# FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

When I read the article featuring Glandorf St. John's in the recent *C.PP.S. Today*, I was aware that we the Missionaries of the Precious Blood have been serving here in Glandorf for a long time, but I did not realize that our community has been serving here for 175 years, until I read the article. Glandorf, is one of the first parishes that we took on as a community when we came to the United States. But I think it would have to be one of the first parishes that our community took on world-wide. When St. Gaspar del Bufalo founded our community in 1815, our first missionaries were not parish priests, they were missionaries, their mission was to bring people back to church, in response to the fall of Napoleon. In 1843 Fr. Brunner brought our community to the United States to help minister to German Speaking immigrants this when our community began to take on parish ministry.

As I walk through our parish museum and see the display of past Missionaries of the Precious Blood pastors that have served here at St. John's, I see my picture among them and humbly can say I only account for 1 of those 175 years and I am also reminded of the shoulders of the past that I stand on. As I reflect on my family the Missionaries of the Precious Blood history at St. John, I am also reminded of the history that your families have here as well. I would imagine as you examine the roots of your family history, they go back 175 years and some either farther yet. You could examine your family roots and see the impacts that your family has had on St. John's.

In our scriptures today we hear of a parable of a landowner that plants a vineyard, puts a hedge in it, digs a wine press, and builds a tower. It appears the landowner did everything that he could to have good, successful, and bountiful vineyard. Ironically, rather than staying to work the vineyard the landowner leaves for a journey and leases the vineyard out to tenants. When the grapes become ripe the landowner sends servants to get some of the produce of the harvest. Rather than sharing the produce with the landowner the tenants kill and mistreat the servants. As we I reflect on our parish's history, and on this parable. I see God as the landowner and our God gives all the gifts that we need. We are the tenants and the harvest or the produce is all the good things that we have and do. And call then is to share that produce with our God. Our parish's history is filled with faithful tenants that have worked hard to produce a bountiful

harvest and shared that produce with the Lord. We are beneficiaries of that harvest.

Now is our turn to be tenants of not only producing harvest but sharing that produce with the Lord. And that is why we are having our Sonday Funday this Sunday. To recognize all the ways here at St. Johns we have and are we are producing and sharing the fruit with the Lord through our CCD programs and various other ministries in our parish. But today is about what is happening today and looking to the future, how can we continue to produce fruit and share that produce? What is the gift that God is calling you to share?







# THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

# THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

### **PUTS WOMEN AT RISK**

Current Ohio laws\* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

# ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,\*\* "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortion-providing physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

### IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

# **ARTICLE I, SECTION 22**

The Right to Reproductive Freedom
with Protections for Health and Safety

- 1. Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- 3. However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- This Section is self-executing.
