## FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT September 14, 2025

I have a riddle a snake mounted on pole is a modern-day symbol for what? Hint many of you are professionally trained and employed in this field. All of us make appointments to see and get help from people that are in this field. You see this symbol alongside emergency vehicles rush down the road with flashing lights and sirens to help those in need of this kind of help. A snake mounted on a pole is a symbol for what?

Our scriptures mention a snake mounted on a pole. The Israelites have been freed from slavery in Egypt, and now they are making their way to the promised land with Moses. As the Israelites make their way they complain about the food and water. The LORD got tired of hearing their complaining, so the LORD saraph servants (snakes) that bit the Israelites and those that got bitten died. The Israelites recognize their sin and "pray the LORD to take the serpents from us" (Numbers 21:7). God tells Moses to mount a saraph (snake) on a pole and if anyone has been bitten by it looks at it, that person will be saved. What was killing them, they are now to look at because it is going to restore life. A snake mounted on a pole is symbol for what? Today we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, to say that we celebrate the exaltation of the holy cross is to say that we celebrate the cross as a victory. In our modern-day Catholic experience, we take it for granted that the cross is a place of victory. As I sit at my desk typing this column I see a crucifix above my desk, as I look around my office, I see several other crosses and crucifixes, I even wear a cross around my neck, and Sunday after Mass I wear my Precious Blood Mission Cross. All these crosses and crucifixes are around us because they are signs of victory. But before the cross is a place of victory it is a place of defeat, the cross is an instrument of torture, the cross is a place of death, and not just death but most cruel and humiliating place. It is a place of horror and distress. To have a cross or crucifix up in your home or around your neck would have been offensive in the early church. A fish on the door was a sign for Christians before the cross.

The cross is a place of defeat and death but it from this place of defeat and death that we also find victory and life. The Israelites that were bitten and dying looked at

the snake mounted on the pool were saved. Christ died on the cross and rose from the dead and has made the cross sign of life. How many of us, when we are hurt, facing defeat, and not sure where to turn, turn to the cross of Jesus Christ? Why? Because we have faith and believe, we have heard, we have experience ed and know the healing power and life that has come from when we have placed our wounds in the

wounds of Jesus Christ on at the foot of the crucifix. As we celebrate and exalt the Holy Cross today may we experience the life that comes from the Cross.

## INITIATION OF ADULTS INTO THE CATHOLIC FAITH (RCIA/OCIA)

Is a journey through which interested adults and older children are welcomed and gradually introduced to the Roman Catholic Faith, Sacraments, Worship and way of life. In response to their inquiries, these people are properly instructed so that you can discern (through reflection and prayer) whether you are indeed called to Catholicism. If you would like more information or want to register please contact the Parish Office. The next session will start in the fall.

## Catechism Corner

#### Order of Christian Initiation, the Dismissal

In last week's Catechism Corner, the basics of OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) was explained. It was mentioned in that article that at some point, those whom have not been baptized will leave the Mass after the Liturgy of the Word to break open the Word in a private session. This will not occur until those whom are inquiring make their first public statement of accepting to be on this journey through the Rite of Acceptance or Welcoming. The first time this Rite is being offered is in December. Note, there will be other times this Rite is offered, according to those who start the journey at a different time and their depending upon their readiness.

Question: Why will some of those in OCIA leave Mass while others won't? You will see after the Liturgy of the Word, some of those in OCIA will leave the Mass. It's important to note, there are two different distinctions for being received into the Church based upon the inquirer's current spiritual status: those who have already been baptized ("Candidates") and those who are not yet baptized ("Catechumens"). It is the Catechumens who will be dismissed.

There are two main reasons Catechumens are dismissed. First, they participate in the Liturgy of the Word to hear the Word and be fed by Christ present in that Word and assembly. After hearing the Scripture readings and the homily, the catechumens are dismissed for "Breaking open the Word", in which they will reflect on the days readings and discuss how they apply to their lives. They "share their joy and spiritual exercises" that they received from Christ in that Word. Their dismissal is similar, then, to the dismissal the baptized receive at the end of Mass: "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." They are in a sense being commissioned, sent out. The dismissal is a time for reflection, prayer and faith-sharing that flows from God's Word. It is not to *learn more information* about the faith.

The second reason for the dismissal is regarding the fact that the Catechumens have not yet received the Sacrament of Baptism, and therefore, they are not yet members of the "priestly people of God". When a person is baptized, they receive the same mission as Christ: priest, prophet and king. As priest, all the baptized participate in the Sacrifice of the altar. Since the Catechumens have not yet been baptized, they do not participate in this re-enactment of Christ's sacrifice.

The Candidates (those who have already been baptized), stay for the entire Mass for two main reasons. First, their valid baptism has already made them a member of the order of the faithful. Although they are not yet in full communion with the Catholic Church, their baptism gives them the right, and the duty, to pray the prayers of the faithful: the Creed, the Universal Prayers and the Eucharistic Prayer. This experience is their primary form of liturgical formation as they prepare for full communion.

This dismissal is an awaking for all those at Mass. For those who have been fully initiated, it's an awaking to the appreciation of the graces we are blessed to receive with each Holy Eucharist. For the catechumens, it's an awaking to know... there is so much more to come!






## Join us for the 2025 OHIO MARCH FOR LIFE in Columbus, October 3, 2025.

## The Holy Cross

Today we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation, or Triumph, of the Holy Cross on which Our Lord died. The cross was an instrument of torture used to punish criminals and to show other people what would happen to them too, if they broke the Roman laws. Our Lord used the cross for a different reason though. He offered His sufferings on the cross to repay for the sins of everyone else in the world. He died in a place where many people could see Him so that they could see and know how much He loves us.

In the 300's AD, St. Helena, who was a Christian queen, went to Jerusalem to find the cross of Jesus. She found three crosses there so she decided to test to see which

was Christ's. A very sick woman touched each cross. When she touched the third one she was healed instantly! They had found the cross of Christ!



In hoc Saint Helena's son Constantine was signo, not a Christian yet, but when he was about to go to war he had a vision of the cross and heard the words "In this sign you shall conquer!" So he had crosses drawn on all the flags and shields, and he won the battle. Then he believed in Jesus and became a Christian.
