I hope all are doing well. Here is a short update on things here at the seminary. First of all, I had a great Christmas break! I had a wonderful time visiting with family and friends and so many great people from Glandorf, Miller City/New Cleveland, Toledo, and throughout the whole diocese. It was a break where I was able to help out in so many ways, from helping with communion services to serving Mass, to maintenance, to just being able to be back out and about other people. Serving in whatever way I could.

Thank you so much for your continued prayers and support. They are very much appreciated, especially last semester and for the current semester. Then my friend Mark Famuliner (seminarian with the Diocese of Kansas City – St. Joseph, Missouri) and I are flying to Mobile, Alabama, for a few days, before it is back to classes. So, spring break for me will start in the snow and end in the sun.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 21 1st Sunday of Lent

In today's first reading from Genesis we see God making a covenant with Noah and his sons. "This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you: I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings."

We see that God will never purposefully destroy humanity like he did in the flood with Noah. A covenant is a promise that will not be broken. It is not a contract. A contract is when both parties promise to do certain tasks and if those tasks are not completed then the contract can be broken or one of the parties fined. A covenant is a promise to fulfill a certain task even if the other party does not keep their part of the deal.

God will be faithful to humanity even if humanity is not faithful to God. A symbol of this covenant is the rainbow. The next covenant God makes with his people is circumcision. All the males of Israel will be circumcised as a covenant God makes with his people. The last covenant God made with his people and the final covenant is the Holy Eucharist. We celebrate this at mass. Listen to the words of the priest and Christ during the consecration. "This is the chalice of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me."

God is faithful to us. Let us always be faithful to him. As we begin lent, let us spend time with our faithful God. He wants us to. Can you spend a half hour in prayer each day during lent? Pray the rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, or go to mass during the week. God bless you all. Fr. Tony

<u>ANNOUNCEMENT</u>: Playing any sports this year? You are expected to attend both the Fall & Winter sessions of High School Religious Education Groups or Grade School CCD Classes---plus weekend Saturday or Sunday Mass. This includes all players, coaches and their families. Attendance at these groups/classes will be monitored and reviewed. For each class missed (which is not an excused absence) you will be sitting out one game.—To play CYO sports, the following are the only excused absences from CCD: sickness, death in family, college visitation day, parish sponsored event, sport tournament games only with O-G athletes/fans involved, and work (up to 3 missed CCD classes due

to work). After the third absence due to work, the player is not permitted to play in a game until he/she returns to CCD class. All other reasons are unexcused.
