2 FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

In June of 2013, a group from Glandorf went on a Pilgrimage to Rome and the Holy Land for 12 days. In Rome and the surrounding area, we saw many sites both religious and secular. Then we proceeded to the land in which Jesus walked, taught and performed many miracles. It was very interesting as we visited a site and then read from the bible the part that pertained to what we were seeing or standing on. And one of the sites that was fascinating was in Jerusalem where we visited the Western or Wailing wall. The wall was considered very holy and in order to approach it, you had to wear a beanie like hat and then you could place a prayer request in one of the cracks in the wall. There were Jewish people and leaders there worshipping; reading from their prayer books. Some had hats on with tassels hanging from them and others had boxes or Phylacteries, strapped to their forehead or their arm. This site came to mind when I read the Gospel for this weekend. Jesus is calling out the Scribes and Pharisees who are teaching the people how to live properly but they themselves don't practice what they preach. Jesus says to them that "they widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels" to make themselves Holier in appearance but don't lift a finger to help others out who are in need. And we can see ourselves as Scribes and Pharisees in that story when we fail to help someone who is in need of physical help or financial support. Or we tell ourselves that we are Holy enough and that we don't need to do anything more than just going to church on Sunday. We all have the same Father in heaven and the first reading from Malachi tells us "Has not the one God created us?" We are all created in the image and likeness of God and we need to speak out for those that can't; particularly the little babies in the womb. What God has deemed precious in His eyes, the world seems to discard it as something that is a burden or a hardship. And this coming Tuesday may be one of the most important decisions that you will witness in your lifetime. We need to vote "NO" to turn down Issue One that will amend the Ohio Constitution to make abortion forever legal. Reach out to your families in other parts of the state to tell them of how important this is to turn this evil atrocity down. God has called everyone of us to do His will. We do this by defending the lives that He created.

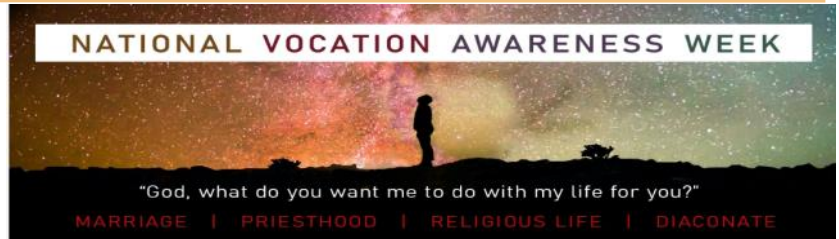

TOOLS TO HELP YOUR DISCERNMENT

DISCERNMENT: Generally, when people use the word discernment they are referring to the question of discerning your state in life (consecrated life, the priesthood, marriage or the consecrated single life). This is one of the most important questions you will discern in your life, but it's not the only time solid discernment will be necessary.

We are all called to holiness, but we are not all called to be holy in the same way. God's call to you is utterly personal.

Discernment helps you to figure out your personal call. This outlines four simple tools that are essential to discerning well. You will need all of them when you are discerning around major questions like your state in life, or career choices. They are also helpful as you discern other choices as well. Discernment is not a one time sort of thing. Decisions big and small should be discerned, as they all relate to your growing in holiness.

PRAYER: All vocations have God as their starting point. If you desire clarity regarding your vocation, you need a practice of regular mental prayer or meditation. Sit in the quiet with the Lord. If you've never spent time in Scripture, then Lectio Divina would be a great place to start. The Ignation practice of imagining yourself in a scene from Scripture is another great way to enter into meditation or mental prayer.

SELF—KNOWLEDGE: Vocations are personal. Your vocation is yours. God created you with your vocation in mind. So a thorough and honest knowledge of self is essential. What are your strengths? Weaknesses? What do you love? The goal here isn't to see how you compare to an imaginary checklist, but to help you understand that who you are is a part of God's call. This is the very personal aspect of your vocation.

COUNSEL: People who know you well can be helpful sources of information. Share with them what you are thinking, and ask them what they think. Your parish priest would be another great resource for you. Eventually, you will want to find a spiritual director who sits with you and listens to your story. Their only task is to help you learn to hear God better.

ACTION (AND CONFIRMATION): At some point, your discernment will move from a conversation between you and God to include more people. This requires you to take concrete steps. At first, they will be about getting more information. That will lead to inquiries, conversations, and community visits. As you bring these experiences back to prayer, you will discover places where you just would not fit, and that's okay. The goal is to find the place God has prepared for you.

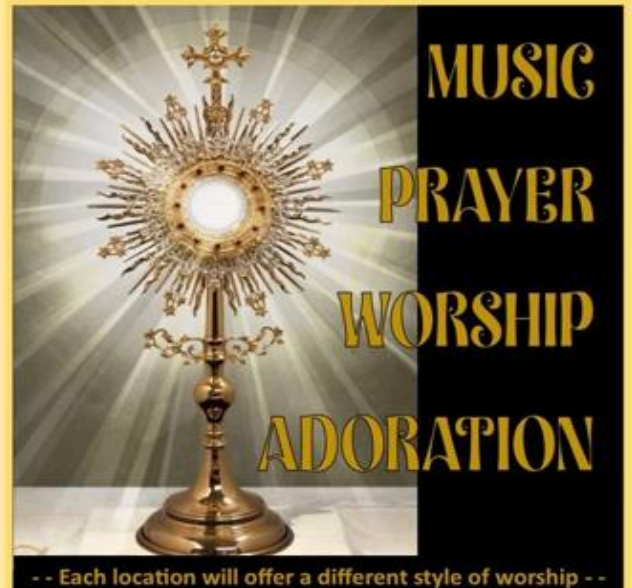
