



URGENT MEMORANDUM

To: Glandorf St. John the Baptist Catholic Parish Family Members
From: Bishop Thomas & Fr. Tony
Re: Gradual Restoration of Public Masses and Liturgies
Date: 22 May 2020



And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age (Mt. 28: 20).

Having now entered into a new phase of the COVID-19 pandemic in which the State of Ohio is beginning to reopen certain businesses, and after prayerful consideration and consultation with the Bishops of Ohio, our diocesan College of Consultors, Presbyteral Council, and the Worship and Sacraments subcommittee of the Pastoral Reintegration Team, this memorandum comes to confirm the gradual restoration of publicly celebrated Masses and liturgies to begin on Saturday, May 30, 2020 with the Vigil Mass of Pentecost Sunday. With full realization that the manner and continuance of limited gatherings are subject to change at any moment, the following guidelines will remain in effect at least until July 1, 2020, unless you are notified beforehand of any amendment, revocation, or continuance.

DISPENSATION FROM THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND SUNDAY MASS

The faithful of the Diocese of Toledo continue to be dispensed from their Sunday obligation until further notice.

Understanding the desire of so many of the faithful to return to our churches, it remains important for those who are at greater risk (the elderly, sick, those with pre-existing conditions) to refrain, and be encouraged to refrain, from returning to public liturgies until such time as they feel comfortable and confident to do so.

With full realization that the manner and continuance of limited gatherings are subject to change at any moment, the guidelines will remain in effect at least until July 1, 2020, unless you are notified beforehand of any amendment, revocation, or continuance.

SUNDAY MASS SCHEDULES – Saturday 4:30pm; Sunday 8:00am, 10:30am & 6:30pm

PROPER SOCIAL DISTANCING

Everyone should make every effort to ensure that appropriate social distancing before, during, and after liturgical celebrations is maintained. Methods will vary in light of the capacity of church buildings.

Other than family/household members who live together, worshippers should be seated six feet apart in all directions. The exact number of people allowed safely to enter the church the capacity is not to exceed 50% of fire code regulations per the “Stay Safe Ohio” order. **With the 6’ rule we will be able to have 300 people at our Masses. 5 minutes before Mass starts if the church is full the overflow will be directed (by a staff member) to go over to the Parish Center cafeteria to watch on the BIG SCREEN TV. Holy Communion will be brought over to you. You will need to set up your own chairs (chairs are available) leaving 6’ between families.**

The location/number of stations for the distribution of Holy Communion should be considered and adjusted as necessary. We will have 5 distributors along with Fr. Tony or Fr. Rick. Four stations will be up front – 2 in back. Fr. Tony is asking for 4 distributors when Deacon Don is present at Mass and 5 when he is not present. When Deacon Don is not there one distributor will stand in middle by Fr. Tony. Two distributors will stay up front to distribute to the galleries on the sides then one stand by the pulpit on Blessed Virgin Side and one stand by the Mission Cross on St. Joseph’s side to distribute up front. The other two will go to the back right away and stand one in front of the Pita statue on the left side of main aisle, and one will stand in front of the Holy Family statue on the right side of the main aisle which will be 6’ feet apart. Please no gloves when distributing Holy Communion. You may wear a mask.

Distributors, for you to receive Holy Communion please come forward after the Sign of Peace. There will be a bottle of hand sanitizer on the table by the pulpit and on a stand by the Mission Cross. Disinfect your hands and stand in the Middle aisle by the first step to go into the sanctuary side by side with distance between. Fr. Tony & Deacon Don will distribute to you there. They will also give you your ciborium then go to your place to distribute. When you are finished distributing please put your ciborium on the main altar and go back to your pew. After Mass we will need two distributors whose names are in **BOLD** on the schedule to cleanse the vessels and set up for the next Mass.

You will need 4 ciboria for host set up. No cups.

For the Communion, care should be taken to ensure that proper social distancing is maintained.

No choirs until further notice.

Parishes are to discourage social gatherings before or after Mass/liturgy on the church campus. For example, no receptions, coffee and doughnuts, etc.

Liturgies that would draw larger numbers of the faithful should be celebrated at a time different from the regularly scheduled Sunday Mass
(First Communion, June 7, 1:00pm – Senior Bacculaureate, June 14, 1:00pm)

PARTICULAR LITURGICAL MATTERS

Processions through the congregation at the beginning and end of the liturgy should be discontinued during this time.

