PROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

"The LORD God said: 'It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a suitable partner for him." (Genesis 2:18). These are the words that often are selected to be read at a wedding, and when I hear these words at a wedding, I like to respond by saying, I agree with God that it is not good for the man to be alone. In the spirit of inclusion, I add it is also not good for the woman to be alone.

Today on the first Sunday of October and we celebrate Respect Life Sunday. Today we are called to pray for a greater respect of human life from the moment of its first conception to its final breathe and in the grave. On this Respect Life Sunday, we are particularly called not only to pray but we are also called respond when the dignity of human life is being threatened.

In our scriptures today God addresses the dignity of human life. God says that it is not good for us to be alone. Not being alone would imply that we need each other, we need to be in relationship each other. And note the word choice here need over want. There a significance from saying need vs saying want. To say I want would imply that it is not needed for survival, to want would imply that we could go without. But to say I need implies that it is necessary for survival, I cannot live without. Hence it is not good for man to be alone, he needs a partner.

Medical science and personal experience support the idea that we need each other. Think for a moment all the benefits that come from our being in relationship with each other. Our relationships with each other help general overall health and well-being, when we have to make a difficult decision or going through a difficult time the support, the relationship with another person significantly helps us through. While medical science and personal experiences knows the importance needing to be in relationship with each other, neither can do perfect matching the right relationships. Only God can do the proper matching of right relationships. The LORD God is the one that take out one of man's ribs, formed the woman and brought her to the man. God puts the people that we need into our lives at the right time.

As we celebrate Respect Life Sunday, as we work for a greater respect of human life, we often think of those whose lives are vulnerable as needing us. There is no doubt that unborn child or newly born child

needs our help. There is no doubt that the single woman with an unexpectant pregnancy needs our help. There is no doubt that the disabled person or family member with memory issues needs our help. There is no doubt that the dying family member in a hospital bed needs our help. At times helping these people can seem to be a challenge, but if truth be told as much as they need us, we need them just as much if not more. It is our privilege and need to care for those in need. On Respect Life Sunday as we pray for all human life, especially where it would appear to be most vulnerable, may we see all human life as being needed.


are lower than God; Patroness of the United States of America, sorrowful and mindful of our own sinfulness and the sins of our nation, we come to thee, our refuge and hope.

to raise their children.


