

Hello Everyone,

I hope and pray that you are all well. Thank you for your continued prayers and support. I have four years completed, with three years until ordination to the priesthood. This school year, I am away from the seminary in Cincinnati and serving a pastoral internship year (Sept. 2022 – May 2023), at St. Joan of Arc parish in Toledo, with Monsignor Borger. The internship year will allow me to see some of the different areas of parish life, from the business viewpoint, to being part of a catholic school, to liturgies, and so many other ministries.

This summer, I was blessed with the amazing opportunity to do funeral home ministry with Walker Funeral Homes in Toledo and the surrounding area. They are a great company that show respect for both the deceased and those who mourn. It was wonderful to be able to pray for the dead, especially in the care center, support the grieving families, and be part of the process from when the deceased arrived into the care of the funeral home to the burial or cremation. I had many incredible conversations and experiences with this assignment that will help me in my priesthood. My biggest takeaway was how much the secular culture has influenced/skewed society's understanding of suffering, death, and grieving.

As the summer was ending and school/the internship year was about to begin, a group of us from the seminary took a short trip to Red River Gorge in Kentucky. It is a beautiful area with great hiking trails and places to see. One of our excursions was a guided tour by kayak through an old abandoned, flooded mine.

Since Easter, the topic of vocations has been on my mind. It started when a seminarian friend of mine was researching the history of his home parish, finding out it was their 150th anniversary. He mentioned in his research the different vocations from his parish, which got me thinking about my home parish in Glandorf. So, I did some research and found that at least three sons of the parish became brothers, and sixteen sons of the parish have become priests, most recently in 2013. Thirty-eight daughters of the parish became religious sisters, but the last sister to come from the parish was in 1967 (55 years ago).

So, after finding out this information, I asked about giving vocation talks to the CCD kids, and I was able to talk with all the kindergarten through 8th-grade classes last May. The high school I was able to speak to just recently as they began this school year. Stressing in my talks: silence, prayer, adoration, a relationship with God, and the vocation umbrella. The vocation umbrella is my way of showing that the canopy is the vocation (covering your whole life), the handle is you, the metal spokes of the umbrella represent your talents, job, relationships, hobbies, etc., and God is the cap that holds it all together. For it is not what do we want to do or be when we grow up, but what vocation is God calling us to?

I even came up with some ideas to encourage vocations and discernment, like: attending ordinations, visiting convents/seminaries, attending Mass while at sporting events and on vacations, visiting Catholic shrines and churches, bringing religious artwork, holy water fonts, and crucifixes (not just plain crosses) into all areas of our homes. Another way I found was to come up with a yard sign to help remind those that pass by to remember to pray for vocations. All of these things, and so much more can help us grow and live out our faith daily. Helping us, as St. Paul says, to pray without ceasing—living out our lives then as one prayer to God.

From the Desk of Fr. Matt Our faith instructs us to read the Bible and when read the Bible, when we read the gospel, it can stir a variety of different emotions with in us. Some time they can provide comfort to us like "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:28-29). At other times the gospel empowers us like when Jesus said "Go into the whole world and

proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). At other times the gospel speaks of hope and scandal like through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Still other times when read the gospel it leaves us feeling



uncomfortable, it leaves us with asking ourselves am I doing enough. I think our scriptures today one of the examples.

In our scriptures today we hear of a rich man and a poor man named Lazarus. You know it seems a bit ironic that Lazarus the poor man has a name and there is no name given for this rich man. This rich man we hear dressed in fine clothes and wore purple, he dined sumptuously each, and he ignored the poor man Lazarus who laid at his door. We hear about Lazarus being poor, having sores that dogs licked, and that he was hungry. Both the rich man and Lazarus died and when they died the rich man went to a place of torment and Lazarus was taken to the bosom of Abraham.

As I reflect on this story, I cannot help but see the similarities that I share with this rich man. By no means do I consider myself to be rich, nor do I think I wear fine clothes, nor I think I dine sumptuously. But I must admit that do live comfortably my clothes is nothing special, but I have plenty of clothes to wear and I the food that I eat I would consider to be rather simple and if you look at my figure you can tell that I eat well. Which leads me to ask who are those poor people, those people could use my help that are sitting at my door that I might be ignoring, like the rich man ignored Lazarus?

When I lived in larger cities like Chicago or Dayton, I would see poor and homeless people quite frequently. When I would walk the streets, they often would ask for help, or after I was ordained when I lived in the rectory, they would often come to the door asking for help, and still other times they would stand outside of church and sometimes even come into church asking for help. Sometimes I help give them money or I would go into the kitchen make them a simple sandwich, add piece of fruit, put it in grocery bag, and send them on their way. Still other times unfortunately I would not be able to help them sometimes I did not have the resources to, and other times out concern for my personal safety.

Here in Glandorf, here in Putnam County I do not see people who are homeless or people who are poor. Does that mean that they are not here? Perhaps? Or perhaps they are here among us, and they are blended in among us and do not appear to need help when they do. Perhaps they might even feel a bit ashamed or embarrassment to admit they need help. When the need arises, you are great and rolling up your sleeves to help someone in need of help, I seen and heard countless stories of this in short time that I have been here. You are great at helping when the need arises, but perhaps the question for us to ponder is who is need of our help that is right in front of us that we might be missing?