During this time the offertory procession is suspended. Bread and wine for Mass should continue to be kept apart from public areas and brought forward at the appropriate time only from the credence table.

The Sign of Peace continues to be suspended during this time. The faithful should be reminded that there is to be no physical contact (handholding) during the Lord’s Prayer, a gesture that is not prescribed in the *Roman Missal*. This is the moment to explain to the faithful of those congregations for whom this practice has become a custom that such a practice should be permanently discontinued even after the coronavirus pandemic.

The distribution of the Precious Blood from the chalice continues to be suspended during this time.

The reception of Holy Communion on the hand is to be strongly encouraged. The communicant’s ungloved palms should be placed one on top of the other with the upper palm extended flat allowing the minister easily to place the Host on the communicant’s hand without physical contact.

Understanding that a certain sense of apprehensiveness and anxiety may exist, the faithful should be informed that they may refrain from receiving Holy Communion if they so desire, mindful that the requirement to receive Holy Communion during the Easter Season (Canon 920) may be fulfilled at another time during the year. Those who choose not to receive should be encouraged to make a spiritual communion.

All hymnals should be removed and stored for the duration of the pandemic. If you wish please pick up a missalette and bring home with you. Please bring back each time you attend Mass. At the end of the pandemic please disinfect missalette and bring back to church.

Bulletins will be at all exits.

GOOD HYGIENIC PRACTICES

Pastors should make every effort to communicate clearly good hygienic practices and liturgical guidelines to their parishioners in light of continuing public health concerns.

Those who are elderly, sick, symptomatic or at greater risk should be strongly encouraged to stay home.

Face masks/coverings are highly encouraged for those in the congregation and left to the prudent discretion of the Pastor/Administrator/Pastoral Leader for the liturgical ministers. Per the Ohio Department of Health, face masks/coverings are not placed on children under the age of two.

Hand sanitizer will be made available at all entrances to the church building.

Keeping Churches Open for Private Prayer and Eucharistic Adoration

The church building may continue to be opened during part of the day for individual prayer provided that appropriate capacity, proper social distancing and sanitizing procedures are maintained. Eucharistic adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, following the aforementioned recommendations, is encouraged at the discretion of the Pastor/Administrator/Pastoral Leader.

Ascension of the Lord

**From the
Desk of
Fr. Tony**

In the Diocese of Toledo, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord today. We see Jesus ascending up into heaven in the presence of the Blessed Virgin Mary and his apostles. Jesus was lifted up and a cloud took him from their sight. In today’s gospel from Matthew we see Jesus speaking to his followers, “The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the

mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.

And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.”

I believe it is very difficult for the human spirit not to doubt. We see Jesus’ disciples doubting today. They spent three years with Christ and took in his teaching and watched his acts of healing and love. But even after his resurrection, these disciples of Christ are still doubting. Why do we doubt? Why did Thomas doubt in the gospel of the second Sunday of Easter? In this world we see so many jobs change. Many of us may not feel secure in our jobs. We endured a pandemic. I never thought I would see one of those. Even our own health changes over time. There are not too many constants in this life. But God is always constant and never changing. He is the one sure anchor we can hold on to. God’s love and mercy are constant. People can be fickle but Christ will always keep to his promises.

Jesus tells his followers to baptize all nations. Baptism not only takes away sins like the sacrament of reconciliation, and the anointing of the sick but it is a dying and rising into the life of Christ. In the world we are born and then die. In baptism we first die with Christ in our submersion into the baptismal waters. Then we rise with Christ when we are taken out of the baptismal waters. This dying and rising with Christ is called the “Paschal Mystery.”

Twenty years ago, during my formation period with the C.P.P.S. community I often wondered when formation will be complete. I realized that it will never be complete. The C.P.P.S. community is always forming its members. But I eventually knew that formation would come to an end and I would be a life time member of the community and a priest. That came with its sufferings also. Suffering doesn’t last forever. Eventually resurrection comes. On this Ascension Sunday let us draw close to Christ in his dying and rising. Let us endure our suffering but realize that suffering will not last forever. God bless you all. Fr. Tony
