2 FROM THE DESK OF FR. MATT

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally called Corpus Christi. We celebrate in a special way today the gift of the Eucharist. Perhaps today is also a day for us to renew our faith and love for the gift of the Eucharist

When I came to Glandorf about year ago our Adult Faith hosted a series from Bishop Cozzens "Learning how to embrace the gift of the Eucharist" and when I went to the first session I learned that the United States Bishops was beginning a three year of Eucharistic Revival. Last year was the first year focusing on the Diocesan level. Today we begin the second year of the Eucharistic Revival and this year is meant focus on the parish level. During the year ahead as a parish we are invited to "foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit". And next year there will be a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis of 80,000 people. I encourage you to check it out.

To kick-off the year of the parish today we are having a Eucharistic procession out to our Marian Shrine. There is excitement and energy for our procession. Today our First Communicants get to put on their dresses and suits one more time, we anticipate having a few more Mass servers than normal, and we are doing something new. But at the heart of our excitement and energy today it is important to remember that it is not about us. If we are doing this for the sake of ourselves, we miss the point. Our doing this is about Jesus "the living bread that came down from heaven" (John 6:51). Jesus the living bread that come from heaven that has great power to change our lives, families, town, state, country, and world. We journey in procession all dressed up rolling out our best because this is Jesus the Body, the Blood, and Soul Divinity of God, this is Jesus. This is Jesus real presence with us. It is no sign or symbol, this is really Jesus. And when Jesus is present to us in this way he has great power. At the beginning of the school year Deacon Don and I processed through our CCD rooms because we knew power Christ has to bless a new school year. I remember being on retreat carrying the Blessed Sacrament around in the room and two individuals were struggling one in front of me and the other just grabbed onto my garment the same way that the woman reached out and touched Jesus clothes. And both of them experienced a healing of some sort.

As we begin the year of the Eucharistic Revival Year of the parish I would like to encourage each parishioner to revitalize, to re-ignite your faith and learning in the gift of the Eucharist. There are different ways that this can be done perhaps this might mean attending an educational workshop or class on the Mass or even reading a new piece of material or watching video on the Mass or the Eucharist. Or this might mean making extra time for Adoration like a Wednesday evening or First Saturday. Or even just paying close attention to the prayers at Mass there just might be something you have never seen or heard before. Perhaps sometime in the year ahead I could do a tutorial Mass, explaining what is happening in different parts of the Mass. For as we revitalize and rekindle, we grow in our relationship with Christ.

Minutes for Finance Council Meeting

April 27, 2023

1. Opening prayer was offered by Fr. Matt Keller.
2. The prior minutes were discussed from last meeting. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Lynette Schroeder and seconded by Katie Walker.
3. The financial reports were reviewed for the month of March. A motion to approve the financials was made by Katie Walker and seconded by Luke Recker. No changes were made to the financials and were approved by the Finance Council Members.
4. Council members were updated on the Access Control Project. Project is progressing and continues to wait on supplies. Currently working to address the door jams and computers for the project.
5. Discussion was held around purchasing a new tractor for the parish that doubles as lawnmower. The parish's current mower is being discontinued and will not be able to be serviced. Discussion included looking at pricing for a couple of options.
6. Council discussed the addition of a First Aid cabinet to be used in the parish center. Discussion included what to keep stocked as well as any potential substitutions or alternatives to medications that come with it. A motion was passed to spend up to \$987.00 or a similar figure for the cabinet.
7. A motion was passed to purchase 3 new Zoll AEDs with intent to be reimbursed for one new AED via the fire dept. The dollar figure approved was up to \$250.00/month.
8. The rental house was discussed as potential updates to the home as well as installing a privacy fence. There are currently no renters. Council will contact contractors for quotes and ideas as to what should take priority.
9. Council discussed potential fits to be added to new grounds committee as well as how often to hold meetings and provide updates. Carl Siefker intends to be part of the committee.
10. New business included discussion about installing a handrail near the altar and the potential need for emergency lighting. No action is being taken on either topic at this time.
11. Bryan Kaufman and Curt Miller were announced as new council members taking the place of outgoing members Randy Verhoff and Jayme Prasuhn.
12. Present Council members voted on the Benning Scholarship.

Your parish will have information throughout the year to help make that happen. Consider how you can spend this year personally growing in understanding of, love for and living out the Holy Eucharist.




What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Simply put, it is spending time with Jesus who is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament.

At St. John's the Baptist, we have Adoration every Wednesday from 6:30pm to 7:30pm (during the summer). On the First Friday of every month we have adoration from 1:00pm to 4:00pm and on every First Saturday, we have adoration from 5:30pm - 8:00am. During adoration we watch and wait, we remain silent in His presence and open ourselves to His graces which flow from the Eucharist. By being present during Adoration, we become what God wants us to be. Jesus draws us to Himself and gently transforms us.

Everyone (especially children) are welcome at any hour for as long as you can stay.

In the vestibules of Church there will be copies of “My Adoration Book” for your child to use while at Adoration.
