Today we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. The Lateran Basilica is one of the four major basilicas in Rome. The other three major basilicas in Rome are St. Peter's Basilica, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls. I will be honest I find celebrating this Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica to be a little weird. When I think about celebrating the dedication of a church, I think celebrating inside the actual church we are celebrating the dedication. But today we celebrate the dedication of the Lateran Basilica throughout the Catholic Church even at St. John the Baptist here Glandorf, Ohio not being in the Lateran Basilica. As I think of the Lateran Basilica and these qualities, I also think our church here in Glandorf may not be as big as the Lateran Basilica, but our church has the same qualities as the Lateran Basilica. Our church here in Glandorf is place of beauty, I mean the stained-glass windows, the statues, the paintings, the fine woodwork, and much more speak for itself. Our church is a place of prayer. This week November 11-13 is our Parish Mission. The first day of our Parish Mission is A Day of Prayer from 7 AM to 7 PM. I invite you sometime on Tuesday to come into our church and just pray. On Wednesday night at 7 PM here in church Dr. John Wood is going to be here to give a talk entitled '4 Sight: An Eye Doctor's Prescription for Happiness'. And on Thursday we are going to stuff stockings for the homeless in the surrounding area where Fr. Eric Kaufman serves in the Parish Center. Our

church here in Glandorf is also a place to come to encounter God and there are multiple ways to encounter God in our church. One way in through our celebrating and receiving the sacraments. Today is our 8th grade students' 'big day' as they will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. We encounter God through the presence of one another particularly in the kindness and charity we share with one another. Catechism Corner

COMMUNION OF SAINTS, OUR TRUE HOME:HEAVEN

When the Church references end times, end of life, or life after death, it uses the word 'Eschatology'. As Catholics, we believe in life after death. This life is eternal – we do not believe in reincarnation. As noted in last week's Catechism Corner, life after death constitutes three possibilities, three states of being, known as heaven, purgatory and hell. When the Church talks about the 'Four Last Things', these are three of the four. The fourth is judgement.

The deceased souls in purgatory still suffering and longing for heaven benefit from our prayers. Our prayers give them the needed grace to cleanse their souls of any attachments to sin. They join in the Church "Triumphant" and get their eternal reward in heaven.

What is Heaven? Heaven is a state of supreme and absolute happiness. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), #1023 says, "Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are perfectly purified live forever with Christ. They are like God for ever, for they "see him as he is," face to face."

Who lives in heaven? CCC #1024 "This perfect life with the Most Holy <u>Trinity</u> - this communion of life and love with the Trinity, with the <u>Virgin Mary</u>, the <u>angels</u> and all the <u>blessed</u> - is called "heaven." Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness." Heaven is the answer to St. Augustine's cry, "Our hearts, Lord, are restless until they rest in You."

Who is considered the "blessed" in heaven? A saint! A saint is a human, a person, who has died and either was in a state of grace at the time of death, or has gone through a period of purification and has reached heaven. A saint lives eternally in heaven in union with all of heaven. They are a part of the communion of saints and have the same mission as God to intercede for the Church on earth (known as the Church Militant – those still fighting the battle). Note: when a person dies and goes to heaven, they are not angels. Angels are their own creation, their own entity. Humans retain their nature, but are glorified and referred to as saints. The Church as declared some humans as "canonized saints", but rest assured, we are all called to be a saint as we are all called to share in the glory of heaven. However, we may not all be canonized.

God's redemptive plan: CCC # 1026 "By his death and Resurrection, Jesus Christ has "opened" heaven to us. The life of the blessed consists in the full and perfect possession of the fruits of the redemption accomplished by Christ. He makes partners in his heavenly glorification those who have believed in him and remained faithful to his will. Heaven is the blessed community of all who are perfectly incorporated into Christ." By Christ's death on the Cross, He has won salvation for all mankind. This is a gift in which mankind must respond to accept by doing His will first and foremost. Heaven is offered to all, but not all accept this saving mission.

Those in heaven are part of the Church Triumphant. They have won the battle and are victorious. CCC #1029 "In the glory of heaven the blessed continue joyfully to fulfill God's will in relation to other men and to all creation. Already they reign with Christ; with him "they shall reign for ever and ever." The Church Triumphant joins in Christ's saving mission for salvation of all mankind.

Though we currently cannot see Christ in "the beatific vision" (to see God in his transcendence, in all his glory- CCC #1028), we don't have to wait until we die for heaven. Heaven is being with Christ. Each day Christ is substantially present at the altar in the Eucharist, and He can be found in His Word, in nature, and in all hearts if we but have the eyes and heart to seek Him out.

YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT

CYO student eligibility for St. John the Baptist, Glandorf St. John the Baptist Glandorf requirements:

All students must be enrolled in high school CCD before the first class for the beginning of school year to play.
Students are expected to attend both the Fall and Winter Semesters of High School Religious Education (CCD) classes. Attendance at these classes will be monitored and reviewed.
For each class missed beyond 3 classes the player will sit out one game per absence. Attendance resets at the end of the team's season for each respective sport.
