### FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Today is that last Sunday of the Liturgical Year and on this last Sunday of the Liturgical Year we celebrate the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

When we think of Jesus Christ as King of the Universe, I think we often picture him a dressed in robe made out of the finest pieces of fabrics, we picture him wearing a crown made of precious metals of gold and/or silver with rubies and diamonds embedded in the metal, we picture Jesus seated upon his throne, a throne that the finest crafted piece of furniture made out of wood crafted by the best carpenters, and we picture Jesus with scepter in his hand. This is a picture of Jesus Christ as King of the Universe but let me invite you to consider another image of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Let me direct your attention to the crucifixion scene. The crucifixion scene where Jesus seated on the thrown of the cross, where he is not clothed but fully exposed for us to see him nothing is hidden, a crown of thorns is on his head, and in place of a scepter nails are driven through his hands and feet. This second picture of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe is entirely different from the first picture and not the typical picture when we think of a king. But Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe is not your typical king. He appears to us to be weak, and it is in this appearance of weakness that he makes us strong.

A crucifixion scene I think is the last place you would think of to encounter a king, or at least a crucifixion scene where the king is the one that is being executed. But this is place where we encounter Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. I grew up in an era of watching Disney movies and I have studied history, and this has influenced my understanding of people of royalty. When I think of people of royalty, I think of them as having high egos, I picture them as individuals that only think about themselves. They are about maintaining their dominance and their rule and doing everything at their disposal to maintain that power. They appear powerful and unapproachable to their subjects. And it is in doing this they believe that their kingdom will last forever. Ironically, these kingdoms have failed and lost their power.

Jesus Christ our King of the Universe first appears to us the crucifixion scene where he is the one that is being executed. Where he appears to us to be weak so we his weak

subjects can place our weaknesses and pain in his weaknesses and pain. And it is doing that we are healed and made strong and Christ our King maintains his power forever. Our scriptures today speak how Christ's kingdom last forever, this how Christ maintains his power he lifts us from our pain and weaknesses.

As we celebrate Jesus Christ, King of the Universe today let us place our pain and our weaknesses in his wounds so that we can be made strong. And Jesus Christ, King our lives and reigns forever and ever.

Each week at Holy Mass we profess our belief in reciting the Nicene Creed. What does it mean when we say we believe in these statements/truths? We will take a look at each statement/truth of the creed and examine it's meaning through the use of the Faith and Life Series by Ignatius Press that is utilized in our parish religious education morning program, 5<sup>th</sup> Grade curriculum. "He Suffered death and was buried" "And going a little further he fell on his face and prayed, 'My Father, if it be possible, let this chalice pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou will'" (Matthew 26:39)

Jesus knew and proclaimed that he would suffer and die. Before Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, he predicted his Passion and death. Imagine what it must have been like for him. Jesus is the Son of God; he knows that he must die in order for man to have eternal life. He is God himself and has full knowledge of God's will and shares in it. He came to save us and open the gates of heaven, and he freely chose to do that.

The night before Jesus died he was celebrating the Passover feast. The Passover was a Jewish feast that celebrated their deliverance from four hundred years of slavery in Egypt. Now, Jesus knew he would deliver all people from a different kind of slavery...the slavery of our sin.

Before he died on the cross, Jesus wanted to give a way for us to be delivered from our sins, so He gave us himself in the Eucharist. When we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, we receive His grace and can begin to turn away from sin. Take some time to read about Jesus instituting the Eucharist at the Last Supper in Luke 22: 14-20.

The words Jesus says in the passage above in the Last Supper are the same words the priest says at Mass. They are the same words said at the consecration of the Eucharist. The bread and wine are also the same. The process by which the bread and wine become the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ is called "transubstantiation".

The priest consecrates the Eucharist by the authority of Christ given to them through the apostolic succession. The words Jesus said at the Last Supper that gave the apostles them power to do this were, "Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19)

The Paschal Mystery is Christ's work of Redemption. Our redemption was accomplished through Christ's Passion, death, Resurrection, and Ascension. Jesus' Passion began at the Last Supper as he said, "This is my body which is given for you" (Luke 22:19). The Paschal Mystery is celebrated and made present in the liturgy.

When the Jewish people celebrated the Passover feast, they celebrated with four cups of wine. When Jesus was celebrating the Passover feast he celebrated the first three cups: the cups of bitterness, remembering the bitterness of slavery; the cup of deliverance (from slavery); and the cup of blessing. The final cup was the cup of consummation, meaning that the feast was complete. Jesus did not drink the fourth cup until he was on the Cross because it was only through his death on the Cross that he would reopen the gates of heaven. In fact, at the Last Supper, Jesus said, "Truly, I say to you, I shall not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God" (Mark 14:25). He did not drink again until on the Cross when he said, "I thirst" (John 19:28), and drank vinegar from a sponge they held to his mouth, just before he died. This drinking completed the Passover celebration; the sacrifice began at the Last Supper and was completed on the Cross.

Jesus agonized in prayer, but he ultimately accepted his Father's will and was willingly crucified for our sins. From the Cross, he also gave his beloved disciple (John), and the rest of the Church by extension, his Mother, Mary, to be our spiritual Mother.

### **Grounds Committee**

A list of a possible 5 year plan for parish projects was introduced. Ground committee will help with prioritizing list. Possibly ask parish ministries if they have any things that they may be needing.

South church window- Leaking through mortar joint. Will be getting that sealed up and then the painting/plaster work can be addressed on the inside.

Emergency generator for church-Looking over past electrical use to size accordingly for current usage.

May see about setting up a group of people (similar to park fest) or ask the ministries to take on a portion of the event.

This week, we hear from Helen T. in the Archdiocese of Hartford.



Your <u>Walk With One</u> <u>guidebook</u> clearly states that God is part of every step, but that reality didn't really sink into my head until I started to see God working.


