2 FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Our students and our teachers returned to classes this week and began a new school year. As this school year begins and as families get back into this routine again. Our scriptures today have a school image today. In our scriptures today it seems as though Jesus is giving the disciples a test “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” (Matthew 16:13) “Who do you say that I am” (Matthew 16:15). Peter appears to pass the test with his answer “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God” (Matthew 16:16). Jesus praises Peter for giving this answer.

Just as Jesus asks these questions to the disciples in scriptures today, Jesus gives you the same test. Who do people say that the Son of Man is? In our scriptures today, the disciples say that people associate the Son of Man as being John the Baptist, Elijah, or one of the prophets. If we were to answer, this same question today. I would venture to guess the answers we could give similar answers to what we hear in our scriptures today, but we could also give answers that are slightly different. I mean there are people today that say the Son of Man is Jesus, still others might associate the Son of Man as being someone else, and others let’s face it do even have a clue who the Son of Man is. Jesus asks you “who do you say that I am?” Many of us would be tempted to look over Peter’s shoulder and repeat or copy his and/or make his answer our answer. Or we have read this story countless times, we have Peter’s answer memorized “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God” (Matthew 16:16) and we give this answer lacking confidence unsure if this is the correct answer. This is the correct answer. But some where between our head and our heart we can lose the connection that Jesus is the Christ the Son of the living God. And if we miss the connection between the head to the heart then we get the question right but miss the point. It is not in our heart, and we can forget that Jesus is the Christ of the Son of the living God. It reminds me of those times when I was in school getting ready for a big test and one of the best ways that I discovered to study was to repeatedly write the information out. And as I would write the information out, eventually I would have the information memorized for the test and obviously I passed. But I will be honest with a lot of the information that I memorized; I am not sure if I still remember today. The information was in my head for the test but not necessarily in my heart for memory.

Here recently, we brought back having a server holding the Roman Missal/the book while I offer the prayers during Mass. Also, a part of holding the book, I raised the bar a bit and before Mass I instruct the server that will be holding the Roman Missal what page to open to. I think it is worth noting to give our servers a compliment, they are doing an excellent job with this new task. I would like to encourage them to keep up the good work. Something that I have noticed is when the server is holding the book their eyes are following along with the prayer as I read it. This touches my heart, it tells me that they are more than just holding a book, their heart is into the prayer that is being offered.

It is in our head that Jesus is the Christ, may it also be in our heart that Jesus is the Christ. For it is only when Christ is in hearts that we change the world.



The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith. Without the gift of the Eucharist, we do not exist as a parish, and you do not have the privilege of playing for St. John's.







- All coaches and players are required to attend Saturday evening or Sunday Mass. If you miss, we kindly ask that you sit out that week's game.

We kindly ask the cooperation of all as we implement this policy for the good of our parish and the good of the Church.




