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FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

I remember in March-April of 2020 at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic and at the start of the shutdown. One of the recommendations that was given after purchasing groceries and before bringing them into and putting them away, I remember you were supposed wipe down your non -produce items with a bleach wipe. I personally thought that this was a little over the top. In our scriptures today we hear of something similar some the Pharisees and some of the scribes observed that the disciples are not washing their hands after they come home from the marketplace or before they eat a meal. At first glance my response is what is the big deal? But as I give it another glance, I am reminded that it is a big deal. For the Pharisees and the scribes, it was a big deal, it is about giving right praise to God. And not purifying oneself on returning from the market or not washing hands before a meal, not being pure was not giving right praise to God. For the Pharisees and scribes being pure was important to give right praise to God. And Jesus does not deny that this is important. But Jesus tells the Pharisees and scribes it is not only the things that are on the outside that can make one impure, it is also what is on the inside of a person's heart can also make one impure. Jesus gives a list of things evil things that could be in a person's heart. The question for us what is getting in your way of giving right praise to God? As I think of what gets in my way of giving right praise to God that list seems to be rather extensive a bad habit or two, those times were say or do things I should not, or those opportunities where I missed out on doing good, or I think of those times were people say or do things that disturb me. This is just might scratch the surface but these just some examples the keep me from giving right praise to God.

I think of what gets in my way of giving right praise to God, but I also think of what helps me to give right praise to God. When I do a good deed for someone, when I give or receive a complement, and when I take advantage of a good opportunity. When I take time to pray, and I am really focused on what I am praying. As a priest when I reverently and prayerfully celebrate the sacraments.

When we give right praise to God it has a wonderful effect on us personally, but our right praise of God has an influence on the people around us. In our scriptures today Moses speaks to Israelites on the importance of obeying statues and decrees they are taught. Moes instructs "Observe them carefully, for thus will you give evidence of your wisdom and intelligence to the

nations, who will hear of all these statutes and say, 'This great nation is truly wise and intelligent people.' For what great nation is that that has gods so close to it as the LORD our God, is to us" (Deuteronomy 4:6-7). As the Israelites gives right praise others see the greatness of God. Similarly, as we give right praise to God others see the greatness of God. As Catholic there are multiple ways, we do this in the way that we treat each other and through our celebration of the Sacraments particularly the Eucharist. May our right praise of God give witness to our God's greatness.

A spiritual bouquet is a collection of prayers, sacrifices, or devotional acts offered by one person or a group of people for a particular intention or as a gift to another person. It is a way to show support, love, and gratitude through spiritual means. Instead of physical flowers, the "bouquet" consists of spiritual offerings like:

1. Prayers: Specific prayers, such as the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet.

2. Eucharistic Holy Hours: Spending an hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament praying for the intention.

- 3.Masses: Having Masses offered for the person's intentions.
- 4.Fasting: Offering a period of fasting or abstinence.
- 5.Acts of Charity: Engaging in acts of kindness or service.

These spiritual gifts are often presented to the recipient in a card or letter, sometimes beautifully designed to resemble a bouquet of flowers, indicating the types and numbers of spiritual acts being offered. Each week at Holy Mass we profess our belief in reciting the Nicene Creed. What does it mean when we say we believe in these statements/ truths? We will take a look at each statement/truth of the Creed and examine it's meaning through the use of the Faith and Life Series by Ignatius Press that is utilized in our Parish Religious Education morning program, 5th Grade curriculum. "All things visible and invisible" "But the Lord called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?'"

Man is created with a body and soul and is given certain gifts. Humanity is unique in creation: human nature unites the spiritual and physical worlds. God gave man a soul, free will, intelligence, and an eternal soul so that we would be made in His image, able to love as He loves.

At their creation, Adam and Eve had a human nature that was untainted by sin because they were full of grace. (Grace is God's life in us.) They lived in perfect harmony with each other and all of creation. Before the Fall Adam and Eve would live forever (no death), there was no suffering and their body would not grow old. Knowledge was directly given to them by God. There was no tendency to sin. They were perfectly happy.

God asked Adam and Eve to obey Him, but they were tempted by the devil and chose not to. As a result, they damaged their relationship with God and lost the life of grace. It was their choice to reject God. They now had concupiscence (the tendency to sin). They were susceptible to their passions. They would suffer and experience death. These consequences were handed down to all humanity through the inheritance of Original Sin.

Suffering came into the world through the sin of Adam and Eve. Because evil is the absence of good, evil abounded after this sin. God does not cause evil, nor did he create anything that is evil. Because of the gift of free will, God allows us to choose evil over good, although God will never allow evil unless a better good will come from it.

God loved his people and would not abandon them to the consequences of their sin, so He promised to send a Savior to heal the rift between God and man and restore us to grace and hope for eternal life. Jesus, the Savior, would be the New Adam, obediently accepting death and opening the gates of heaven. (Mary would be the New Eve, saying "yes" to God's will instead of "no" as Eve did.)

Sin harms our relationship with God because He intends for us to share in His life and grow in holiness, and sin is a rejection of that. Sin harms our relationship with other people because we can

hurt them and they can hurt us, and we fail to grow in love for one another. Sin harms the world around us, such as when we don't practice good stewardship and the natural world is damaged.

Jesus died to conquer death and reestablish our access to grace. Through the Sacraments we receive sanctifying grace. Baptism erases the stain of Original Sin from our souls. Only through the

power of God's grace in our lives can we overcome sin and evil. We cannot do it alone.


