioners wanting to play and contacting the parish office each year. The goal is to establish clarity in these expectations at the beginning of this season and request the support of coaches in following the eligibility criteria of the diocese.





Make sure you do something special today to celebrate the feast of Christ the King!


