# 24<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time SEPTEMBER 17, 2017

Jesus tells us to forgive our neighbor seventy times seven, which means very often. If you and I are honest with ourselves we sin at least seven times a day. Jesus said even the just man sins seven times a day. Knowing this means that God is very merciful to you and me each day when we ask for his forgiveness. We may then ask ourselves what

keeps us from forgiving our neighbor if we sin at least seven times a day and God forgives us?

None of us likes to be taken advantage of. Sometimes we get mad at others because they purposely cause us problems. We need to try to reconcile with our enemies. We can forgive others but sometimes people are mean and they want to keep trying to hurt us or they are unwilling to learn from their mistakes. We can forgive but we cannot forget what they can do. We then have the hope that people will learn and be sorry for their past actions.

Every once in a while you see someone sin boldly and then in turn make a 180 degree turn around. People are capable of making right decisions but sometimes people are not taught in the ways of morals and charity. Jesus tells us that if we do not forgive others he will not forgive us. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call. The supervisor (Business Manager, Coordinator of Rel. Ed. High School, Rel. Ed. Elementary, Preschool or Youth Group) can be present if requested. When appropriate, next call parents and notify pastor if not already notified. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified. Diocese Case Manager is Frank DiLallo 419-244-6711 (800-926-8277) ext. 122, or 419-243-2150 private line. Those who are supervising youth are mandated reporters.

<u>DIOCESAN POLICY FOR CYO SPORTS</u> - Only Catholic St. John's parishioners are eligible to play CYO sports for our St. John's teams.

Attention all first time/current CYO basketball coaches - All CYO coaches and CYO volunteers need to attend the diocesan certification workshop for first time coaches or re-certification for returning coaches. All coaches need to read and sign the Expectation form which is usually done at the workshop. Please call the rectory if you wish to coach this year. BCI fingerprints are no longer needed. The certification workshops are now posted on the diocesan website <a href="http://www.toledodiocese.org">http://www.toledodiocese.org</a> Please check times and places where held. Background checks now need to be done every 5 years (cost \$25) paid for by each coach and get reimbursed from the admittance fees at the games. The background checks are now done by <a href="http://www.virtus.org">www.virtus.org</a> You can find this link on the brochure on the diocesan website. On the home page of the diocesan website, scroll down and click on the CYO icon. From there, under "Resources" click on "Coaches Certification" then click on "2017-2018 Coaches" Certification Class Schedule." You must schedule yourself for one of these sessions. Also, all the steps needed to be a coach are listed on that brochure. These classes are paid for by each coach and get reimbursed from the admittance fees at the games. For all returning coaches re-certification class is Oct. 23<sup>rd</sup> here at Glandorf. If a coach fails to maintain current certification, the coach loses his/her eligibility to coach in the CYO. Lanyards are issued for each course attended and must be worn when coaching. Ross Siefker will be in charge of the grade school boys & girls CYO basketball teams scheduling this year.
