FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

You are invited to a dinner, a dinner that promises to be a one of kind experience, by the way it is a free meal with no strings attached, and no need worry about calories or health concerns. Are you going to accept the invitation? Before you give an answer or if you are not sure if you should accept, let me say a little more.

It will begin with guests being greeted at the door and you will be led into a social space waiting for all the invited guests to arrive. During this time those that have already arrived will be sharing small talk, catching up with old friends and meeting new friends. As you wait the finest appetizers will be offered to you, something salty, something sweet, a little bit protein and something to get the taste buds excited about what is soon to come, in some ways this might even seem to be the meal. After everyone has arrived and had sufficient time to visit and have a pre-taste of what is to come. You will be called to the dining room, to a large dinner table to share the great feast of this meal, a long table, and large comfortable chairs along the side and one chair at the head and foot of the table. All the places at the table will be set with several pieces of silverware, a plate at the center of each place, and a couple of drinking glasses. The table will be well decorated with an original centerpiece and brilliant table cloths and cloth napkins. After everyone has been seated and the before meal prayer has been offered, the first course will be served. The first course will feature a mixture of green leafy vegetables, you know the healthy stuff, with all your favorite toppings to spruce it up, as well as dressed, and seasoned the way you like, it hard to believe that it is healthy. Also, freshly baked bread, still warm out of the oven bread will be served, the butter will melt as soon as it touches the bread. The second course will feature your favorite choice cut of meat, seasoned, and cooked just the way that you like it. Served with the best sides a combination of starch and warm vegetable taste almost perfect and coordinates the way it is supposed to with the meat on the plate soaking up its juices. And for the third and final course, at this point you are going to be close to full, but there are going to be a few small cracks. This course is dessert. It is going to be sweet but not too, it is going to be rich in flavor, and leave a lasting memory to what you just ate. Does this set your mouth to watering? I must admit, as sit writing this reflection my mouth is watering just thinking about. The question though is do you accept the invitation? I think our nature inclination is to say yes to this invitation, but you know as good as this sounds there will be some that will decline this invitation.

In our scriptures today Jesus shares a parable with the chief priests and elders about a king hosting a wedding banquet for his son. At this banquet we hear that the king has prepared a banquet "calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready" (Matthew 22:4) and invites the guests to come. But the

invited guest ignores and treats the servants poorly who delivered message inviting them to the feast.

Each time that we come to Mass, we respond to the Lord's invitation to come to an abundant feast and we know the great gift it is. We are also aware of those who do not join in this feast for health reasons, still others because they did not have away to get here like a parent or an adult that does not bring a child to church, some unfortunately have a work obligation, and still others flat right out choose not to come. May all who have desire to be part of this feast come to the feast.
