**From the Desk
of
Fr. Matt**

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord and the simple explanation of what we celebrate today is the magi coming to the manger scene bringing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But the Epiphany is more than just magi bringing gifts. The Epiphany is about knowing, curiosity, it is about having an experience, and returning home changed.

Knowing for the magi came the moment they looked up in the sky and noticed a new star in the night sky that signified the newborn King of the Jews. And for the magi it could have stopped there know, they could have had discovered the new star and let it go at that, they could have stayed at home. But they did not, they got

curious instead they left home to pursue the star, to go in search of the newborn king, they followed the star and they found what the star signified. They were probably surprised where the star led them, they probably thought that the star would lead them to a palace in Jerusalem, but the star led them to a stable in Bethlehem. Because the magi followed the star it led them to having an experience with the Lord. An experience that led them to prostrating themselves before the child Jesus and offering him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The magi's offering of gifts is not the end, the end of the story. We hear that after this experience they went home changed, they did not return to Herod as they were instructed but "they departed for their country by another way" (Matthew 2:12).

As we are soon to draw the Christmas Season to a close, this Christmas Season is just not about celebrating the birth of Jesus and giving and receiving gifts. The Christmas Season is about having an experience of the child Jesus born in Bethlehem and having our lives changed. Just as the magi had an experience of Christ, the child born in Bethlehem we are also called to have an experience of the Christ child born in Bethlehem. Like the star of Christ getting the magi's attention and their knowing that it meant something important to act on. The light of Christ meant to be a significant light that is also meant get our attention and we are called to respond to the Light of Christ. The light of Christ is pretty good at getting our attention. I think of the spotlight on it at night and that light illuminates our church steeple that it can be seen for miles that draws people in. The light of Christ gets our attention, that draws us in, and we follow the light. And sometimes like the magi, we can be surprised to where that light leads us. The light of Christ leads us to having an experience of Christ. I think of those experiences that I have of Christ on a retreat or really any time that I come to Mass and receive the Body and Blood of Christ. And then we return home different changed, because we have had this experience, we are called to live our lives differently.

As we are soon to draw this Christmas Season to a close may we live our lives different because we have had an experience of Christ, may we return to our homes and our lives by a different route.


